1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 123.45A PERMISSIBLE CLEANING 2 SERVICES -- MANUFACTURERS.

3 Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter to the 4 contrary, a person engaged in the business of manufacturing, 5 bottling, or wholesaling alcoholic beverages, wine, or beer, 6 or any jobber, representative, broker, employee, or agent of 7 such a person may, consistent with 27 C.F.R. § 6.88, provide 8 to a retailer without charge wine and beer coil cleaning 9 services, including carbon dioxide filters and other necessary 10 accessories to properly clean the coil and affix carbon 11 dioxide filters. The manufacturer shall be responsible for 12 paying the costs of any filters provided pursuant to this 13 section.

EXPLANATION

15 This bill concerns permissible activities by manufacturers 16 and wholesalers of alcoholic beverages as such activities 17 relate to retailers.

18 The bill creates new Code section 123.45A permitting 19 manufacturers to provide retailers, consistent with federal 20 law, free wine and beer coil cleaning services, including 21 carbon dioxide filters. The bill also provides that the 22 manufacturer shall be responsible for the costs of any filters 23 provided under this new section.

EXPLANATION

20 This bill concerns permissible activities by manufacturers 21 and wholesalers of alcoholic beverages as such activities 22 relate to retailers.

The bill creates new Code section 123.45A permitting 24 manufacturers to provide retailers, consistent with federal 25 law, free wine and beer coil cleaning services.

Code section 123.49 is amended to provide that a wholesaler shall not provide in-store instantly redeemable coupons to retailers for discounting the purchase of alcohol. Mail-in coupons or cross-promotional coupons are not prohibited. Pursuant to Code section 123.50, a person who violates this provision is guilty of a simple misdemeanor.
