A BILL FOR

1 An Act concerning state and local measures for preparing a student for a career or for postsecondary education, including a statewide core curriculum for school districts and accredited nonpublic schools and a state=designated career information and decision=making system. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 7 TLSB 6127SV 82

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Section 1. Section 256.7, subsections 26 and 28, Code 2 Supplement 2007, are amended to read as follows: 3 26. <u>a.</u> Adopt rules that establish a <del>voluntary model</del> core 4 curriculum and requiring, beginning with the students in the 5 2010==2011 school year graduating class, high school 6 graduation requirements for all students in school districts 7 and accredited nonpublic schools that include at a minimum 8 satisfactory completion of four years of English and language 1 9 arts, three years of mathematics, three years of science, and 1 10 three years of social studies. The voluntary model core 1 11 curriculum adopted shall address the core content standards in 1 12 subsection 28 and the skills and knowledge students need to be 13 successful in the twenty=first century. The voluntary model 1 14 core curriculum shall include social studies and twenty=first 1 15 century learning skills which include but are not limited to 1 16 civic literacy, health literacy, technology literacy, 1 17 financial literacy, and employability skills; and shall 1 18 address the curricular needs of students in kindergarten 1 19 through grade twelve in those areas. For purposes of this 1 20 subsection, "financial literacy" shall include but not be 21 limited to financial responsibility and planning skills; money 22 management skills, including setting financial goals, creating 23 spending plans, and using financial instruments; applying 24 decision=making skills to analyze debt incurrence and debt 25 management; understanding risk management, including the 26 features and functions of insurance; and understanding saving 27 and investing as applied to long=term financial security and 28 asset building. School districts and accredited nonpublic 29 schools shall adopt the core curriculum developed for grades 30 nine through twelve pursuant to this subsection prior to the 31 school year beginning July 1, 2010. The state board shall 32 adopt rules establishing a core curriculum for kindergarten 33 through grade eight, and school districts and accredited 34 nonpublic schools shall adopt the core curriculum established 35 by the state board prior to the 2014=2015 school year. b. The state board shall continue Continue the inclusive 2 process begun during the initial development of a voluntary 3 model core curriculum for grades nine through twelve including 4 stakeholder involvement, including but not limited to 5 representatives from the private sector and the business 6 community, and alignment of the voluntary model core 7 curriculum to other recognized sets of national and 8 international standards. The state board shall also recommend 9 quality assessments to school districts and accredited 2 10 nonpublic schools to measure the voluntary model core 2 11 curriculum. The state board shall not require school districts or 13 accredited nonpublic schools to adopt a specific textbook or 2 14 textbook series to meet the core curriculum requirements of 15 this subsection or the core content standards adopted pursuant

16 to subsection 28.

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28. Adopt a set of core content standards applicable to 2 18 all students in kindergarten through grade twelve in every 2 19 school district and accredited nonpublic school. For purposes 2 20 of this subsection, "core content standards" includes reading, 2 21 mathematics, and science. The core content standards shall be 2 22 identical to the core content standards included in Iowa's 2 23 approved 2006 standards and assessment system under Title I of 2 24 the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, 20 25 U.S.C. } 6301 et seq., as amended by the federal No Child Left 26 Behind Act of 2001, Pub. L. No. 107=110. School districts and 27 accredited nonpublic schools shall include, at a minimum, the 28 core content standards adopted pursuant to this subsection in 29 any set of locally developed content standards. 30 districts and accredited nonpublic schools are strongly 31 encouraged to include the voluntary model core curriculum or 32 set higher expectations in local standards. As changes in 33 federal law or regulation occur, the state board is authorized 34 to amend the core content standards as appropriate. 35

Sec. 2. Section 279.61, Code Supplement 2007, is amended 1 to read as follows:

279.61 STUDENT PLAN FOR PROGRESS TOWARD UNIVERSITY ADMISSIONS == REPORT.

4 1. For the school year beginning July 1,  $\frac{2007}{2008}$ , and 5 each succeeding school year, the board of directors of each 6 school district shall cooperate with each student enrolled in grade eight to develop for the student a core curriculum plan 8 to guide the student toward the goal of successfully 9 completing, at a minimum, the voluntary model core curriculum 3 10 developed by the state board of education pursuant to section 3 11 256.7, subsection 26, by the time the student graduates from 3 12 high school. The plan shall include career options and shall 3 13 identify the coursework needed in grades nine through twelve 3 14 to support the student's postsecondary education and career 3 15 options. Additionally, the plan shall include a timeline for 16 each student to successfully complete, prior to graduation, 17 all components of the state=designated career information and

18 decision=making system administered by the department in 19 accordance with section 118 of the federal Carl D. Perkins 20 Career and Technical Education Improvement Act of 2006, Pub.  $3\ 21\ L.\ No.\ 109=270.$  The student's parent or guardian shall sign 3 22 the core curriculum plan developed with the student and the 3 23 signed plan shall be included in the student's cumulative 3 24 records.

3 25 2. For the school year beginning July 1,  $\frac{2007}{2008}$ , and 3 26 each succeeding school year, the board of directors of each 3 27 school district shall report annually to each student enrolled 28 in grades nine through twelve in the school district, and, if 3 29 the student is under the age of eighteen, to each student's 3 30 parent or guardian, the student's progress toward meeting the 31 goal of successfully completing the <u>core curriculum and</u> high 32 school graduation requirements adopted by the state board of 3 33 education pursuant to section 256.7, subsection 26. 3 34 Sec. 3. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION == CORE CURRICULUM STUDY.

35 The department of education shall conduct a study of the 1 measures necessary for the successful adoption by the state's 2 school districts and accredited nonpublic schools of core 3 curriculums and core content standards established by rule 4 pursuant to section 256.7, subsections 26 and 28. The 5 department shall submit its findings and recommendations, 6 including recommendations for statutory and administrative rule changes necessary, to the general assembly by November 8 14, 2008.

STATE MANDATE FUNDING SPECIFIED. In accordance Sec. 4.  $4\ 10$  with section 25B.2, subsection 3, the state cost of requiring  $4\ 11$  compliance with any state mandate included in this Act shall 4 12 be paid by a school district from state school foundation aid 13 received by the school district under section 257.16. This 14 specification of the payment of the state cost shall be deemed 4 15 to meet all of the state funding=related requirements of 4 16 section 25B.2, subsection 3, and no additional state funding 4 17 shall be necessary for the full implementation of this Act by 4 18 and enforcement of this Act against all affected school 4 19 districts.

## EXPLANATION

This bill requires the state board of education to adopt 22 rules establishing a core curriculum which school districts 23 and accredited nonpublic schools must adopt before the start 4 24 of the 2010=2011 school year for grades nine through 12 and 4 25 before the start of the 2014=2015 school year for kindergarten 4 26 through grade eight. The bill also requires a timeline for

4 27 successful completion of core curriculum plans for students 4 28 and provides for a core curriculum study by the department of 4 29 education.

4 30 Under current Code, the core curriculum must include 4 31 "financial literacy", which the bill defines as including but 4 32 not limited to financial responsibility and planning skills, 33 money management skills, and decision=making skills.

The bill prohibits the state board from requiring that 35 school districts and schools adopt specific textbooks or 1 textbook series to meet the core curriculum or core curriculum standards.

The bill requires that the individual core curriculum plans 4 school districts must develop to guide each student toward the 5 goal of successfully completing the core curriculum by the 6 time the student graduates must include a timeline for the 7 successful completion of all components of the 8 state=designated career information and decision=making system 9 the state maintains under a federal Carl D. Perkins Career and 5 10 Technical Education Improvement Act of 2006 grant.

The department is directed to conduct a study of the 12 measures necessary for the successful adoption by the state's 5 13 school districts and accredited nonpublic schools of core 5 14 curriculums and core content standards established by the 5 15 state board. The department must submit its findings and 5 16 recommendations to the general assembly by November 14, 2008.

The bill eliminates references to a voluntary model core

5 18 curriculum.

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5 19 The bill may include a state mandate as defined in Code 5 20 section 25B.3. The bill requires that the state cost of any 21 state mandate included in the bill be paid by a school 22 district from state school foundation aid received by the 23 school district under Code section 257.16. The specification 24 is deemed to constitute state compliance with any state 25 mandate funding=related requirements of Code section 25B.2. 26 The inclusion of this specification is intended to reinstate 5 27 the requirement of political subdivisions to comply with any 28 state mandates included in the bill.

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
