A BILL FOR

1 An Act requiring voters to provide certain identification when 2 voting absentee or in person at the polling place.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

             An eligible elector may register to vote by completing a
     6 mail registration form. The form may be mailed or delivered
      7 by the registrant or the registrant's designee to the

                          Section 48A.26, subsection 2, Code 2005, is
            2. If the registration form appears on its face to be
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  1 14 complete and proper, the acknowledgment shall state that the 1 15 registrant is now a registered voter of the county. The
  1 16 acknowledgment shall also specify the name of the precinct and
  1 17 the usual polling place for the precinct in which the person
  1 18 is now registered. The acknowledgment shall include a 1 19 statement informing the registered voter that the voter is 1 20 required to show identification in the form of a valid and
     21 current Iowa driver's license or a valid and current Iowa 22 nonoperator's identification card before the person will be
     23 allowed to vote. The acknowledgment may include the political 24 party affiliation most recently recorded by the registrant.

     31 address. The notice shall contain a statement in 32 substantially the following form: "Information received from
  1 33 the United States postal service indicates that you are no
     34 longer a resident of, and therefore not eligible to vote in 35 (name of county) County, Iowa. If this information is not 1 correct, and you still live in (name of county) County, please
      2 complete and mail the attached postage paid card at least ten
      3 days before the primary or general election and at least
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      4 eleven days before any other election at which you wish to
      5 vote. If the information is correct and you have moved,
      6 please contact a local official in your new area for 7 assistance in registering there. If you do not mail in the
  2 8 card, you may be required to show identification to prove
  2 9 residency before being allowed to vote in (name of county)
2 10 County. If you do not return the card, and you do not vote in
2 11 an election in (name of county) County, Iowa, on or before
  2 12 (date of second general election following the date of the 2 13 notice) your name will be removed from the list of voters in 2 14 that county. To ensure you receive this notice, it is being

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Section 48A.29, subsection 1, unnumbered paragraph 2.17 2 18 2, Code 2005, is amended to read as follows: The notice shall be sent by forwardable mail, and shall 2 20 include a postage paid preaddressed return card on which the 2 21 registered voter may state the registered voter's current 2 22 address. The notice shall contain a statement in 23 substantially the following form: "Information received from 24 the United States postal service indicates that you are no 2 25 longer a resident of (residence address) in (name of county) 2 26 County, Iowa. If this information is not correct, and you 2 27 still live in (name of county) County, please complete and 2 28 mail the attached postage paid card at least ten days before 29 the primary or general election and at least eleven days 30 before any other election at which you wish to vote. If the information is correct, and you have moved, please contact a 32 local official in your new area for assistance in registering 33 there. If you do not mail in the card, you may be required to 34 show identification to prove residency before being allowed to 35 vote in (name of county) County. If you do not return the 1 card, and you do not vote in some election in (name of county) County, Iowa, on or before (date of second general election following the date of the notice) your name will be removed 3 4 from the list of voters in that county." Sec. 5. Section 48A.29, subsection 3, unnumbered paragraph 2, Code 2005, is amended to read as follows: 3 6 The notice shall be sent by forwardable mail, and shall 3 8 include a postage paid preaddressed return card on which the 3 9 registered voter may state the registered voter's current
3 10 address. The notice shall contain a statement in
3 11 substantially the following form: "Information received by 12 this office indicates that you are no longer a resident of 13 (residence address) in (name of county) County, Iowa. If the 3 13 3 14 information is not correct, and you still live at that 3 15 address, please complete and mail the attached postage paid 3 16 card at least ten days before the primary or general election 3 17 and at least eleven days before any other election at which 3 18 you wish to vote. If the information is correct, and you have 3 19 moved within the county, you may update your registration by 3 20 listing your new address on the card and mailing it back. I 21 you have moved outside the county, please contact a local 22 official in your new area for assistance in registering there. 23 If you do not mail in the card, you may be required to show 3 24 identification to prove residency before being allowed to vote 25 in (name of county) County. If you do not return the card, 26 and you do not vote in some election in (name of county) 3 27 County, Iowa, on or before (date of second general election 28 following the date of the notice) your name will be removed 29 from the list of registered voters in that county."
30 Sec. 6. Section 49.77, subsection 3, Code 2005, is amended 3 30 3 31 to read as follows: 3 32 3. A precinct election official shall require any person 33 whose name does not appear on the election register as an 34 active voter to show identification. Specific documents which 35 are acceptable forms of identification shall be prescribed by the state commissioner. 3. A precinct election official may shall require of that 4 3 the voter unknown to the official, identification upon which 4 the voter's signature or mark appears produce for inspection 5 the voter's current and valid Iowa driver's license or current 5 the voter' 4 6 and valid Iowa nonoperator's identification card. If identification required under this subsection is established 4 8 to the satisfaction of the precinct election officials, the 4 9 person may then be allowed to vote. 4 10 Sec. 7. Section 49.77, subsection 4, unnumbered paragraph 4 11 1, Code 2005, is amended to read as follows:

A precinct election official shall require any person whose 13 name does not appear on the election register as an active 14 voter to show identification to prove residency in the 15 precinct. Specific documents which are acceptable forms 4 16 identification under this subsection shall be prescribed by 4 17 the state commissioner. A person whose name does not appear 4 18 on the election register of the precinct in which that person 4 19 claims the right to vote shall not be permitted to vote, 4 20 unless the person affirms that the person is currently 4 21 registered in the county and presents proof of identity 4 22 <u>identification to prove residency</u>, or the commissioner informs 4 23 the precinct election officials that an error has occurred and 24 that the person is a registered voter of that precinct. If 25 the commissioner finds no record of the person's registration 4 26 but the person insists that the person is a registered voter 4 27 of that precinct, the precinct election officials shall allow

4 28 the person to cast a ballot in the manner prescribed by 4 29 section 49.81.

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Section 49.81, subsection 1, Code 2005, is amended Sec. 8. 31 to read as follows:

1. A prospective voter who is prohibited under section 33 48A.8, subsection 4, section 49.77, subsection 4, or section 34 49.80 from voting except under this section shall be notified 35 by the appropriate precinct election official that the voter 1 may cast a provisional ballot. If a booth meeting the 2 requirement of section 49.25 is not available at that polling place, the precinct election officials shall make alternative 4 arrangements to insure the challenged voter the opportunity to 5 vote in secret. The marked ballot, folded as required by 6 section 49.84, shall be delivered to a precinct election 7 official who shall immediately seal it in an envelope of the 8 type prescribed by subsection 4. The sealed envelope shall be 9 deposited in an envelope marked "provisional ballots" and 10 shall be considered as having been cast in the special 5 11 precinct established by section 53.20 for purposes of the 12 postelection canvass.

Section 53.10, unnumbered paragraph 2, Code Sec. 9. 5 14 Supplement 2005, is amended to read as follows:

Each person who wishes to vote by absentee ballot at the 16 commissioner's office shall first sign an application for a 17 ballot including the following information: name, current 5 18 address, and the election for which the ballot is requested. 5 19 The person may report a change of address or other information 20 on the person's voter registration record at that time. completing the application, the voter shall produce for 22 inspection the voter's current and valid Iowa driver's license 23 or current and valid Iowa nonoperator's identification card, 24 and if identification is established to the satisfaction of 5 25 the proper official, the person may then be allowed to vote. 26 The registered voter shall immediately mark the ballot; 5 27 enclose the ballot in a secrecy envelope, if necessary, 5 28 seal it in a ballot envelope; subscribe to the affidavit on 5 29 the reverse side of the envelope; and return the absentee 30 ballot to the commissioner. The commissioner shall record the 5 31 numbers appearing on the application and ballot envelope along 5 32 with the name of the registered voter.

Sec. 10. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 53.16A IDENTIFICATION REQUIRED. A photocopy of the voter's current and valid Iowa driver's 35 license or current and valid Iowa nonoperator's identification 1 card and the sealed envelope containing the absentee ballot shall be enclosed in a carrier envelope which shall be 3 securely sealed.

Section 53.17, subsection 1, unnumbered paragraph Sec. 11. 5 1, Code 2005, is amended to read as follows:

The sealed envelope containing the absentee ballot shall be 6 enclosed in a carrier envelope which shall be securely sealed. 8 The sealed carrier envelope shall be returned to the 9 commissioner by one of the following methods:

Sec. 12. Section 53.25, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2005, 6 11 is amended to read as follows:

In case the absentee voter's affidavit is found to be 6 13 insufficient, or that the voter did not include a photocopy of 14 the required identification, or that the applicant is not a 6 15 duly registered voter in such precinct, or that the ballot 6 16 envelope is open, or has been opened and resealed, or that the 6 17 ballot envelope contains more than one ballot of any one kind, 6 18 or that said voter has voted in person, such vote shall not be 6 19 accepted or counted.

EXPLANATION

This bill requires that all voters show a current and valid 22 Iowa driver's license or a current and valid Iowa 6 23 nonoperator's identification card before being allowed to vote 6 24 at the polls, at the commissioner's office, or at a satellite 25 absentee voting station. If a person is voting absentee other 26 than at the commissioner's office or at a satellite absentee 6 27 voting station, the voter shall include a photocopy of the 28 required identification in the return carrier envelope. 29 Correspondingly, the bill strikes the requirement that certain 6 30 persons who register by mail and who have not previously voted 6 31 in a federal election in the county of registration must show 32 identification when voting for the first time in the county at 33 an election with federal offices on the ballot. The bill also specifies that the requirement in current law

35 that a voter show identification if the voter's name does not appear on the election register or if the voter did not 2 respond to a confirmation card sent by the county commissioner 3 of elections is required in order to establish residency in

- 4 the precinct. Current law provides that the secretary of 5 state shall provide, by rule, the acceptable forms of 6 identification in these circumstances.
