    Section 1. Section 455C.1, subsections 1 and 2, Code 2007,
    are amended by striking the subsections and inserting in lieu
    thereof the following:
    1. "Beverage" means a liquid intended for human
consumption and packaged in a beverage container for sale to
consumers. "Beverage" shall not include the following:
    a. A liquid typically ingested in very small quantities
and consumed for medicinal purposes only.
    b. A liquid designed to be consumed only as a nutritional
supplement.
    c. A product intended to be consumed, or packaged and sold
to consumers or institutions, in a frozen state.
    d. A powdered drink mix.
    e. A soup or broth, including seafood, meat, or vegetable
broth.
    f. Farm=produced apple cider which has not been heated,
pasteurized, or otherwise processed.
    gi A liquid which is any of the following:
    (i) A syrup.
    2) A concentrate.
    (3) Typically added as a minor flavoring ingredient in
food or drink, such as extracts, cooking additives, sauces, or
condiments.
    h. Milk or other primarily dairy=based drinks.
    2. "Beverage container" means a glass, plastic, or metal
container, sealed by the manufacturer, containing a beverage
of at least five and one=half fluid ounces or one hundred
sixty=two milliliters but not more than sixty=eight fluid
ounces or two liters in size.
    Sec. 2. Section 455C.2, subsection 2, Code 2007, is
amended to read as follows:
    2. In addition to the refund value provided in subsection
1 of this section, a dealer, or person operating a redemption
center who redeems empty beverage containers or a dealer agent
shall be reimbursed by the distributor required to accept the
empty beverage containers an amount which is one cent two
cents per container. A dealer, dealer agent, or person
operating a redemption center may compact empty metal beverage
containers with the approval of the distributor required to
accept the containers.
                                    EXPLANATION
    This bill relates to the control of beverage containers.
    The bill increases the types of containers which require a
refund value to include beverage containers such as bottled
water and juice drinks.
    The bill also increases the reimbursement amount, commonly
referred to as the handling fee, paid by distributors to
dealers from 1 cent per beverage container to 2 cents per
beverage container.
