A BILL FOR

1 An Act expanding the educational standards to include

- 2 age-appropriate comprehensive sexuality education
- 3 instruction at the elementary and secondary grade levels.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 256.11, subsections 2, 3, and 4, Code 2 Supplement 2009, are amended to read as follows: The kindergarten program shall include experiences 3 2. 4 designed to develop healthy emotional and social habits and 5 growth in the language arts and communication skills, as 6 well as a capacity for the completion of individual tasks, 7 and protect and increase physical well-being with attention 8 given to experiences relating to the development of life 9 skills, age-appropriate comprehensive sexuality education, and 10 age-appropriate human growth and development. A kindergarten 11 teacher shall be licensed to teach in kindergarten. An 12 accredited nonpublic school must meet the requirements of this 13 subsection only if the nonpublic school offers a kindergarten 14 program.

15 3. The following areas shall be taught in grades one through 16 six: English-language arts, social studies, mathematics, 17 science, health, <u>age-appropriate comprehensive sexuality</u> 18 <u>education</u>, age-appropriate and research-based human growth 19 and development, physical education, traffic safety, music, 20 and visual art. The health curriculum shall include the 21 characteristics of communicable diseases including acquired 22 immune deficiency syndrome. The state board as part of 23 accreditation standards shall adopt curriculum definitions for 24 implementing the elementary program.

4. The following shall be taught in grades seven and
eight: English-language arts; social studies; mathematics;
science; health; age-appropriate comprehensive sexuality
education; age-appropriate and research-based human growth
and development; family, consumer, career, and technology
education; physical education; music; and visual art.
The health curriculum shall include age-appropriate and
research-based information regarding the characteristics
of sexually transmitted diseases, including HPV and the
availability of a vaccine to prevent HPV, and acquired immune
deficiency syndrome. The state board as part of accreditation

1 standards shall adopt curriculum definitions for implementing 2 the program in grades seven and eight. However, this 3 subsection shall not apply to the teaching of family, consumer, 4 career, and technology education in nonpublic schools. For 5 purposes of this section, *`age-appropriate"*, *`HPV"*, and 6 *`research-based"* mean the same as defined in section 279.50. 7 Sec. 2. Section 256.11, subsection 5, paragraph j, Code 8 Supplement 2009, is amended to read as follows:

9 j. One unit of health education which shall include personal 10 health; food and nutrition; environmental health; safety and 11 survival skills; consumer health; family life; <u>age-appropriate</u> 12 <u>comprehensive sexuality education;</u> age-appropriate and 13 research-based human growth and development; substance abuse 14 and nonuse; emotional and social health; health resources; and 15 prevention and control of disease, including age-appropriate 16 and research-based information regarding sexually transmitted 17 diseases, including HPV and the availability of a vaccine to 18 prevent HPV, and acquired immune deficiency syndrome.

19 The state board as part of accreditation standards shall 20 adopt curriculum standards for implementing the program in 21 grades nine through twelve.

EXPLANATION

This bill expands the state educational standards by adding age-appropriate comprehensive sexuality education to the areas which must be taught in kindergarten through grade 12 by school districts and accredited nonpublic schools.
