A BILL FOR

1 An Act directing the department of education and the Iowa
2 department of public health to convene a healthy children task
3 force and providing an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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SF 2251

1 Section 1. HEALTHY CHILDREN TASK FORCE.

2 1. The department of education and the Iowa department of
3 public health shall convene a healthy children task force to
4 do the following:

5 a. Assess current policies and statutes affecting the
6 health of children, specifically physical activity, physical
7 education, food and nutrition, and nutrition education for
8 children ages three through eighteen.

9 b. Develop recommendations for policy and statutory
10 changes to enhance the health and well-being of children
11 including, but not limited to, physical activity, food and
12 nutrition, and education related to these topics.

13 c. Submit its findings and recommendations to the governor
14 and the general assembly not later than January 1, 2007.

15 2. Members of the healthy children task force shall
16 include the following:

17 a. Four legislative members who shall be appointed as
18 follows:

19 (1) Two state senators, one appointed by the president of
20 the senate, after consultation with the majority leader of the
21 senate, and one appointed by the minority leader of the
22 senate, after consultation with the president of the senate,
23 from their respective parties.

24 (2) Two state representatives, one appointed by the
25 speaker and one appointed by the minority leader of the house
26 of representatives from their respective parties.

- 23 4. The department of education and the Iowa department of

- 25 administrative support to the task force.
- 26 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of
- 27 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

28 EXPLANATION

29 This bill directs the department of education and the Iowa
30 department of public health to convene a 24-member healthy
31 children task force to assess current policies and statutes
32 affecting the health of children and recommend policy and
33 statutory changes to enhance the health and well-being of
34 children. The department of education and the Iowa department
35 of public health are to provide staffing and administrative

1 support to the task force.

2 The task force must submit its findings and recommendations
3 to the governor and the general assembly not later than
4 January 1, 2007.

Description

Senate File 2251 requires the Departments of Education and Public Health to convene a Healthy Children Task Force to assess current policies and statutes affecting children's health and develop recommendations for policies and statutes to enhance it. A report is due to the Governor and the General Assembly by January 1, 2007.

The Task Force must include four legislative members, representatives from the Departments of Education and Public Health, representatives from seventeen non-profit associations, and three parents or guardians of school-age children.

The Bill directs the Departments of Education and Public Health to provide staffing and administrative support to the Task Force.

Assumptions

1. Twelve of the 26 Task Force members will live outside the Central Iowa area and require reimbursement of travel expenses.
2. There will be three meetings of the Task Force.
3. Average travel expenses per meeting for each of the 12 members will be \$100.

Fiscal Impact

Implementation of SF 2251 will result in \$3,600 in expenditures for reimbursement of members' travel expenses. Without an appropriation for this purpose, this cost will be absorbed by the Departments of Education and Public Health from their FY 2007 budgets.

Description

Senate File 2251, as Amended and Passed by the House, requires the Departments of Education and Public Health to convene a Healthy Children Task Force to assess current policies and statutes affecting children's health and develop recommendations for policies and statutes to enhance it. A report is due to the Governor and the General Assembly by January 1, 2007.

The Task Force must include eight legislative members, representatives from the Departments of Education and Public Health, representatives from thirty-two non-profit associations, three parents or guardians of school-age children, five middle school students, and five high school students.

The Bill directs the Departments of Education and Public Health to provide staffing and administrative support to the Task Force.

Assumptions

1. Thirty of the 55 Task Force members will live outside the Central Iowa area and require reimbursement of travel expenses.
2. There will be three meetings of the Task Force.
3. Average travel expenses per meeting for each of the 30 members will be \$100.

Fiscal Impact

Implementation of SF 2251, as Amended, will result in expenditures of approximately \$9,000 for reimbursement of members' travel expenses. Without an appropriation for this purpose, this cost will be absorbed by the Departments of Education and Public Health from their FY 2007 budgets.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
