For purposes of this paragraph, the failure 9 to provide specific medical treatment shall not for that 10 reason alone be considered willful deprivation of health care 11 if the person can show that such treatment would conflict with 12 the tenets and practice of a recognized religious denomination 13 of which the person is an adherent or member. This exception 14 does not in any manner restrict the right of an interested 15 party to petition the court on behalf of the best interest of 16 the child or minor. 17 EXPLANATION 18 This bill relates to the criminal offense of child 19 endangerment.
1 1 1 1 1	The bill strikes a provision exempting a person from committing child endangerment based solely on the willful deprivation of health care if the person can prove the reason for withholding medical treatment is for religious purposes and such treatment would conflict with the tenets and practices of their religious denomination.
