A person shall not use or consume alcoholic liquor, wine, or beer upon the public streets or highways. A person shall not use or consume alcoholic liquor, wine, or beer in any public place except premises covered by a liquor control license or permit. In addition, a person who is an owner, manager, or otherwise operates a place of business shall not allow any person to use or consume alcoholic liquor, wine, or beer on the premises of the business, unless the place of business is covered by a liquor control license or permit. A person shall not possess or consume alcoholic liquors, wine, or beer on public school property or while attending a public or private school=related function. A person shall not be intoxicated or simulate intoxication in a public place. A person violating this subsection is guilty of a simple misdemeanor. EXPLANATION
1 1 1 1 1 1 1 1 1 1	This bill provides that a person shall not use or consume wine or beer in any public place not covered by a liquor control license or permit. Current law provides only that a person shall not use or consume alcoholic liquor in any public place. The bill also provides that a person who owns, a manages, or operates a place of business shall not allow any person to use or consume alcoholic liquor, wine, or beer on the premises unless the place of business is covered by a liquor control license or permit. A person who violates the provisions of this bill commits a simple misdemeanor. A simple misdemeanor is punishable by confinement for no more than 30 days or a fine of at least \$65 but not more than \$625 or by both.
