A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to school business official training and
- 2 authorization.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 256.7, Code Supplement 2009, is amended
- 2 by adding the following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 30. Set standards and procedures for the
- 4 approval of training programs for individuals who seek an
- 5 authorization issued by the board of educational examiners for
- 6 employment as a school business official responsible for the
- 7 financial operations of a school district.
- 8 Sec. 2. Section 272.31, Code 2009, is amended to read as
- 9 follows:
- 10 272.31 Coaching authorization Authorizations coaching
- 11 school business officials.
- 12 1. The minimum requirements for the board to award a
- 13 coaching authorization to an applicant are:
- 14 a. Successful completion of one semester credit hour
- 15 or ten contact hours in a course relating to knowledge and
- 16 understanding of the structure and function of the human body
- 17 in relation to physical activity.
- 18 b. Successful completion of one semester credit hour
- 19 or ten contact hours in a course relating to knowledge and
- 20 understanding of human growth and development of children and
- 21 youth in relation to physical activity.
- 22 c. Successful completion of two semester credit hours or
- 23 twenty contact hours in a course relating to knowledge and
- 24 understanding of the prevention and care of athletic injuries
- 25 and medical and safety problems relating to physical activity.
- 26 d. Successful completion of one semester credit hour or ten
- 27 contact hours relating to knowledge and understanding of the
- 28 techniques and theory of coaching interscholastic athletics.
- 29 e. Attainment of at least eighteen years of age.
- 30 2. a. The board shall issue a school business official
- 31 authorization to an individual who successfully completes a
- 32 training program that meets the standards set by the state
- 33 board of education pursuant to section 256.7, subsection 30,
- 34 and who complies with rules adopted by the board pursuant to
- 35 subsection 3.

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b. A person hired on or after July 1, 2012, as a school 1 2 business official responsible for the financial operations of 3 a school district who is without prior experience as a school 4 business official in Iowa shall either hold the school business 5 official authorization issued pursuant to paragraph "a" of this 6 subsection or obtain the authorization within two years of the 7 start date of employment as a school business official. 8 c. An individual employed as a school business official 9 prior to July 1, 2012, who meets the requirements of the board, 10 other than the training program requirements of paragraph "a", 11 shall be issued, at no charge, an initial authorization by the 12 board, but shall meet renewal requirements for an authorization 13 within the time period specified by the board. 14 The board of educational examiners shall adopt rules 3. 15 under chapter 17A for coaching authorizations, including, but 16 not limited to, approval of courses, validity and expiration, 17 fees, and suspension and revocation of authorizations. 4. The state board of education shall work with institutions 18 19 of higher education, private colleges and universities, 20 community colleges, and area education agencies, and 21 professional organizations to ensure that the courses and 22 programs required under subsection 1 for authorization under 23 this section are offered throughout the state at convenient 24 times and at a reasonable cost. Sec. 3. SCHOOL BUSINESS OFFICIAL TRAINING PROGRAM AND 25 26 AUTHORIZATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE. The department of education, 27 in consultation with the board of educational examiners, shall 28 convene an advisory committee to determine the standards and 29 procedures, content, and processes of training programs for 30 individuals who seek an authorization issued by the board of 31 educational examiners for employment as a school business 32 official responsible for the financial operations of a school The advisory committee shall be comprised of 34 representatives of the Iowa association of school business

35 officials, individuals holding financial leadership roles

1 in large, medium, and small school districts, and a public 2 member of the school budget review committee. The advisory 3 committee shall review other states' professional organizations 4 and programs regarding authorization of school business 5 officials, determine the best practices for school district 6 business management training programs, and identify and 7 recommend the knowledge and skills necessary to obtain a school 8 business official authorization from the board of educational 9 examiners. The advisory committee shall submit its findings 10 and recommendations in a report to the state board of education 11 and the board of educational examiners by December 31, 2010. 12 **EXPLANATION** 13 This bill directs the state board of education to set 14 standards and procedures for the approval of training programs 15 for individuals who seek an authorization issued by the board 16 of educational examiners for employment as school business 17 officials responsible for the financial operations of school 18 districts, requires the board of educational examiners to 19 adopt rules for the issuance of a school business official 20 authorization to an individual who successfully completes a 21 program that meets the state board's standards and who complies 22 with the educational examiners board's rules, and directs the 23 department of education, in consultation with the board of 24 educational examiners, to convene a school business official 25 training program and authorization advisory committee. A person hired on or after July 1, 2012, as a school business 26 27 official who is without prior experience as a school business 28 official in Iowa must hold the school business official 29 authorization issued by the board pursuant to the bill or 30 obtain the authorization within two years of the start date 31 of employment as a school business official. An individual 32 employed as a school business official prior to July 1, 2012, 33 who meets the board's requirements, other than the training 34 program requirements, must be issued at no charge an initial 35 authorization by the board, but must meet the board's renewal

- 1 requirements by the time specified by the board.
- 2 The advisory committee is charged with determining the
- 3 standards and procedures, content, and processes of training
- 4 programs for individuals who seek an authorization issued by
- 5 the board of educational examiners. The advisory committee is
- 6 comprised of representatives of the Iowa association of school
- 7 business officials, individuals holding financial leadership
- 8 roles in large, medium, and small school districts, and a
- 9 public member of the school budget review committee. The
- 10 advisory committee must submit a report to the state board of
- 11 education and the board of educational examiners by December
- 12 31, 2010.
- 13 The bill also requires the state board of education to work
- 14 with higher education institutions to ensure that the training
- 15 programs are offered throughout the state at convenient times
- 16 and reasonable costs.
