- 2 on a noninterstate highway by a livestock vehicle carrying
- 3 livestock, grain as defined in section 203.1, fertilizer as
- 4 defined in section 200.3, agricultural lime, or agricultural
- 5 chemicals with five axles, a minimum distance in feet between
- 6 the centers of the first and fifth axles of sixty-one feet, and
- 7 a minimum distance between the two rear axles of at least eight
- 8 feet and one inch is eighty-six thousand pounds.
- 9 EXPLANATION
- 10 This bill provides weight limitations for vehicles carrying
- 11 grain, fertilizer, agricultural lime, or agricultural chemicals
- 12 that currently apply to livestock and construction vehicles.
- 13 The new weight limitations apply to vehicles with six or seven
- 14 axles traveling on noninterstate highways.
- 15 In addition, current law allows a livestock vehicle with
- 16 five axles, a minimum distance of 61 feet between the centers
- 17 of the first and fifth axles, and a minimum distance of eight
- 18 feet, one inch between the two rear axles to carry a maximum
- 19 gross weight of 86,000 pounds. The bill extends the weight
- 20 allowance to similar vehicles carrying grain, fertilizer,
- 21 agricultural lime, or agricultural chemicals.
- 22 For purposes of the bill, "grain" means any grain for which
- 23 the United States department of agriculture has established
- 24 standards, including soybeans.
