   4 A Concurrent Resolution relating to recommendations
          proposed by the United States Department of
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          Agriculture for the federal farm bill of 2007.
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          WHEREAS, agricultural production serves as the
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   8 foundation of this nation's economy, provides abundant
   9 supplies of nourishment to the people of the United
1 10 States and the world, and results in billions of 1 11 dollars of annual United States exports to world
1 12 markets; and
1 13 WHEREAS, the State of Iowa is one of the most 1 14 productive agricultural states in the nation, bringing
1 15 this abundance forth from the most fertile soils in
1 16 the world, and is one of the leading grain, fiber, and 1 17 livestock producers in the world; and
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          WHEREAS, the United States Congress has
1 19 traditionally supported agricultural production by
  20 setting target prices and providing support payments 21 to ensure market security and stability, by providing
1 22 an adequate safety net to protect producers of
  23 commodity crops from market recessions, and by 24 providing insurance against losses related to price
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1 25 fluctuations; and
  26 WHEREAS, the rich and fertile soils, woodlands, and 27 waters of the United States, including Iowa, have been
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1 28 traditionally protected by Acts of Congress, and must
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  29 continue to be preserved for future generations of
  30 Americans; and
   1 WHEREAS, conservation policies are critical to the 2 ability of farmers and ranchers to meet public
   3 expectations for water quality and environmental 4 enhancement within a framework that supports this
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   5 nation's farms and ranches; and
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   6 WHEREAS, American agricultural producers must 7 compete in both domestic and international markets,
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   8 and accordingly require proper government policies in
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   9 order to remain competitive vis=a=vis heavily
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  10 subsidized foreign producers; and
          WHEREAS, the development of this nation's rural
2 12 communities is critical to the infrastructure of the 2 13 United States economy; and 2 14 WHEREAS, off=farm employment and income are
2 15 increasingly crucial to the livelihood of this 2 16 nation's farmers and ranchers, and;
2 17 WHEREAS, it is vital to improve this nation's rural 2 18 areas through funding for infrastructure and job
2 19 growth; and
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          WHEREAS, renewable fuel sources have emerged as the
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  21 primary and most promising solution to reducing this
  22 nation's dependency on the petroleum resources of
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  23 other nations, as well as creating growth in the 24 agricultural economy of Iowa and the United States;
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          WHEREAS, young farmers are the next generation of
  27 American agriculture and must therefore be supported 28 as the seeds of our future; and
          WHEREAS, the United States Congress will begin
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  30 drafting the federal farm bill of 2007, which will
    1 have substantial impact on farmers and ranchers
   2 throughout the nation, including farmers in Iowa; NOW
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   3 THEREFORE,
          BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE
   5 SENATE CONCURRING, That the General Assembly urges the
    6 United States Congress to fortify the federal farm
    7 bill of 2007 by ensuring the continued support of an
    8 adequate, market=driven safety net for American
    9 agricultural producers which is structured in a manner
3 10 that ensures the equitable distribution and
3 11 consistency of support between the different
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3 12 agricultural commodities and production methods; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the federal farm bill 3 14 of 2007 support crops primarily produced in Iowa and 3 15 the other midwestern states, which are among those 3 16 with the greatest potential growth in production and 3 17 demand, with support provided in proportion to their 3 18 production and their value to the United States 3 19 economy; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the federal farm bill 21 of 2007 support the stewardship of agricultural land 22 by the expansion of land=retirement programs and other 3 23 programs which encourage practices that minimize the 24 environmental impacts of crop production; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Congress increase 26 conservation payments to farmers and ranchers who 3 27 practice conservation=oriented production; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the federal farm bill 29 of 2007 provide for increased market access to and 30 market development of American products; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the federal farm bill of 2007 include provisions that spur accelerated rural development through funding for infrastructure and job

4 growth in the rural areas of the United States,

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5 including Iowa; and 6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the federal farm bill 7 of 2007 provide rural development strategies to ensure 8 that rural communities contribute to the United States economy; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the rural development 4 11 title of the federal farm bill of 2007 include funding 12 and technical assistance for rural utilities and the 4 13 expansion of utility services to rural communities; 4 14 and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the federal farm bill 4 16 of 2007 stimulate the expansion of renewable fuel 4 17 production and development through broadening economic 4 18 support for both current technologies and resources, 4 19 and the development of new technologies and resources; 4 20 and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the federal farm bill 22 of 2007 stimulate the use, manufacture, and transport 23 of renewable fuels including biodiesel and 4 24 ethanol=blended fuels by providing for payments 25 allocated directly to the producers of the respective 26 grains or biomass products, as well as to those 27 persons who convert grains or biomass products to 28 usable energy; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the federal farm bill 30 of 2007 continue or expand and fully fund the United 1 States Department of Agriculture's programs to assist 2 beginning farmers; and
3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of

4 this Resolution be sent to the President of the United 5 States; the President of the United States Senate; the 6 Speaker of the United States House of Representatives; 7 the chairperson of the United States Senate Committee 8 on Agriculture, Nutrition and Forestry; the 9 chairperson of the United States House of 10 Representatives Committee on Agriculture; the

11 Secretary of the United States Department of 12 Agriculture; and the members of Iowa's congressional
