A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act providing an exemption for electrical installations
- 2 on farms from licensing and inspections, and including
- 3 effective date provisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 103.1A Term "commercial" applied.
- Whenever the term "commercial" is used in this chapter,
- 3 it shall refer to a use, installation, structure, or premises
- 4 associated with a place of business where goods, wares,
- 5 services, or merchandise is stored or offered for sale on a
- 6 wholesale or retail basis.
- 7 2. The term "commercial" refers to a residence only if the
- 8 residence is also used as place of business as provided in
- 9 subsection 1.
- 10 3. The term "commercial" does not refer to a use,
- 11 installation, structure, or premises associated with any of the
- 12 following:
- 13 *a.* A farm.
- 14 b. An industrial installation.
- 15 Sec. 2. Section 103.22, subsection 7, Code Supplement 2009,
- 16 is amended to read as follows:
- 7. Prohibit an owner of property from performing work on the
- 18 owner's principal residence, if such residence is an existing
- 19 dwelling rather than new construction and is not an apartment
- 20 that is attached to any other apartment or building, as those
- 21 terms are defined in section 499B.2, and is not larger than a
- 22 single-family dwelling, or farm property, excluding commercial
- 23 or industrial installations or installations in public use
- 24 buildings or facilities, or require such owner to be licensed
- 25 under this chapter. In order to qualify for inapplicability
- 26 pursuant to this subsection, a residence shall qualify for the
- 27 homestead tax exemption.
- Sec. 3. Section 103.22, Code Supplement 2009, is amended by
- 29 adding the following new subsection:
- 30 NEW SUBSECTION. 15. Apply to a person performing any
- 31 installation on a farm, if the person is associated with the
- 32 farm as a holder of a legal or equitable interest, a relative
- 33 or employee of the holder, or an operator or manager of the
- 34 farm. The provisions of this chapter do not require such
- 35 person to be licensed. In addition, a permit is not required

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- 1 for an installation on a farm, and an installation on a farm is
- 2 not required to be inspected. In order for a farm building to
- 3 qualify under this subsection, it cannot regularly be open to
- 4 the public as a place of business for the retail sale of goods,
- 5 wares, services, or merchandise.
- 6 Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. This Act, being deemed of
- 7 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.
- 8 EXPLANATION
- 9 This bill amends Code chapter 103 which provides for the
- 10 regulation of electricians and electrical contractors. The
- 11 bill provides that when the chapter uses the term "commercial"
- 12 it refers to a place of business where goods, wares, services,
- 13 or merchandise is stored or offered for sale on a wholesale
- 14 or retail basis. It refers to a residence only when used as
- 15 a business, and it does not refer to a farm, or an industrial
- 16 installation.
- Generally, the Code chapter requires that a person must be
- 18 licensed as an electrical contractor to provide for electrical
- 19 installations. The bill rewrites a provision which exempts
- 20 installation on farms. The bill provides that the Code
- 21 chapter's requirements do not apply to a person performing any
- 22 installation by a farmer, employee or relative of the farmer,
- 23 or farm operator or manager. An installation on a farm does
- 24 not require a permit and does not have to be inspected.
