A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act governing residential electrical installations, and
- 2 establishing a fee.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 103.1, Code Supplement 2009, is amended
- 2 by adding the following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 12A. "Residential electrical contractor"
- 4 means a person affiliated with an electrical contracting firm
- 5 or business who is, or who employs a person who is, licensed by
- 6 the board as a residential master electrician and who is also
- 7 registered with the state of Iowa as a contractor pursuant to
- 8 chapter 91C.
- 9 Sec. 2. Section 103.1, subsection 13, Code Supplement 2009,
- 10 is amended to read as follows:
- 11 13. "Residential electrician" means a person having the
- 12 necessary qualifications, training, experience, and technical
- 13 knowledge to perform a residential installation and to
- 14 supervise apprentice electricians.
- 15 Sec. 3. Section 103.1, subsection 15, Code Supplement 2009,
- 16 is amended to read as follows:
- 17 15. "Residential master electrician" means a person having
- 18 the necessary qualifications, training, experience, and
- 19 technical knowledge to properly plan, lay out, and supervise
- 20 the performance of a residential installation and who is
- 21 licensed by the board.
- Sec. 4. Section 103.6, subsection 1, paragraph b,
- 23 subparagraph (2), Code 2009, is amended to read as follows:
- 24 (2) Is an electrical contractor or a residential electrical
- 25 contractor and fails or refuses to provide and keep in force a
- 26 public liability insurance policy and surety bond as required
- 27 by the board.
- 28 Sec. 5. Section 103.8, Code 2009, is amended to read as
- 29 follows:
- 30 103.8 Activities where license required exceptions.
- 31 1. No person, except a person licensed as an electrical
- 32 contractor or a residential electrical contractor, shall engage
- 33 in the business of providing new electrical installations or
- 34 any other electrical services regulated under this chapter.
- 35 2. Except as provided in sections 103.13 and 103.14,

- 1 no person shall, for another, plan, lay out, or supervise
- 2 the installation of wiring, apparatus, or equipment for
- 3 electrical light, heat, power, and other purposes unless the
- 4 person is licensed by the board as an electrical contractor,
- 5 a residential electrical contractor, a class A master
- 6 electrician, or a class B master electrician, or a residential
- 7 master electrician.
- 8 Sec. 6. Section 103.11, Code 2009, is amended to read as
- 9 follows:
- 10 103.11 Wiring or installing supervising apprentices —
- 11 license required qualifications.
- Except as provided in section 103.13, no a person shall
- 13 not, for another, wire for or install electrical wiring,
- 14 apparatus, or equipment, or supervise an apprentice electrician
- 15 or unclassified person, unless the person is licensed by the
- 16 board as an electrical contractor or residential electrical
- 17 contractor, a class A master electrician, or a class B master
- 18 electrician, or is licensed as a class A journeyman electrician
- 19 or a class B journeyman electrician, or a residential master
- 20 electrician or a residential electrician, and is employed
- 21 by an electrical contractor or a residential electrical
- 22 contractor, or is working under the supervision of a class

- 26 to read as follows:
- 27 103.12A Residential electrician and residential master

- 29 1. The board may by rule provide for the issuance of a
- 30 residential electrician license, and may by rule provide for
- 31 the issuance of a residential master electrician license, and a
- 32 residential electrical contractor license.
- 33 a. A residential electrician license or residential
- 34 master electrician license provided for in subsection 1, if
- 35 established by the board, shall be issued to applicants who

1 meet qualifications determined by the board, and shall be valid

- 2 for the performance of residential installations, subject to
- 3 limitations or restrictions established by the board.
- 4 b. A person who, on or after July 1, 2009, holds a special
- 5 electrician license authorizing residential electrical
- 6 installation, granted pursuant to section 103.13, shall be
- 7 eligible for conversion of that special license to either
- 8 a residential electrician license or a residential master
- 9 electrician license, if established by the board, in accordance
- 10 with requirements and procedures established by the board.
- 11 2. A person licensed by the board as a class A journeyman
- 12 electrician or a class B journeyman electrician, or as a class
- 13 A master electrician or a class B master electrician, shall not
- 14 be required to hold a residential electrician or residential
- 15 master electrician license to perform any type of residential
- 16 installation authorized for a person licensed pursuant to this
- 17 section.
- 18 3. A person licensed by the board as an electrical
- 19 contractor shall not be required to hold a residential
- 20 electrical contractor license to perform any type of
- 21 residential installation authorized for a person licensed
- 22 pursuant to this section.
- 23 3. 4. The board may reject an application for licensure
- 24 under this section from an applicant who would be subject
- 25 to suspension, revocation, or reprimand pursuant to section
- 26 103.35.
- 27 Sec. 8. Section 103.13, subsection 2, Code Supplement 2009,
- 28 is amended to read as follows:
- 29 2. Notwithstanding section 103.8, a person who holds a
- 30 special electrician license is not required to obtain an
- 31 electrical contractor license or a residential electrical
- 32 contractor license to engage in the business of providing new
- 33 electrical installations or any other electrical services if
- 34 such installations or services fall within the limited class of
- 35 special electrical work for which the person holds the special

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- 1 electrician license.
- 2 Sec. 9. Section 103.15, subsection 1, Code Supplement 2009,
- 3 is amended to read as follows:
- 4 l. A person shall be licensed by the board and pay a
- 5 licensing fee to work as an apprentice electrician while
- 6 participating in an apprenticeship training program registered
- 7 by the bureau of apprenticeship and training of the United
- 8 States department of labor in accordance with the standards
- 9 established by that department. An apprenticeship shall
- 10 be limited to six years from the date of licensure, unless
- ll extended by the board upon a finding that a hardship existed
- 12 which prevented completion of the apprenticeship program. Such
- 13 licensure shall entitle the licensee to act as an apprentice
- 14 to an electrical contractor, a class A master electrician, a
- 15 class B master electrician, a class A journeyman electrician,
- 16 or a class B journeyman electrician, a residential electrical
- 17 contractor, a residential master electrician, or a residential
- 18 electrician as provided in subsection 3.
- 19 Sec. 10. Section 103.19, subsection 1, paragraph a,
- 20 subparagraph (1), Code Supplement 2009, is amended to read as
- 21 follows:
- 22 (1) Electrical contractor or residential electrical
- 23 contractor, one hundred twenty-five dollars.
- 24 Sec. 11. Section 103.20, subsection 2, Code 2009, is amended
- 25 to read as follows:
- 26 2. Upon the death of an electrical contractor, a class
- 27 A master electrician, or a class B master electrician, a
- 28 residential electrical contractor, or a residential master
- 29 electrician, the board may permit a representative to carry on
- 30 the business of the decedent for a period not to exceed six
- 31 months for the purpose of completing work under contract to
- 32 comply with this chapter. Such representative shall furnish
- 33 all public liability and property damage insurance required by
- 34 the board.

- 31 EXPLANATION
- 32 This bill adds a new licensure classification and modifies
- 33 requirements applicable to existing classifications with regard
- 34 to residential electrical installations authorized in Code
- 35 chapter 103.
 - 1 The bill establishes the new licensure classification of

- 2 residential electrical contractor, defined to mean a person
- 3 affiliated with an electrical contracting firm or business who
- 4 is, or who employs a person who is, licensed by the board as
- 5 a residential master electrician and who is also registered
- 6 with the state of Iowa as a contractor pursuant to Code
- 7 chapter 91C. The bill modifies the definition of a residential
- 8 electrician to authorize the supervision of apprentice
- 9 electricians; and clarifies with respect to the definitions of
- 10 both this definition and the definition of a residential master
- ll electrician that such persons are licensed by the board, in
- 12 order to be consistent with the other licensure classification
- 13 definitions established in the Code chapter.
- 14 The bill makes changes to existing residential installation
- 15 provisions and other provisions in the Code chapter
- 16 consistent with the new licensure classification, and
- 17 adds each residential licensure classification to the
- 18 list of classifications authorized to supervise apprentice
- 19 electricians.
- 20 The bill prescribes a fee for the issuance and renewal of
- 21 a residential electrical contractor license. The bill also
- 22 applies the residential electrical installation licensure
- 23 classifications, as appropriate, to provisions regarding
- 24 continuation of business upon death, notification of appeal
- 25 from a condemnation or disconnection order, and applicable
- 26 civil penalties.
