A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to requirements for certain interscholastic
- 2 athletic contests and competitions.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

H.F. 2261

- 1 Section 1. Section 256.46, Code 2009, is amended to read as 2 follows:
- 256.46 Rules for participation in extracurricular activities 4 by certain children.
- 5 The state board shall adopt rules that permit a child who
- 6 does not meet the residence requirements for participation
- 7 in extracurricular interscholastic contests or competitions
- 8 sponsored or administered by an organization as defined in
- 9 section 280.13 to participate in the contests or competitions
- 10 immediately if the child is duly enrolled in a school, is
- 11 otherwise eligible to participate, and meets one of the
- 12 following circumstances or a similar circumstance: the child
- 13 has been adopted; the child is placed under foster or shelter
- 14 care; the child is living with one of the child's parents
- 15 as a result of divorce, separation, death, or other change
- 16 in the child's parents' marital relationship, or pursuant to
- 17 other court-ordered decree or order of custody; the child is a
- 18 foreign exchange student, unless undue influence was exerted
- 19 to place the child for primarily athletic purposes; the child
- 20 has been placed in a juvenile correctional facility; the child
- 21 is a ward of the court or the state; the child is a participant
- 22 in a substance abuse or mental health program; or the child is
- 23 enrolled in an accredited nonpublic high school because the
- 24 child's district of residence has entered into a whole grade
- 25 sharing agreement for the pupil's grade with another district.
- 26 The rules shall permit a child who is otherwise eligible to
- 27 participate, but who does not meet one of the foregoing or
- 28 similar circumstances relating to residence requirements, to
- 29 participate at any level of competition other than the varsity
- 30 level. For purposes of this section and section sections
- 31 280.13 and 282.18, "varsity" means the highest level of
- 32 competition offered by one school or school district against
- 33 the highest level of competition offered by an opposing school
- 34 or school district.
- 35 Sec. 2. Section 280.13, Code 2009, is amended to read as

- 2 280.13 Requirements for interscholastic athletic contests and 3 competitions.
- A public school shall not participate in or allow
- 5 students representing a public school to participate in any
- 6 extracurricular interscholastic athletic contest or competition
- 7 which is sponsored or administered by an organization as
- 8 defined in this section, unless the organization is registered
- 9 with the department of education, files financial statements
- 10 with the department in the form and at the intervals prescribed
- 11 by the director of the department of education, and is in
- 12 compliance with rules which the state board of education adopts
- 13 for the proper administration, supervision, operation, adoption
- 14 of eligibility requirements, and scheduling of extracurricular
- 15 interscholastic athletic contests and competitions and the
- 16 organizations.
- 17 2. A student enrolled in a school district who failed
- 18 coursework for which credit is given at the end of a grading
- 19 period may be allowed by the school district to participate in
- 20 an athletic contest or competition other than at the varsity
- 21 level. For purposes of this subsection, "varsity" means the
- 22 same as defined in section 256.46.
- 23 3. For the purposes of this section "organization" means
- 24 a corporation, association, or organization which has as one
- 25 of its primary purposes the sponsoring or administration
- 26 of extracurricular interscholastic athletic contests or
- 27 competitions, but does not include an agency of this state,
- 28 a public or private school or school board, or an athletic
- 29 conference or other association whose interscholastic contests
- 30 or competitions do not include more than twenty-four schools.
- 31 EXPLANATION
- 32 This bill permits a school district to allow a student to
- 33 participate in athletic contests and competitions at all but
- 34 the varsity level if the student failed coursework for which
- 35 credit is given.

H.F. 2261

- 1 Administrative rules currently require all contestants
- 2 to pass all coursework for which credit is given and to be
- 3 making adequate progress toward graduation requirements at
- 4 the end of each grading period. A student who fails a course
- 5 is ineligible to dress for and compete in the next occurring
- 6 interscholastic athletic contests and competitions in which the
- 7 student is a contestant for 30 consecutive calendar days.
