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11 11 11 11 11 11 11 11 11 11 11 11 11	2 1. FINDINGS. The general assembly finds that: 3 a. The state board of regents has approved a buildings and 4 facilities improvement program for the institutions of higher 5 learning under the jurisdiction of the board, which the board 6 deems necessary to further the educational objectives of the 7 institutions, together with an estimate of the cost of each of 8 the buildings and facilities. 9 b. The projects contained in the buildings and facilities 10 improvement program are deemed necessary for the proper 11 performance of the instructional, research, and service 12 functions of the institutions. 13 c. Section 262A.4 provides that the state board of 14 regents, after authorization by a constitutional majority of 15 each house of the general assembly and approval by the 16 governor, may undertake and carry out at the institutions of 17 higher learning under the jurisdiction of the board any 18 project as defined in chapter 262A. 19 d. Chapter 262A authorizes the state board of regents to 10 borrow moneys and to issue and sell negotiable revenue bonds 11 to pay all or any part of the cost of carrying out projects at 12 any institution payable solely from and secured by an 12 irrevocable pledge of a sufficient portion of the student fees 13 and charges and institutional income received by the 15 particular institution. 16 e. To further the educational objectives of the 17 institutions, the state board of regents requests 18 authorization to finance certain costs of the reprojects to be 19 financed by appropriations or by federal or other funds 10 section, with the remaining costs of the projects to be 11 financed by appropriations or by federal or other funds 12 improvement program by borrowing moneys and issuing negotiable 13 bonds under chapter 262A in a total amount as provided in this 14 section, with the remaining costs of the projects to be 15 financed by appropriations or by federal or other funds 16 is authorized to undertake, plan, construct, improve, repair, 17 remodel, furnish, and equip, and other

Any balance remaining in a project fund after a project is 3 completed may be expended for fire and environmental safety, 4 deferred maintenance, or campus security improvements at the 5 buildings and facilities of the institution as deemed 6 necessary by the state board of regents.

d. For fire and environmental safety, deferred 8 maintenance, and campus security improvements at buildings and 9 facilities of the universities as deemed necessary by the 3 10 state board of regents:

3. AUTHORIZATION OF BORROWING AND BONDING.

- The general assembly authorizes the state board of a. 3 14 regents to borrow moneys and to issue and sell negotiable 3 15 revenue bonds in the amount of \$131,400,000 in the manner 3 16 provided in sections 262A.5 and 262A.6 in order to pay all or 3 17 any part of the costs of carrying out the projects at the 3 18 institutions approved and authorized in subsection 2, with the 3 19 remaining costs of the projects to be financed by 20 appropriations or by federal or other funds lawfully 3 21 available. The amount of bonds may be exceeded by the amount 3 22 the state board of regents determines to be necessary to 23 capitalize bond reserves, interest during construction, and 24 issuance costs. No commitment is implied or intended by 3 25 approval to fund any portion of the buildings and facilities 26 improvement program beyond the portion that is financed and 27 approved by the Eighty=second General Assembly, 2007 Session, 3 28 and the governor.
- b. In light of this bonding authorization, the state board 29 30 of regents shall not request additional state capital funding 31 for its universities for new academic buildings through the 3 32 fiscal year ending June 30, 2013. Capital projects already 3 33 receiving some state dollars, new infrastructure projects 3 34 resulting from economic development initiatives, and projects 3 35 for deferred maintenance, fire safety, or campus security 1 improvements are excluded from this funding restriction. EXPLANATION

This bill authorizes the state board of regents, pursuant 4 to Code chapter 262A, to borrow moneys and to issue and sell 5 negotiable revenue bonds to pay all or part of the cost of 6 certain building and facility improvement projects at its 7 institutions of higher education, payable solely from student 8 fees and charges and institutional income. The bill 9 authorizes the state board of regents to carry out the 4 10 following projects at the following institutions: 4 11 1. University of Iowa: college of public health academic

- 12 building; old music building renovation; pentacrest renewal 4 13 and HVAC modernization. The total amount of spending 4 14 authorized is \$35.9 million.
- 4 15 2. Iowa state university of science and technology: 4 16 chemistry building facilities. The total amount of spending 4 17 authorized is \$53.9 million.
- 4 18 3. University of northern Iowa: phase II of the 4 19 electrical distribution loop system load break and Sabin hall 4 18 4 20 renovation. The total amount of spending authorized is \$17.6 4 21 million.
- 4. Fire and safety, deferred maintenance, and campus security improvements at buildings and facilities of the 4 24 universities as deemed necessary by the board. The total 25 amount of spending authorized is \$24 million. 26 LSB 2919HV 82

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
