Section 1. Section 455C.1, subsections 1 and 2, Code 2007, 2 are amended by striking the subsections and inserting in lieu 3 thereof the following:

"Beverage" means a liquid intended for human 1. 5 consumption and packaged in a beverage container for sale to "Beverage" shall not include the following:

- 7 a. A liquid typically ingested in very small quantities 8 and consumed for medicinal purposes only.
- b. A liquid designed to be consumed only as a nutritional 1 10 supplement.
- 1 c. A product intended to be consumed, or packaged and sold 1 12 to consumers or institutions, in a frozen state.
  - d. A powdered drink mix.
- 1 13 1 14 е. A soup or broth, including seafood, meat, or vegetable 1 15 broth.
- 1 16 Farm=produced apple cider which has not been heated, 1 17 pasteurized, or otherwise processed.
  - g. A liquid which is any of the following:
  - (1) A syrup.
- (2) A concentrate.(3) Typically added as a minor flavoring ingredient in 1 22 food or drink, such as extracts, cooking additives, sauces, or 1 23 condiments.
- h. Milk or other primarily dairy=based drinks.2. "Beverage container" means a glass, plastic, or metal 1 26 container, sealed by the manufacturer, containing a beverage 27 of at least five and one=half fluid ounces or one hundred 28 sixty=two milliliters but not more than sixty=eight fluid 1 29 ounces or two liters in size.
  - Sec. 2. Section 455C.2, subsection 2, Code 2007, is 31 amended to read as follows:
- 2. In addition to the refund value provided in subsection 32 1 33 1 of this section, a dealer, or person operating a redemption 34 center who redeems empty beverage containers or a dealer agent 35 shall be reimbursed by the distributor required to accept the 1 empty beverage containers an amount which is one cent two <u>cents</u> per container. A dealer, dealer agent, or person 3 operating a redemption center may compact empty metal beverage 4 containers with the approval of the distributor required to

5 accept the containers.

## EXPLANATION

This bill relates to the control of beverage containers. The bill increases the types of containers which require a 9 refund value to include beverage containers such as bottled

10 water and juice drinks.
11 The bill also increases the reimbursement amount, commonly 12 referred to as the handling fee, paid by distributors to 13 dealers from 1 cent per beverage container to 2 cents per

2 14 beverage container.
