"Electioneering communication" means any communication 5 that refers to a clearly identified candidate for statewide 6 office or the general assembly and that has the effect of 7 encouraging or discouraging a vote for the candidate, 8 regardless of whether the communication expressly advocates a 9 vote for or against the candidate. 10 b. "Leadership position" means the office of president of 11 the senate, speaker of the house of representatives, majority 12 leader, assistant majority leader, minority leader, or 13 assistant minority leader. 14 2. A member of the general assembly who holds a leadership 15 position shall not direct, manage, organize, advise, or 16 consult with any organization that engages in electioneering 17 communications. This prohibition shall be effective sixty 18 days before a general or special election for the office 19 sought by the clearly identified candidate, or thirty days 10 before a primary election for the office sought by the clearly 11 identified candidate. 12 3. The penalty set out in section 68A.701 does not apply 13 to violations of this section. 14 EXPLANATION 15 This bill prohibits legislative leaders from actively 16 participating in an organization that engages in 17 electioneering communications. The prohibition applies during 18 a limited time frame: 60 days before a general or special 28 election for the office sought by a clearly identified 29 candidate, or 30 days before a primary election sought by a 21 clearly identified candidate. Electioneering communications 20 are communications which refer to a clearly identified 21 candidate for statewide office or the general assembly and 22 and which have the effect of encouraging or discouraging a vote 23 for that candidate. 24 The criminal penalty normally associated with violations of the 25 that candidate in Code section 68B.32D, ranging from a 27 reprimand to a civil penalty of not
