	A BILL FOR
An Act allowing small business wellness and disease management initiatives, and providing an effective date.  BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: TLSB 2328HH 82 av/cf/24	
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Section 1. Section 513B.4, Code 2007, is amended by adding 1 2 the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 6. Notwithstanding subsection 4, a small 4 employer carrier may offer to transfer a small employer into a 5 different class of business with a lower index rate based upon 6 claims experience, implementation of managed care or wellness 7 programs, or health status improvement of the small employer 8 since issue.

NEW SECTION. 513B.4B SMALL EMPLOYER INCENTIVES Sec. 2. 1 10 == SUSPENSION OR MODIFICATION OF PREMIUM RATE RESTRICTIONS.

1. In order to encourage voluntary participation in 1 12 wellness or disease management programs, a small employer 1 13 carrier may offer premium credits or discounts to a small 1 14 employer for the benefit of eligible employees of that small 1 15 employer who participate in such a program. An employee shall 1 16 not be penalized in any way for not participating in such a 1 17 program.

2. The commissioner shall adopt, by rule or order, 1 19 provisions allowing suspension or modification of premium rate 1 20 restrictions to enable a small employer carrier to provide 1 21 premium credits or discounts to a small employer based on 22 measurable reductions in costs of that small employer, 1 23 including but not limited to tobacco use cessation, 1 24 participation in established wellness or disease management 25 programs, and reduced administrative or distribution costs. 26 Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of

1 27 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment. EXPLANATION

This bill authorizes small business wellness and disease 1 30 management initiatives. Code section 513B.4 is amended to 1 31 allow a small employer carrier to transfer a small employer into a different class of business with a lower index rate 33 based upon claims experience, implementation of managed care 34 or wellness programs, or health status improvement of the 35 small employer since issuance of the policy.

New Code section 513B.4B allows a small employer carrier to 2 offer premium credits or discounts to a small employer for the 3 benefit of eligible employees of that employer who voluntarily 4 participate in wellness or disease management programs. 5 bill requires the commissioner of insurance to adopt rules or 6 orders allowing suspension or modification of premium rate 7 restrictions to enable a small employer carrier to provide 8 such premium credits or discounts to a small employer based on 9 measurable reductions in costs of that small employer, 10 including but not limited to tobacco use cessation,

11 participation in established wellness or disease management

2 12 programs, and reduced administrative or distribution costs. 13 The bill prohibits an employee from being penalized in any way 14 for not participating in a wellness or disease management

2 15 program. The bill takes effect upon enactment.
