A BILL FOR

1 An Act regulating the administration of drugs to certain noncaptive vertebrate wildlife and providing a penalty. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 4 TLSB 1408DP 82 5 av/je/5

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Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 481A.40 USE OF DRUGS ON 2 NONCAPTIVE VERTEBRATE WILDLIFE == PENALTY.

3 1. For the purposes of this section, "drug" means any 4 chemical substance, other than food, that affects the 5 structure or biological function of any noncaptive vertebrate 6 wildlife species.

2. Except with written authorization from the director or 8 the director's designee or as otherwise provided by law, a 9 person shall not administer any drug to any noncaptive 10 vertebrate wildlife, including but not limited to drugs used 11 for fertility control, disease prevention or treatment, 1 12 immobilization, or growth stimulation.

This section does not prohibit the treatment of sick or 3. 1 14 injured wildlife by a licensed veterinarian or holder of a 1 15 wildlife rehabilitation permit.

- 4. This section shall not be construed to limit employees 1 17 of agencies of the state, the United States, or local animal 1 18 control officers in the performance of their official duties 1 19 related to public health, wildlife management, or wildlife 1 20 removal. However, a drug shall not be administered by any 1 21 person for fertility control or growth stimulation except as 1 22 provided in subsection 2.
- 5. An officer of the department may take possession of or 23 1 24 dispose of any noncaptive vertebrate wildlife that the officer 1 25 reasonably believes has been administered drugs in violation 1 26 of this section.
 - 6. A person who violates this section is quilty of a 28 serious misdemeanor.

EXPLANATION

This bill relates to the administration of drugs to certain 31 noncaptive vertebrate wildlife. For the purposes of the bill, 1 32 "drug" means any chemical substance, other than food, that 1 33 affects the structure or biological function of any noncaptive 34 vertebrate wildlife species.

The bill prohibits the administration of drugs to any 1 noncaptive vertebrate wildlife for any purpose, including but 2 not limited to fertility control, disease prevention or 3 treatment, immobilization, or growth stimulation, except with 4 written authorization from the department of natural resources 5 or as otherwise provided by law.

6 The bill does not prohibit a licensed veterinarian or 7 holder of a wildlife rehabilitation permit from treating sick 8 or injured wildlife. The bill also does not prohibit 9 government employees from carrying out their official duties 10 related to public health, wildlife management, or wildlife 2 11 removal.

The bill authorizes an officer of the department to 2 13 possession of and dispose of any noncaptive vertebrate The bill authorizes an officer of the department to take 2 14 wildlife that the officer reasonably believes has been 2 15 administered drugs in violation of the bill.

2 16 A person who violates the provisions of the bill is guilty 2 17 of a serious misdemeanor. A serious misdemeanor is punishable 2 18 by confinement for no more than one year and a fine of at 2 19 least \$315 but not more than \$1,875.
