12	John Paul II and commemorating his life's work.
13	WHEREAS, in 1978, the Bishop of Krakow, Poland,
14	Karol Wojtyla, was elected as Pope of the Roman
15	Catholic Church, taking the name John Paul II; and
16	WHEREAS, the odyssey of his papacy covered more
17	than 104 overseas trips to over 130 countries,
18	covering almost 690,000 miles and lasting more than a
19	quarter of a century, making Pope John Paul II the
20	widest-traveled Pope in history, and one of the
21	longest-serving; and
22	WHEREAS, on October 4, 1979, in response to an
23	invitation from the late Bishop Maurice Dingman and
24	rural Truro farmer Joe Hays, that odyssey brought him
25	to Iowa; and
26	WHEREAS, on that date some 380,000 people crowded
27	into Living History Farms on the outskirts of Des
28	Moines; and
29	WHEREAS, the Pope then celebrated a two-and-one-
30	half-hour mass and delivered a homily praising farmers

1 and telling them, "You who are farmers today are
 2 stewards of a gift from God ... You have the potential
 3 to provide food for the millions who have nothing to
 4 eat and thus to help rid the world of famine"; and
      WHEREAS, for the next 25 years the Pope continued
 6 his travels, promoting peace and the dignity of human
 7 life and championing the cause of human rights,
 8 particularly the rights of children; and
      WHEREAS, Pope John Paul II was an ecumenical pope,
10 reaching out to Protestant and Orthodox denominations;

      WHEREAS, Pope John Paul II sought to engage in
13 dialogue with other world faiths, becoming the first
14 pope to visit a Jewish synagogue since the age of
15 Peter, and in 2001 becoming the first pope to enter an
16 Islamic mosque, and later placing a handwritten prayer
17 in the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem; and
      WHEREAS, after a lifetime of service to humanity
19 and devotion to God, Pope John Paul II died on
20 Saturday, April 2, 2005; NOW THEREFORE,

      BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, That the Senate
22 honors the memory and lifework of Pope John Paul II
23 and on behalf of its members expresses heartfelt
24 condolences on his death.
