A BILL FOR

1 An Act directing the regents institutions to review and prepare a report regarding the state's vulnerability to climatic change. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- Section 1. CLIMATIC CHANGE REVIEW AND REPORT.
 1. Institutions under the control of the state board of 3 regents shall identify and review the state's vulnerability to 4 climatic change and the impact of such change upon the state's 5 environment, resources, and citizens. The vulnerability 6 review shall include but not be limited to consideration of 7 the following:
- a. The impact of climatic change on the state's water 9 resources and water management policies and practices.
- 1 10 b. The likelihood of an increase in the frequency or 11 severity of weather=related events due to climatic change.
- The extent to which adverse health effects might result 1 13 from climatic change.
 - d. The impact of climatic change on energy resources.
- Whether and to what extent invasive species could enter e. 1 16 or develop within the state as a consequence of climatic 1 17 change.
- f. The extent to which climatic change could adversely 1 19 impact natural resources management strategies.
- 2. In addition to reviewing the state's vulnerability to 21 climatic change as specified in subsection 1, the institutions 22 shall also review the range of possible economic and other 1 23 damages arising from unmitigated climatic change, and the 1 24 range of possible costs relating either to efforts to mitigate 25 climatic change or to adapt to unmitigated changes.
 26 3. Based upon such review, the institutions shall develop
- 1 27 recommendations regarding adaptation measures to minimize the 28 anticipated future costs of climatic change, and shall submit 29 a report containing the recommendations to the general 1 30 assembly by December 31, 2009.
 - The institutions may hold no more than three meetings 4. 32 in conducting the review and preparing the report pursuant to 33 this section, and may utilize the department of management to 34 facilitate the meetings.

EXPLANATION

This bill directs institutions under the control of the 2 state board of regents to conduct a review and prepare a 3 report regarding this state's vulnerability to climatic 4 change.

The bill provides that the review of vulnerability to 6 climatic change shall include but not be limited to the impact 7 upon state water resources and water management policies and 8 practices, weather=related events, adverse health effects, 9 energy resources, invasive species entrance or development, 10 and natural resources management strategies. The bill 11 provides that the institutions shall also review the range of 2 12 possible economic and other damages arising from unmitigated 2 13 climatic change, and the range of possible costs relating 14 either to efforts to mitigate climatic change or to adapt to 2 15 unmitigated changes.

2 16 Based on this review, the bill requires the institutions to 2 17 develop recommendations regarding adaptation measures to

- 2 18 minimize the anticipated future costs of climatic change, and 2 19 to submit a report containing the recommendations to the 2 20 general assembly by December 31, 2009. The bill limits the 2 21 number of meetings the institutions shall be authorized to 2 22 conduct to three, and authorizes the institutions to utilize 2 23 the department of management to facilitate the meetings. 2 24 LSB 1895HV 83 2 25 rn/nh/24
