## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to penalties for motor vehicle speeding
2 violations for driving more than fifteen miles per hour over
3 the speed limit.
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
declare a reasonable and safe speed limit, thereat which shall 2 be effective when appropriate signs giving notice thereof of 3 the speed limit are erected at such places of congestion or 4 other parts of the park roads, drives, or highways.
5 2. A violation of a speed limit under this section is
punishable as a simple misdemeanor as provided in section
321.285, subsection 7.

8 Sec. 3. Section 805.8A, subsection 5, paragraphs a and b, 9 Code Supplement 2009, are amended to read as follows:
a. For excessive speed violations in for speed not more than fifteen miles per hour in excess of the limit under section 321.236 , subsections 5 and ll, and sections 321.285 t and
(l) Ten dollars for speed not more than five miles per hour in excess of the limit.
(2) Twenty dollars for speed greater than five but not more than ten miles per hour in excess of the limit.
(3) Thirty dollars for speed greater than ten but not more than fifteen miles per hour in excess of the limit.
(4) Forty dollars for speed greater than fifteen but not fore than twenty miles per hour in excess of the limit.
(5) Forty dollarg plus two dollars for each mile per hour of excesive speed over twenty miles per hour ovex the limit.
b. Notwithstanding paragraph "a", for excessive speed violations in speed zones greater than fifty-five miles per hour, the scheduled fine shall be:
(l) Twenty dollars for speed not more than five miles per hour in excess of the limit.
(2) Forty dollars for speed greater than five but not more than ten miles per hour in excess of the limit.
(3) Sixty dollars for speed greater than ten but not more than fifteen miles per hour in excess of the limit.
(4) Eighty dollars for speed greater than fifteen but not more than twenty miles per hour in excess of the limit.
(5) Ninety dollars plus five dollars for each mile per hour
of exeessive speed ovex twenty miles pex hour over the limit. Sec. 4. Section 805.8A, subsection l4, paragraph i, Code Supplement 2009, is amended to read as follows:
i. Road work zone violations. The scheduled fine for any moving traffic violation under chapter 321 , as provided in this section, shall be doubled if the violation occurs within any road work zone, as defined in section 321.1 . However, notwithstanding subsection 5, the scheduled fine for violating the speed limit in a road work zone for speed not more than fifteen miles per hour over the limit is as follows:
(1) One hundred fifty dollars for speed not more than ten miles per hour over the posted speed limit.
(2) Three hundred dollars for speed greater than ten but not more than twenty fifteen miles per hour over the posted speed limit.
(3) Five hundred dollars for speed greater than twenty but not more than twenty-five miles pex hour over the posted speed łimit.
(4) One thousand dollars for speed greatex than twenty-five miles per hour over the posted speed limit.

EXPLANATION
This bill makes changes to penalties for motor vehicle speeding violations that involve speed of more than 15 miles per hour over the limit.

Under current law, all speeding violations are simple misdemeanors punishable as scheduled violations. Fines vary, but are higher for violations committed in speed zones greater than 55 miles per hour. The highest fines are for speeding violations committed in road work zones.

Under the bill, only speeding violations of up to 15 miles per hour over the limit, including violations in road work zones, are punishable as scheduled violations. Any violation for speed in excess of 15 miles per hour over the limit is a simple misdemeanor punishable by confinement for no more than 30 days or a fine of at least $\$ 65$ but not more than $\$ 625$ or by

$l$ both.
2 A person who drives at a speed greater than 15 but not more 3 than 25 miles per hour over the posted limit in a road work 4 zone is subject to a fine of $\$ 500$ in addition to the penalty 5 allowed for a simple misdemeanor. If the speed is more than 25 6 miles per hour over the posted limit in a road work zone, the 7 additional fine is $\$ 1,000$.
8 The penalties under the bill apply to violations of speed 9 limits on public roads, speed restrictions established by local
10 authorities for public parks and alleys, and speed limits
ll established for state parks and preserves.
