2 20 EXPLANATION

This bill changes provisions relating to participation in

This bill changes provisions relating to participation in 22 varsity interscholastic athletic contests and athletic 23 competitions by students participating in open enrollment.
The bill replaces language that makes the pupil ineligible 25 to participate for the first 90 school days of enrollment in 26 the new district, with language that makes the period of 27 ineligibility the same as that adopted by rule, pursuant to 28 Code section 256.46, by the state board of education for 29 children who do not meet the residence requirements for 20 participation in extracurricular interscholastic contests or 21 competitions.
The bill also adds to the list of conditions under which 23 pupils may immediately participate in varsity athletics. The

33 pupils may immediately participate in varsity athletics. The 34 new conditions include a contemporaneous change in parental 35 residence, placement in foster care, adoption, participation 1 in a foreign exchange program, and participation in a

2 substance abuse or mental health treatment program.
