## s.f. <u>2145</u> H.f.

- 1 Section 1. Section 710.6, Code 2005, is amended to read as 2 follows:
- 3 710.6 VIOLATING CUSTODIAL ORDER.
- 4 <u>1.</u> A relative of a child who, acting in violation of an 5 order of any court which fixes, permanently or temporarily,
- 6 the custody or physical care of the child in another, takes
- 7 and conceals the child, within or outside the state, from the
- 8 person having lawful custody or physical care, commits a class
- 9 "D" felony.
- 10 2. A parent of a child living apart from the other parent
- 11 who conceals that child or causes that child's whereabouts to
- 12 be unknown to a parent with visitation rights or parental time
- 13 in violation of a court order granting visitation rights or
- 14 parental time and without the other parent's consent, commits
- 15 a serious misdemeanor.
- 3. Upon the filing of a complaint of a missing person who
- 17 is a child who is the subject of the alleged criminal activity
- 18 described in subsection 1 or 2, the law enforcement agency
- 19 having jurisdiction shall comply with all federal and state
- 20 requirements relating to missing person reports involving
- 21 children, including the provisions of chapter 694 relating to
- 22 unemancipated minors. Upon the filing of such complaint, the
- 23 law enforcement agency shall notify the appropriate county
- 24 attorney to obtain a warrant for the arrest of the alleged
- 25 perpetrator of the criminal activity.
- 26 EXPLANATION
- 27 This bill provides that in cases of violation of custodial
- 28 orders in which the child is taken and concealed, upon the
- 29 filing of a missing person complaint relative to the child,
- 30 the law enforcement agency is to comply with all federal and
- 31 state requirements relating to missing person reports
- 32 involving children, including the provisions of Code chapter
- 33 694 (missing persons) as it relates to unemancipated minors.
- 34 Upon the filing of such a missing person complaint, the law
- 35 enforcement agency is required to notify the appropriate
