A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making transportation and other
2 infrastructure-related appropriations to the state department
3 of transportation, including allocation and use of moneys from
4 the road use tax fund and the primary road fund.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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SE 2232

1 Section 1. ROAD USE TAX FUND. There is appropriated from
2 the road use tax fund to the state department of
3 transportation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2006, and
4 ending June 30, 2007, the following amounts, or so much
5 thereof as is necessary, for the purposes designated:

7 of driver's licenses, as defined in section 321.1, subsection
8 20A:

10 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated

 33 LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the general assembly
 34 that the satellite driver's license station to be established

2 later than the date of the opening of the new motor vehicle

5 the satellite station. The general assembly further intends
6 that, to the extent practicable, the satellite station be
7 located as close as possible to the site of the office of
8 driver services currently operated by the department within

EXPLANATION

11 This bill makes and limits appropriations for the 2006-2007
12 fiscal year from the road use tax fund and the primary road
13 fund to the state department of transportation.

14 Appropriations from the road use tax fund include
15 appropriations for driver's license production costs,
16 salaries, operations and finance, administrative services,
17 planning, motor vehicles, services provided by the department
18 of administrative services, unemployment and workers'
19 compensation, indirect cost recoveries, audits, county
20 issuance of driver's licenses and vehicle registration and
21 titling, a system providing toll-free telephone road and
22 weather reports, participation in the Mississippi river
23 parkway commission, membership in the North America's
24 superhighway corridor coalition, development of a reporting
25 database to warehouse driver and vehicle information, and
26 development of an international registration plan and
27 international fuel tax administration system.

28 Appropriations from the primary road fund include
29 appropriations for salaries, operations and finance,
30 administrative services, planning, highways, motor vehicles,
31 services provided by the department of administrative
32 services, unemployment and workers' compensation, hazardous
33 waste disposal, indirect cost recoveries, audits, production
34 of transportation maps, inventory and equipment replacement,
35 utility projects, garage roofing, heating and cooling

1 improvements, deferred maintenance at field facilities,
2 replacement of the Fairfield garage, various Americans With
3 Disabilities Act improvements, parking lot paving at the Ames
4 complex, and elevator upgrades at the Ames complex.

5 The bill contains an expression of legislative intent
6 regarding the establishment of a satellite driver's license
7 station in the city of Des Moines.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. ROAD USE TAX FUND. There is appropriated from the road use tax fund to the state department of transportation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2006, and ending June 30, 2007, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes designated:

Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated funds remaining on June 30, 2007, from the appropriation made

in this subsection shall not revert, but shall remain available for subsequent fiscal years for the purposes specified in this subsection.

2. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

b. Administrative services: \$ 548,222
c. Planning: \$ 470,476
d. Motor vehicles: \$ 32,155,203

Sec. 3. DES MOINES SATELLITE DRIVER'S LICENSE STATION -- LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the general assembly that the satellite driver's license station to be established by the state department of transportation within the city of Des Moines be open for the renewal of driver's licenses no later than the date of the opening of the new motor vehicle division facility in Ankeny, whether or not there is a commitment from the Polk county treasurer to operate or staff the satellite station. The general assembly further intends

that, to the extent practicable, the satellite station be located as close as possible to the site of the office of driver services currently operated by the department within the city of Des Moines.
