Section 167.18, Code 2007, is amended to read 1 2 as follows: 167.18 DUTY TO DISPOSE OF DEAD BODIES. A person who has been caring for or who owns an animal that 1 5 has died shall not allow the carcass to lie about the person's 1 6 premises. The carcass shall be disposed of dispose of the 7 animal's carcass within twenty=four hours after the animal's 1 8 death. The person shall dispose of the carcass by cooking,
1 9 burying, or burning, or composting it, as provided in this
1 10 chapter, or by disposing of it, within the allowed time, to a
1 11 person licensed to dispose of it. If the carcass is disposed 12 of in a water of the state, as defined in section 455B.171, 1 13 the department shall cooperate with the department of natural 14 resources in investigating the incident, enforcing this 1 15 section, and remediating the damage. 1 16 Sec. 2. Section 167.19, Code 2007, is amended to read as 1 17 follows: 1 18 167.19 PENALTY PENALTIES.
1 19 1. a. A Except as provided in paragraph "b", a person who
1 20 violates this chapter or a rule adopted by the department 1 21 pursuant to this chapter is guilty of a simple misdemeanor. 1 22 The person may be subject to a civil penalty of not less than 23 one hundred dollars and not more than one thousand dollars for 1 24 each violation. However, the state shall be precluded from 1 25 bringing a criminal action against the person under this 1 26 subsection, if the department has initiated a civil 1 27 enforcement proceeding against the person. 1 28 b. A person who violates section 167.18 by disposing of an 29 animal carcass into a water of the state as defined in section 1 30 455B.171 is guilty of a serious misdemeanor. The person is 1 31 also subject to a civil penalty of not less than one thousand 32 dollars and not more than five thousand dollars for each 33 carcass that the person disposes of in a water of the state.
34 A person who disposes of one or more parts of an animal 35 carcass or offal from that animal on the same occasion is guilty of a single violation. 2. Moneys collected in civil penalties under this section 3 shall be deposited into the general fund of the state. 4 Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 167.19A RESTITUTION.
5 A person who is guilty of or civilly liable for disposing 6 of an animal carcass into a water of the state as provided in 2 2 2 7 section 167.19 shall pay restitution to the following: 8 1. The department of agriculture and land stewardship or 9 the department of natural resources for costs associated with 2 10 properly disposing of the animal carcass by that department. 2 11 The moneys received by the department shall be treated as 2 11 The moneys received by the department shared 2 12 repayment receipts as provided in section 8.2.
2 13 2. The department of natural resources for injury caused 2 13 2 the department's administrative expenses. 2 14 to a wild animal or the department's administrative expenses. 2 15 The moneys shall be deposited in the state fish and game 2 16 protection fund created in section 456A.17 as provided in 2 17 section 481A.151. 3. The department of natural resources for performing

2 19 testing of the quality of the waters of the state where the 2 20 animal carcass was disposed. The moneys shall be deposited 2 21 into the watershed improvement fund created in section 466A.2. EXPLANATION

2 23 This bill amends provisions in Code chapter 167 which 24 prohibit a person from disposing of an animal other than by cooking, burying, burning, or providing it to a person 25 licensed under the Code chapter for rendering. 26

The bill allows disposal by composting.

The bill provides that the department of agriculture and 2.8 29 land stewardship, which is responsible for administering the 30 Code chapter, must cooperate with the department of natural 31 resources when a violation of the disposal requirements 32 involves placing an animal carcass in a water of the state 33 (see Code section 167.19 and 21 IAC 61.32). A water of the 34 state includes a stream, lake, pond, marsh, watercourse, 35 waterway, well, spring, reservoir, aquifer, irrigation system, 1 or drainage system.

The bill provides an enhanced penalty for the illegal 3 disposal, from a simple misdemeanor to a serious misdemeanor, 4 and increases the civil penalty from a range between \$100 and 5 \$1,000 to a range between \$1,000 and \$5,000. Unlike the 6 general penalty provision, a person may be subject to both a 7 criminal and civil penalty.

In addition to the penalty provisions, a person who 9 illegally deposits an animal carcass into a water of the state 10 must pay restitution to the state, including to the agency 3 11 which provides for its proper disposal, to the department of 3 12 natural resources under its restitution statute for water 3 13 pollution (Code section 481A.151), and to the department of 14 natural resources for performing water quality testing.

3 15 A simple misdemeanor is punishable by confinement for no 3 16 more than 30 days or a fine of at least \$65 but not more than 3 17 \$625 or by both. A serious misdemeanor is punishable by 3 18 confinement for no more than one year and a fine of at least 3 19 \$315 but not more than \$1,875.
