Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 312A.1 DEFINITIONS. 1 1 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise 1 2 1 3 requires: 1 1. "Department" means the state department of 4 5 transportation. 1 2. "Fund", or "TIME=21 fund", means the transportation 1 б 7 investment moves the economy in the twenty=first century fund. 8 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 312A.2 TRANSPORTATION INVESTMENT 9 MOVES THE ECONOMY IN THE TWENTY=FIRST CENTURY (TIME=21) FUND. 1 1 1 1 10 A transportation investment moves the economy in the 1 11 twenty=first century fund is created in the state treasury 1 12 under the control of the department. The fund shall be known 1 13 and referred to as the TIME=21 fund. The fund shall consist 1 14 of any moneys appropriated by the general assembly and any 1 15 revenues credited by law to the TIME=21 fund. Moneys in the 1 16 fund are not subject to section 8.33. Notwithstanding section 1 17 12C.7, subsection 2, interest or earnings on moneys deposited 1 18 in the fund shall be credited to the fund. Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 312A.3 ALLOCATION AND USE OF FUNDS. 1 19 Moneys in the TIME=21 fund shall be credited and used as 1 20 1 21 follows: 1 22 1. Sixty percent for deposit in the primary road fund to 1 23 be used exclusively for highway maintenance and construction, 1 24 including purchase of right=of=way but not including project 1 25 planning and design. The following projects are eligible for 1 26 funding under this subsection: 1 27 a. Projects on highways in the commercial and industrial 28 highway network that are included in the department's 1 1 29 five=year plan, or in the long=range (2020) plan, for the 1 30 primary road system. Priority shall be given to projects in 1 31 areas of the state that have existing biodiesel, ethanol, or 1 32 other biorefinery plants. 1 33 b. Completion of projects on highways designated as access 1 34 Iowa highways pursuant to 2005 Iowa Acts, chapter 178, section 1 35 41. 2 1 с. Projects on interstate highways. 2. Twenty percent for deposit in the secondary road fund, 2 2 3 for apportionment according to the methodology adopted 4 pursuant to section 312.3C, to be used by counties for 2 2 2 5 construction and maintenance projects on secondary road 6 bridges and on highways in the farm=to=market road system. At 2 2 7 least ten percent of the moneys allocated to a county under 2 8 this subsection shall be used for bridge repair and 2 9 maintenance, with priority given to projects that aid and 2 10 support economic development and job creation. 2 11 3. Twenty percent for deposit in the street construction 2 12 fund of the cities, apportioned on the basis of population in 2 13 the manner provided in section 312.3, to be used to sustain 2 14 and improve the municipal street system. NEW SECTION. 307.31 PERIODIC REVIEW OF REVENUES 2 17 Sec. 5. 2 18 == EVALUATION OF ALTERNATIVE FUNDING SOURCES. 2 19 1. The department shall periodically review the current 2 20 revenue levels of the road use tax fund and the sufficiency of 2 21 those revenues for the projected construction and maintenance 2 22 needs of city, county, and state governments in the future. 2 23 The department shall submit a written report to the general 2 24 assembly regarding its findings by December 31 every five 2 25 years, beginning in 2011. The report may include 26 recommendations concerning funding levels needed to support 2 2 27 the future mobility and accessibility for users of Iowa's 2 28 public road system. 2 29 2. The department shall evaluate alternative funding 30 sources for road maintenance and construction and report to 31 the general assembly at least every five years on the 2 2 2 32 advantages and disadvantages and the viability of alternative 2 2 33 funding mechanisms. The department's evaluation of 34 alternative funding sources may be included in the report 2 35 submitted to the general assembly under subsection 1.  Sec. 6. TIME=21 REVENUE COMMITTEE.
 1. The legislative council shall establish a study
 3 committee for the 2007 legislative interim to address the 3 3 3 3 4 revenue needs of the TIME=21 fund created in this Act. The 3 5 membership of the committee shall consist of eight members of 3 6 the general assembly as follows: a. Four members of the senate, two appointed by the 3 7 3 8 majority leader of the senate and two appointed by the 3 9 minority leader of the senate. b. Four members of the house of representatives, two 3 10 3 11 appointed by the speaker of the house and two appointed by the 3 12 minority leader of the house. 3 13 The committee may consider the revenue options proposed 2. 3 14 in the 2006 report prepared by the state department of 3 15 transportation entitled "study of Iowa's current road use tax 3 16 funds (RUTF) and future road maintenance and construction 3 17 needs", as well as any other revenue options and related 3 18 issues. The committee shall report its findings and 3 19 recommendations, including a proposal for funding the TIME=21 3 20 fund, to the general assembly by January 1, 2008. 3 21 EXPLANATION 22 This bill creates a new transportation investment moves the 23 economy in the 21st century fund in the state treasury under 3 3 3 24 the control of the department of transportation. The fund is 3 25 to be known as the TIME=21 fund. The fund shall consist of 3 26 revenues appropriated by the general assembly or credited by 3 27 law to the fund. The bill allocates 60 percent of TIME=21 funds to the 3 28 3 29 primary road fund, 20 percent to the secondary road fund, and 3 30 20 percent to the street construction fund of the cities. 3 31 The bill specifies that funds allocated from the TIME=21 32 fund to the primary road fund shall be used for construction 33 and maintenance projects on interstate highways, "access Iowa 3 3 "access Iowa" 3 34 highways, and CIN highways that are included in the 3 35 transportation department's five=year plan or long=range 4 (2020) plan. Projects in areas with existing biodiesel, 2 ethanol, or other biorefinery plants have priority for 4 4 3 funding. Funds used for construction may be used for purchase 4 of right=of=way, but not for planning and design. The bill 5 establishes that projects in key corridors that are programmed 4 4 4 6 for construction in the 2007=2011 Iowa transportation improvement program have funding priority.
The bill directs that TIME=21 funds allocated to the 4 7 4 8 9 secondary road fund are to be used for construction and 4 4 10 maintenance of secondary road bridges and for construction and 4 11 maintenance of farm=to=market roads. At least 10 percent of 4 12 the moneys received by a county must be used for bridge repair 4 13 and maintenance with priority given to projects that aid and 4 14 support economic development and job creation. The bill 4 15 provides for allocation of TIME=21 funds to the street 4 16 construction fund of the cities on a population basis, to be 4 17 used to sustain and improve roads in the municipal street 4 18 system. 4 19 Provisions in the bill concerning the TIME=21 fund are 4 20 repealed June 30, 2028. 4 21 The bill requires the department of transportation to 22 continue to study the revenue levels of the road use tax fund 4 4 23 and report its findings and recommendations to the general 4 24 assembly every five years, beginning December 31, 2011. The 4 25 department is also required to evaluate alternative funding 4 26 sources for road maintenance and construction and report to 4 27 the general assembly at least every five years on the
