A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations to state departments
2 and agencies from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund,
3 environment first fund, tobacco settlement trust fund,
4 vertical infrastructure fund, the endowment for Iowa's health
5 restricted capitals fund, and the endowment for Iowa's health
6 account, and related matters.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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DIVISION I

REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND

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3 Section 1. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
4 infrastructure fund to the following departments and agencies
5 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2006, and ending June
6 30, 2007, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is
7 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

8 1. DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

9 a. For technology improvement projects, notwithstanding
10 section 8.57, subsection 6, paragraph "c":

11 \$ 3,884,940

12 b. For discretion by the director of the department of
13 administrative services to be used to purchase property or
14 enter into agreements to purchase property which would be
15 appropriate or beneficial to the state:

16 \$ 500,000

17 2. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

18 a. For the lease payment under the lease-purchase
19 agreement to connect the electrical system supporting the

14 Not more than 5 percent of the moneys appropriated in this
15 lettered paragraph may be used for costs of administration and
16 implementation of soil and water conservation practices.

17 c. For continuation of a statewide voluntary farm
18 management demonstration program to demonstrate the
19 effectiveness and adaptability of emerging practices in
20 agronomy that protect water resources and provide other
21 environmental benefits:

22 \$ 850,000

23 Not more than 5 percent of the moneys appropriated in this
24 lettered paragraph may be used for costs of administration and
25 implementation of soil and water conservation practices.

26 Of the amount appropriated in this lettered paragraph,
27 \$400,000 shall be allocated to the Iowa soybean association's
28 agriculture and environment performance program.

29 d. For deposit in the alternative drainage system
30 assistance fund created in section 460.303 to be used for
31 purposes of supporting the alternative drainage system
32 assistance program as provided in section 460.304:

34 Not more than 5 percent of the moneys appropriated in this
35 lettered paragraph may be used for costs of administration and

1 implementation of soil and water conservation practices.

2 e. To provide financial assistance for the establishment

5 (1) Not more than 5 percent of the moneys appropriated in
6 this lettered paragraph may be allocated for cost-sharing to

10 establish practices to protect watersheds above publicly owned
11 lakes of the state from soil erosion and sediment as provided
12 in section 161A.73.

13 (3) Not more than 30 percent of a soil and water

15 incentives may be provided for the purpose of establishing
16 management practices to control soil erosion on land that is
17 row-cropped, including but not limited to no-till planting,

18 subsection 1 of this section three percent of the figure for
19 administrative costs and further subtract from the figure the
20 amounts refunded to commercial fishers pursuant to section
21 452A.17, subsection 1, paragraph "a", subparagraph (7). All
22 moneys remaining after claims for refund and the cost of
23 administration have been made shall be transferred to the

25 Sec. 39. Section 476.10, Code 2005, is amended by adding
26 the following new unnumbered paragraph:

27 NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. The board and the consumer
28 advocate division of the department of justice may jointly
29 provide for construction of a building to house the board and
30 the division. If deemed cost effective by the board and the
31 division, the building may be developed with capacity for
32 other occupants. A building developed under this paragraph
33 shall be a model energy-efficient building that may be used as
34 a public example for similar efforts. The building shall be
35 located on the capitol grounds or at another convenient

1 location in the vicinity of the capital city. Costs
2 associated with construction and operation of the building are
3 chargeable expenses under this section. The board and
4 division shall utilize a cost-effective approach for financing
5 construction of the building which may include but is not
6 limited to lease, lease-purchase, bonding, or installment
7 acquisition arrangement, or a financing arrangement under
8 section 12.28. If financing for the building is implemented
9 under section 12.28, the limitation on principal under that
10 section does not apply. This paragraph comprises a complete
11 and independent authorization and procedure for the board and
12 the division to enter into a lease or agreement and the
13 paragraph is not a qualification of any other powers which the
14 board and the division may possess and the authorizations and
15 powers granted under this paragraph are not subject to the
16 terms, requirements, or limitations of any other provisions of
17 law, except that the board and the division must comply with
18 the provisions of section 12.28 when entering into financing
19 agreements for the purchase of real or personal property. If
20 financing for the building is implemented through bonding, the
21 board and the division shall be considered to be an authority
22 for purposes of and shall be subject to section 12.30. In
23 order further to assure maintenance of the bond reserve funds
24 established in connection with the financing, the treasurer of
25 state shall, on or before January 1 of each calendar year,
26 make and deliver to the governor the treasurer's certificate
27 stating the sum, if any, required to restore each bond reserve
28 fund to the bond reserve fund requirement for that fund.
29 Within thirty days after the beginning of the session of the
30 general assembly next following the delivery of the
31 certificate, the governor shall submit to both houses of the
32 general assembly printed copies of a budget including the sum,
33 if any, required to restore each bond reserve fund to the bond
34 reserve fund requirement for that fund. Any sums appropriated
35 by the general assembly and paid to the treasurer of state

1 shall be deposited by the treasurer of state in the

12 board and division may utilize consultants or other expert
13 assistance to address feasibility, planning, or other
14 considerations connected with construction of the building or
15 decision making regarding the building. The board and
16 division shall consult with the office of the governor and the
17 legislative bodies with oversight of the board and division
18 and capital projects. If the building will be constructed on
19 the capitol grounds, the building project shall be subject to
20 a recommendation by the capitol planning commission.

21 Sec. 40. TRAINING FOCUS REPORT.

22 1. The state fire service and emergency response council
23 and the homeland security and emergency management division of
24 the department of public defense shall compile a report
25 developing a comprehensive training focus for emergency
26 responders to be implemented by training centers that are, or
27 will be, established under section 100B.16. The report shall
28 identify areas of emergency response services on which the

EXPLANATION

11 This bill makes appropriations for FY 2006-2007 from the
12 rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund, environment first fund, tax-
13 exempt bond proceeds restricted capital funds account of the
14 tobacco settlement trust fund, the vertical infrastructure
15 fund, and the endowment for Iowa's health restricted capitals
16 fund for various capital and other projects.

17 REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND. This division
18 appropriates project funding from the rebuild Iowa
19 infrastructure fund, including projects for the departments of
20 administrative services, corrections, cultural affairs,
21 education, natural resources, public defense, public safety,
22 and transportation, and the Iowa law enforcement academy, Iowa
23 finance authority, board of parole, state board of regents,
24 and treasurer of state.

25 ENVIRONMENT FIRST FUND. This division appropriates funding
26 from the environment first fund to the departments of
27 agriculture and land stewardship, economic development, and
28 natural resources. The bill appropriates \$11 million from the
29 environment first fund to the resources enhancement and
30 protection fund in lieu of the \$20 million appropriated by
31 statute from the general fund of the state.

32 TOBACCO SETTLEMENT TRUST FUND. This division appropriates
33 funding from the tax-exempt bond proceeds restricted capital
34 funds account of the tobacco settlement trust fund for
35 projects for the departments of administrative services,

1 corrections, economic development, education, human rights,
2 public defense, and public safety, and the Iowa
3 telecommunications and technology commission.

4 VERTICAL INFRASTRUCTURE FUND. This division appropriates
5 funding from the vertical infrastructure fund for the
6 departments of administrative services and public defense.

7 ENDOWMENT FOR IOWA'S HEALTH RESTRICTED CAPITALS FUND. This
8 division appropriates funding from the endowment for Iowa's
9 health restricted capitals fund to the departments of
10 administrative services, blind, corrections, cultural affairs,
11 education, natural resources, public defense, public safety,
12 and veterans affairs, the Iowa state fair authority, treasurer
13 of state, and the state board of regents.

14 ENDOWMENT FOR IOWA'S HEALTH ACCOUNT. This division
15 appropriates funding from the endowment for Iowa's health
16 account to the office of the treasurer of state.

17 CHANGES TO PRIOR APPROPRIATIONS. This division makes
18 changes to prior appropriations from the rebuild Iowa
19 infrastructure fund to the departments of corrections and
20 education for the 2006-2007 fiscal year. The division also
21 makes changes to prior appropriations from the rebuild Iowa
22 infrastructure fund to the departments of administrative
23 services and corrections for the 2006-2007 fiscal year.

24 MISCELLANEOUS CODE CHANGES. This division establishes a
25 water and wastewater treatment and community development
26 financial assistance program to be administered by the Iowa
27 finance authority.

28 The division creates regional emergency response training
29 centers in specified areas of the state to be operated by a
30 public agency. The division further provides that moneys
31 appropriated shall not be distributed by the department of
32 public safety to a regional training center until the state
33 fire marshal and the regional training center have entered
34 into a training agreement.

35 The division provides that moneys in the Paul Ryan memorial

1 fire fighter safety training fund and in the volunteer fire
2 fighter preparedness fund shall be used by the state fire and
3 emergency response council for purchase of specified emergency
4 response training equipment.

5 Code section 476.10, relating to expenses charged for
6 utility regulation by the utilities board within the utilities
7 division of the department of commerce and the consumer
8 advocate division of the department of justice, is amended.

9 The amendment authorizes the board and division to jointly
10 provide for construction of a model energy-efficient building
11 to house the two agencies. The costs associated with
12 construction and operation of the building are chargeable
13 expenses.

14 The division creates the state aviation fund under the
15 authority of the department of transportation. The fund shall
16 consist of moneys deposited in the fund pursuant to section
17 328.21 and section 452A.82 together with all moneys
18 appropriated to the fund by the state.

19 The division creates the marine fuel tax fund under the
20 authority of the department of natural resources. The fund
21 shall consist of all revenues derived from the excise tax on
22 the sale of motor fuel used in watercraft.
