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New Code section 29C.23 requires the department of public defense's homeland security and emergency management division defense's homeland emergency management division defense of the confidence of the defense of the reserve is to maintain a defense dividuals to work with state and local deficient dividuals and others in providing crisis counseling assistance in response to crises, disasters, and public disorder demergencies.

The ready reserve is considered to be a homeland security and emergency response team for purposes of Code section 29C.8 when acting as such a team upon the directive of the administrator or pursuant to a governor's disaster emergency proclamation. When this status applies, the ready reserve members are considered to be state employees and are afforded to tort liability protection as a state employee as well as disability, workers' compensation, and death benefits.

The bill describes the individuals who may serve as members of the ready reserve and functions associated with maintaining the existence of the ready reserve. The administrator may contract for performance of all or part of these functions.

Implementation of the ready reserve is subject to the availability of funding. The bill provides an appropriation from the general fund of the state of \$75,000 for initial implementation costs for FY 2007=2008.

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
