## A BILL FOR

1 An Act requiring disclosure of certain amphetamine and
2 methamphetamine information in real estate transactions and
3 making penalties applicable.
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section l. Section 558A.4, subsection l, Code 2009, is amended to read as follows:

1. The disclosure statement shall include information relating to the condition and important characteristics of the property and structures located on the property, including significant defects in the structural integrity of the structure, as provided in rules which shall be adopted by the real estate commission pursuant to section 543B.9. The rules may require the disclosure to include information relating to the property's zoning classification; the condition of plumbing, heating, or electrical systems; or the presence of pests. The rules shall require the disclosure to include information relating to the previous manufacture of amphetamine, its salts, isomers, or salts of isomers, or methamphetamine, its salts, isomers, or salts of isomers, on the property in violation of section 124.401 , subsection 1. EXPLANATION
This bill requires the disclosure statement for real estate transactions under Code section 558A. 4 to include information relating to the previous manufacture of amphetamine, its salts, isomers, or salts of isomers, or methamphetamine, its salts, isomers, or salts of isomers, on the property in violation of Code section 124.401.

Code section 714.8 provides that a contract seller who intentionally provides inaccurate information with regard to any matter required to be disclosed under Code section 558A. 4 is guilty of a fraudulent practice. The amount of money or value of property or services involved determines the applicable criminal penalty, ranging from a simple misdemeanor to a class "C" felony.
