**A BILL FOR**

1 Section 1. Section 321I.14, subsection 2, Code 2005, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3 2. A person shall not operate or ride an all-terrain  
4 vehicle on public land with a firearm in the person's  
5 possession unless it is unloaded and enclosed in a carrying  
6 case. However, a nonambulatory person may carry an uncased  
7 and unloaded firearm while operating or riding an all-terrain  
8 vehicle on public land.

EXPLANATION

10 This bill prohibits a person from operating or riding an  
11 all-terrain vehicle on public land with a firearm in the  
12 person's possession unless it is unloaded and enclosed in a  
13 carrying case. The bill further allows a nonambulatory person  
14 to carry an uncased and unloaded firearm while operating or  
15 riding an all-terrain vehicle on public land.

16 A person who violates the bill is guilty of a simple  
17 misdemeanor pursuant to Code section 321I.15. A simple  
18 misdemeanor is punishable by confinement for no more than 30  
19 days or a fine of at least \$50 but not more than \$500 or by  
20 both.
