A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to incentives for school district reorganizations 2 and shared operational functions, and making an appropriation. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 4 TLSB 1228HV 82

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Section 1. Section 257.3, subsection 2, paragraph d, Code 2 2007, is amended to read as follows: 3 d. For purposes of this section, a reorganized school 4 district is one which absorbs at least thirty percent of the 5 enrollment of the school district affected by a reorganization 6 or dissolved during a dissolution and in which action to bring 7 about a reorganization or dissolution is initiated by a vote 1 8 of the board of directors or jointly by the affected boards of 1 9 directors to take effect on or after July 1, 2002 2007, and on 1 10 or before July 1, 2006 2014. Each district which initiated, 1 11 by a vote of the board of directors or jointly by the affected 1 12 boards, action to bring about a reorganization or dissolution 1 12 to take offect on or after July 1, 2002 2007, and on or before 1 13 to take effect on or after July 1, $\frac{2002}{2007}$, and on or before 1 14 July 1, $\frac{2006}{2014}$, shall certify the date and the nature of 1 15 the action taken to the department of education by January 1 1 16 of the year in which the reorganization or dissolution takes 1 17 effect. For a reorganization or dissolution that took effect 1 17 effect. For a reorganization of dissolution that took effect
1 18 on or after July 1, 2002, and on or before July 1, 2006, the
1 19 reorganized school district shall continue to receive the
1 20 benefits of paragraphs "a" and "b" of this subsection for the
1 21 time specified in those paragraphs.
1 22 Sec. 2. Section 257.11, subsection 2, paragraph c, Code
1 22 2007 is amended by striking the paragraph and inserting in 1 23 2007, is amended by striking the paragraph and inserting in 1 24 lieu thereof the following: c. Pupils attending class for all or a substantial portion 26 of a school day pursuant to a whole grade sharing agreement 27 executed under sections 282.10 through 282.12 shall be 1 28 eligible for supplementary weighting pursuant to this 29 subsection. A school district which executes a whole grade 30 sharing agreement and which adopts a resolution jointly with 1 31 other affected boards to study the question of undergoing a 1 32 reorganization or dissolution to take effect on or before July 1 33 1, 2014, shall receive a weighting of one=tenth of the 1 34 percentage of the pupil's school day during which the pupil 35 attends classes in another district, attends classes taught by 1 a teacher who is jointly employed under section 280.15, or 2 attends classes taught by a teacher who is employed by another 3 school district. A district shall be eligible for 4 supplementary weighting pursuant to this paragraph for a 5 maximum of three years. Receipt of supplementary weighting 6 for a second and third year shall be conditioned upon 2 7 submission of information resulting from the study to the 8 school budget review committee indicating progress toward the 9 objective of reorganization on or before July 1, 2014. 2 8 2 9 2 10 Sec. 3. Section 257.11, subsection 5, paragraph a, Code 2 11 2007, is amended to read as follows: a. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2002, and 13 succeeding budget years through the school budget year 2 14 beginning July 1, 2007, in order to provide additional funds 2 15 for school districts in which a regional academy is located, a 2 16 supplementary weighting plan for determining enrollment is 2 17 adopted.

Section 257.11, Code 2007, is amended by adding

2 19 the following new subsection: NEW SUBSECTION. 5A. SHARED OPERATIONAL FUNCTIONS == 2 21 INCREASED STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES.

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a. In order to provide additional funding to increase 2 23 student opportunities and redirect more resources to student 24 programming for school districts that share operational 25 functions, a supplementary weighting of two hundredths per 26 pupil shall be assigned to pupils enrolled in a district that 2 27 shares with a political subdivision one or more operational 28 functions in the areas of superintendent management, business 29 management, human resources, transportation, or operation and 2 30 maintenance for at least twenty percent of the school year. 2 31 The additional weighting shall be assigned for each discrete 32 operational function shared. For the purposes of this 33 section, "political subdivision" means a city, township, 34 county, school corporation, merged area, area education 35 agency, institution governed by the state board of regents, or any other governmental subdivision.

b. Supplementary weighting pursuant to this subsection 3 shall be available to a school district for a maximum of five years during the period commencing with the budget year 5 beginning July 1, 2008, through the budget year beginning July 6 1, 2013. The minimum amount of additional weighting for which a school district shall be eligible is an amount equivalent to ten additional pupils, and the maximum amount of additional 9 weighting for which a school district shall be eligible is an 10 amount equivalent to forty additional pupils. Receipt of 11 supplementary weighting by a school district pursuant to this 3 12 subsection for more than one year shall be contingent upon the 3 13 annual submission of information by the district to the 3 14 department documenting cost savings directly attributable to 3 15 the shared operational functions. Criteria for determining 3 16 the number of years for which supplementary weighting shall be 3 17 received pursuant to this subsection, subject to the five=year 3 18 maximum, and for determining qualification of operational 3 19 functions for supplementary weighting shall be determined by 3 20 the department by rule, through consideration of long=term 21 savings by the school district or increased student 3 22 opportunities.

Supplementary weighting pursuant to this subsection 24 shall be available to an area education agency for a maximum 25 of five years during the period commencing with the budget 3 26 year beginning July 1, 2008. The minimum amount of additional 27 funding for which an area education agency shall be eligible 28 is fifty thousand dollars, and the maximum amount of 3 29 additional funding for which an area education agency shall be 30 eligible is two hundred thousand dollars. The department of 31 management shall annually set a weighting for each area 32 education agency to generate the approved operational sharing 33 expense using the area education agency's special education 34 cost per pupil amount and foundation level. Receipt of 35 supplementary weighting by an area education agency for more 1 than one year shall be contingent upon the annual submission 2 of information by the district to the department documenting cost savings directly attributable to the shared operational functions. Criteria for determining the number of years for 4 functions. 5 which supplementary weighting shall be received pursuant to this subsection, subject to the five=year maximum, and the amount generated by the supplementary weighting, and for 8 determining qualification of operational functions for supplementary weighting shall be determined by the department 4 10 by rule, through consideration of long=term savings by the

- area educational agency or increased student opportunities. d. This subsection is repealed effective July 1, 2014. Section 257.11A, Code 2007, is amended to read as Sec. 5. follows:
- 4 14 4 15 257.11A SUPPLEMENTARY WEIGHTING AND SCHOOL REORGANIZATION. 4 16 In determining weighted enrollment under section 257.6, 17 if the board of directors of a school district has approved a 4 18 contract for sharing pursuant to section 257.11 and the school 4 19 district has approved an action to bring about a 20 reorganization to take effect on and after July 1, 2002 2007, 4 21 and on or before July 1, 2006 2014, the reorganized school 22 district shall include, for a period of three years following 23 the effective date of the reorganization, additional pupils 24 added by the application of the supplementary weighting plan, 4 25 equal to the pupils added by the application of the 4 26 supplementary weighting plan in the year preceding the 4 27 reorganization. For the purposes of this subsection, the

4 28 weighted enrollment for the period of three years following 29 the effective date of reorganization shall include the

4 30 supplementary weighting in the base year used for determining 4 31 the combined district cost for the first year of the 4 32 reorganization. However, the weighting shall be reduced by 33 the supplementary weighting added for a pupil whose residency 34 is not within the reorganized district.

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2. For purposes of this section, a reorganized district is 1 one in which the reorganization was approved in an election 2 pursuant to sections 275.18 and 275.20 and takes effect on or 3 after July 1, $\frac{2002}{2007}$, and on or before July 1, $\frac{2006}{2014}$. 4 Each district which initiates, by a vote of the board of 5 directors or jointly by the affected boards, action to bring 6 about a reorganization or dissolution to take effect on or 7 after July 1, 2002 2007, and on or before July 1, 2006 2014, 8 shall certify the date and the nature of the action taken to 9 the department of education by January 1 of the year in which 10 the reorganization or dissolution takes effect.

3. Notwithstanding subsection 1, a school district which was participating in a whole grade sharing arrangement during 5 13 the budget year beginning July 1, 2001, and which received a 5 14 maximum of two years of supplementary weighting pursuant to 5 15 section 257.11, subsection 2, paragraph "c", shall include 5 16 additional pupils added by the application of the 5 17 supplementary weighting plan, equal to the pupils added by the 5 18 application of the supplementary weighting plan in the year 5 19 preceding the reorganization, for a period of four years 5 20 following the effective date of the reorganization.

A school district shall be eligible for a combined 5 22 maximum total of six years of supplementary weighting under 5 23 the provisions of this section and section 257.11, subsection 5 24 2, paragraph "c". A school district participating in a whole 5 25 grade sharing arrangement during the budget year beginning 5 26 July 1, 2001, that adopted a resolution jointly with other 5 27 affected boards to study the question of undergoing a 28 reorganization or dissolution to take effect on or after July 29 1, 2002, and on or before July 1, 2006, shall continue to 5 30 receive the supplementary weighting to which it was entitled 31 pursuant to the provisions of this section and section 257.11,

33 Sec. 6. SCHOOL SHARING AND EFFICIENCIES IN OPERATION 5 34 PROCESS == APPROPRIATION. For the fiscal year beginning July 5 35 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008, there is appropriated from 6 1 the general fund of the state to the department of education 2 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to 3 be used for the purposes designated in this section:

400,000 4 \$ The amount appropriated pursuant to this section shall be 6 utilized by the department to assist school districts in implementing shared operational functions.

EXPLANATION This bill makes changes related to incentives for school 10 district reorganization and dissolution and shared operational 11 functions between school districts and political subdivisions.

The bill leaves intact the reduced uniform levy for schools 6 13 that reorganized prior to July 1, 2006, allowing school 6 14 districts to utilize the incentive if they reorganize until on 6 15 or before July 1, 2014.

The bill strikes the current whole grade sharing 6 17 arrangement, and replaces it with a modified and simplified 6 18 version. The new provision allows school districts that 6 19 execute a whole grade sharing agreement and adopt a resolution 20 to study the effect of undergoing a reorganization or 21 dissolution to take effect on or before July 1, 2014, to 6 22 weight one=tenth of a percentage of a student's school day 6 23 during which the student attends classes in another district, 6 24 is taught by a teacher jointly employed, or attends classes 6 25 taught by a teacher employed by another district. This 6 26 supplementary weighting is available for a total of three 27 years. However, the second and third year of supplementary 28 weighting funding is dependent upon the school district's 6 29 progress toward reorganization.

The bill provides an additional funding for regional 31 academies through the school budget year beginning July 1, 6 32 2007.

33 The bill offers financial and operational support to help 34 school districts reorganize, consolidate, or dissolve 35 efficiently without allowing fiscal barriers to get in the A supplementary weighting of two hundredths per pupil 2 will be given to a district that shares with a political 3 subdivision one or more of its administrative management, 4 business management, human resources, transportation, or 5 operational and maintenance functions for at least 20 percent

6 of the year. A political subdivision means a city, township, 7 county, school corporation, merged area, area education 8 agency, board of regents institution, or any other government 7 9 subdivision. This supplementary weighting is available for 7 10 five years, with a minimum equivalent weighting of 10 pupils 7 11 and a maximum equivalent weighting of 40 pupils. After the 7 12 first year of supplementary weighting, the school district 7 13 must submit evidence of cost savings attributable to the 7 14 shared operational functions. This section will be repealed 7 15 on July 1, 2014.

The bill provides that area education agencies (AEAs) shall 7 17 have supplementary weighting for shared operational functions 7 18 available for a maximum of five years beginning July 1, 2008. 19 The minimum amount of additional funding that an AEA shall be 7 20 eligible for is \$50,000 and the maximum amount of funding that 7 21 an AEA shall be eligible for is \$200,000.

The bill directs the department of management to annually 7 23 set a weighting for each $\overline{\mathtt{AEA}}$ to generate the approved 24 operational sharing expense using the AEA's special education 25 cost per pupil amount and foundation level. To receive 26 supplementary weighting for more than one year depends on 7 27 annual reports by the district to the department on the cost 28 savings attributable to the shared operational functions.

Criteria for determining the number of years that 29 30 supplementary weighting shall be received, subject to the 31 five=year maximum, and the amount generated by the 32 supplementary weighting, and for determining qualification of 33 operational functions for supplementary weighting shall be 34 decided by department rule through consideration of long=term 35 savings by the AEA or increased student opportunities.

The bill also provides for supplementary weighting funding 2 for three years for a reorganized school district that is 3 equal to the funding that was received in the year preceding 4 the reorganization. The bill amends the definition of 5 reorganized school district for purposes of receiving this 6 supplementary weighting to include those districts where the

7 reorganization takes effect on or before July 1, 2014. 8 An appropriation of \$400,000 from the general fund is 8 9 provided to assist schools in implementing shared operational 8 10 functions.

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
