A student who commits an assault, as defined under 4 section 708.1, against another student or a school employee in 5 a school building, on school grounds, or at a school=sponsored 6 function shall be suspended for a minimum of three days or a 7 longer time to be determined by the principal. Notice of the 8 suspension shall be immediately sent to the president of the 9 board. By special meeting open to the public or at the next 10 regularly scheduled board meeting, the board shall review the 11 suspension and may decide whether to enforce the suspension. 12 If the suspension is enforced, the board shall also decide 13 whether to hold a disciplinary hearing to determine whether or 14 not to order further sanctions against the student, which may 15 include expelling the student. 1 1 1 1 1 1 1	EXPLANATION This bill requires that students who physically harm another student or a school employee be suspended another student or a school for a minimum of three days. The allows the school board to waive the suspension after review of the events at a meeting that is open to the public. If the suspension is not waived, then the board shall decide whether further disciplinary measures are needed. The bill does not apply to students whose suspension or expulsion would violate the federal Individuals With Disabilities Education
