EXPLANATION This bill relates to the civil commitment of a sexually violent predator. The bill changes the definition of "predatory" to mean acts directed toward a person with whom contact or interaction has been established or promoted for the primary purpose of victimization. Current law defines "predatory" to mean acts directed toward a person with whom a relationship has been established or promoted for the primary purpose of victimization. The bill also changes the criminal penalty from a simple misdemeanor to a class "D" felony for escape by a person who is either awaiting civil commitment or who has been committed as a sexually violent predator. A class "D" felony is punishable by confinement for no more than five years and a fine of at least \$750 but not more than \$7,500. A simple misdemeanor is punishable by confinement for no more than \$500 or by both. LSB 1154DP 81
