SENATE FILE 2259 BY HARTSUCH

## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to a fall prevention pilot project, including
- 2 insurance coverage for polypharmacy evaluations, and
- 3 providing an appropriation.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **514C.26 Polypharmacy evaluation**
- 2 coverage.
- 3 1. Notwithstanding the uniformity of treatment requirements
- 4 of section 514C.6, a contract, policy, or plan providing for
- 5 third-party payment or prepayment of health or medical expenses
- 6 shall provide coverage for polypharmacy evaluation. For the
- 7 purposes of this section, polypharmacy evaluation must include
- 8 a medication review, the issuance of a medication review
- 9 report, and patient notification.
- 10 a. A medication review shall meet all of the following
- 11 requirements:
- 12 (1) Is a comprehensive review of a patient's medication list
- 13 by a licensed pharmacist for the purpose of identifying drugs
- 14 and drug interactions which might put the patient at risk for
- 15 falls and other serious medical consequences.
- 16 (2) Is requested by a licensed health care provider who is
- 17 authorized to prescribe medications.
- 18 (3) The patient is seventy years of age or older.
- 19 (4) The patient is prescribed more than five medications.
- 20 b. A medication review report shall meet all of the
- 21 following requirements:
- 22 (1) Is a report issued by the reviewing pharmacist to the
- 23 requesting physician and the patient summarizing the findings
- 24 of the review.
- 25 (2) Contains the list of medications reviewed, the
- 26 patient's name and other pertinent identification information,
- 27 identifies any drug interactions, identifies any dosing
- 28 abnormalities, and identifies drugs identified as potentially
- 29 dangerous to the geriatric population.
- 30 c. A patient notification is the notification provided to
- 31 the patient in addition to the medication review report and
- 32 shall include all of the following:
- 33 (1) An explanation of the medication review.
- 34 (2) A brief self-evaluation questionnaire used to identify
- 35 individuals at high risk for falls or other serious medical

- 1 consequences.
- 2 (3) Instructions to the patient regarding the role of
- 3 polypharmacy in causing falls or other serious medical
- 4 consequences.
- 5 (4) Locations where the patient may be screened for
- 6 orthostatic hypotension.
- 7 (5) Instructions to the patient to seek medical attention
- 8 if the patient has symptoms that put the patient at risk for
- 9 falls including but not limited to light-headedness, visual or
- 10 balance disturbances, or generalized weakness.
- 11 2. The provisions of this section shall apply to all of the
- 12 following classes of third-party payment provider contracts,
- 13 policies, or plans delivered, issued for delivery, continued,
- 14 or renewed in this state on or after July 1, 2010:
- 15 a. Individual or group accident and sickness insurance
- 16 providing coverage on an expense-incurred basis.
- 17 b. An individual or group hospital or medical service
- 18 contract issued pursuant to chapter 509, 514, or 514A.
- 19 c. An individual or group health maintenance organization
- 20 contract regulated under chapter 514B.
- 21 d. An individual or group Medicare supplemental policy,
- 22 unless coverage pursuant to such policy is preempted by federal
- 23 law.
- 24 e. A plan established pursuant to chapter 509A for public
- 25 employees.
- 26 3. This section shall not apply to accident-only, specified
- 27 disease, short-term hospital or medical, hospital confinement
- 28 indemnity, credit, dental, vision, long-term care, basic
- 29 hospital, and medical-surgical expense coverage as defined
- 30 by the commissioner, disability income insurance coverage,
- 31 coverage issued as a supplement to liability insurance,
- 32 workers' compensation or similar insurance, or automobile
- 33 medical payment insurance.
- 34 4. The commissioner of insurance shall adopt rules pursuant
- 35 to chapter 17A as necessary to administer this section. In

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- 1 addition to any other rules adopted, the commissioner of
- 2 insurance shall collaborate with the department of public
- 3 health to adopt rules to require health care providers who
- 4 request polypharmacy evaluations to report aggregated patient
- 5 information to the department of public health to enable the
- 6 department to assess the costs and benefits of polypharmacy
- 7 evaluations.
- 8 5. For the purposes of this section, "polypharmacy"
- 9 means the prescribing of multiple medications to a patient
- 10 by licensed health care providers authorized to prescribe
- 11 medications and the use of such medications by the patient.
- 12 Sec. 2. FALL PREVENTION PILOT PROJECT.
- 13 1. Purposes. The department of public health shall
- 14 establish a fall prevention pilot project. The project shall
- 15 be principally directed to older individuals, their families
- 16 and caregivers, and health care professionals. The purposes of
- 17 the pilot project are to develop effective strategies to reduce
- 18 the risk of falls among older individuals and to reduce the
- 19 injuries and costs associated with such falls.
- 20 2. Goals. To the extent practicable the pilot project shall
- 21 achieve the following goals:
- 22 a. Increase the awareness among older individuals,
- 23 physicians, pharmacists, health care professionals,
- 24 community-based health organizations, and others, of fall risk
- 25 factors and actions that can reduce falls.
- 26 b. Implement and evaluate strategies and interventions that
- 27 are proven effective in reducing falls among older individuals
- 28 in order to tailor such strategies and interventions to
- 29 specific populations of older individuals in this state.
- 30 c. Improve the identification, diagnosis, treatment, and
- 31 rehabilitation of older individuals who have a high risk of
- 32 falling and who are fall victims.
- 33 d. Improve data collection and analysis to identify risk
- 34 factors for falls and factors that reduce the likelihood of
- 35 falls.

- 1 e. Assess the risk of falls occurring in various settings.
- 2 f. Identify barriers to the adoption of proven interventions
- 3 with respect to the prevention of falls among older
- 4 individuals.
- 5 g. Improve collaboration among the medical community
- 6 including physicians, health care providers, and pharmacists to
- 7 reduce the rate of falls among older individuals.
- 8 h. Improve coordination of existing resources to address
- 9 fall prevention among older individuals.
- 10 3. Elements of pilot project. The pilot project shall
- ll include all of the following:
- 12 a. The creation of a multidisciplinary task force to
- 13 coordinate community intervention.
- 14 b. Development of a plan for community outreach and
- 15 education relating to all of the following:
- 16 (1) Physical conditioning and balance.
- 17 (2) Polypharmacy and its role in causing falls.
- 18 (3) Techniques for fall prevention and fall recovery.
- 19 (4) Screening for orthostatic hypotension.
- 20 c. Development of a plan to demonstrate injury prevention
- 21 and medical cost savings from intervention, including the
- 22 polypharmacy evaluation specified in section 514C.26.
- 23 4. Implementation. The department of public health shall
- 24 select one of the area agencies on aging as designated pursuant
- 25 to section 231.32 to implement the pilot project for an initial
- 26 period of three years.
- 27 5. Reports. The department of public health shall provide
- 28 annual progress reports regarding the pilot project, and
- 29 shall provide a final report which includes outcomes of the
- 30 project and recommendations for continuation, expansion,
- 31 or modification of the pilot project. The department's
- 32 reports shall include, to the extent available, information
- 33 collected and analyzed pursuant to section 514C.26 regarding
- 34 the costs and benefits attributable to the use of polypharmacy
- 35 evaluations by licensed health care providers authorized to

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1 prescribe medications.
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- 2 6. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context 3 otherwise requires:
- 4 a. "Older individual" means older individual as defined in 5 section 231.4.
- 6 b. "Orthostatic hypotension" means a drop in blood pressure
- 7 during rapid changes in body positioning including but not
- 8 limited to moving from a sitting to a standing position.
- 9 c. "Polypharmacy" means the prescribing of multiple
- 10 medications to a patient by a health care provider authorized
- 11 to prescribe medications and the use of such medications by the
- 12 patient.
- 13 Sec. 3. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from the
- 14 general fund of the state to the department of public health
- 15 for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 2010, and ending
- 16 June 30, 2013, the following amount or so much thereof as is
- 17 necessary to be used for the purpose designated:
- 18 For implementation through an area agency on aging of the
- 19 fall prevention pilot project as specified in this Act:
- 20 ..... \$ 100,000
- 21 EXPLANATION
- 22 This bill relates to fall prevention among older
- 23 individuals. The bill directs the department of public
- 24 health (DPH) to establish a fall prevention pilot project for
- 25 an initial period of three years, principally directed to
- 26 older individuals, their families and caregivers, and health
- 27 care professionals. The purposes of the pilot project are
- 28 to develop effective strategies to reduce the risk of falls
- 29 among older individuals and to reduce the injuries and costs
- 30 associated with such falls. The bill provides goals for the
- 31 pilot project, elements of the pilot project, provides for
- 32 implementation of the pilot project by an area agency on aging
- 33 selected by DPH, and requires annual progress reports and a
- 34 final report by DPH regarding the pilot project.
- 35 The bill requires that a contract, policy, or plan providing

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- 1 for third-party payment or prepayment of health or medical
- 2 expenses shall provide coverage for polypharmacy evaluation.
- 3 A polypharmacy evaluation must include a medication review,
- 4 the issuance of a medication review report, and patient
- 5 notification, and the bill specifies the requirements for
- 6 each of these elements. The requirement applies to specified
- 7 classes of third-party payment provider contracts, policies,
- 8 or plans delivered, issued for delivery, continued, or renewed
- 9 in this state on or after July 1, 2010. The bill directs the
- 10 commissioner of insurance to adopt rules pursuant to chapter
- 11 17A as necessary to administer the bill. In addition to these
- 12 rules the commissioner of insurance is directed to collaborate
- 13 with the department of public health to adopt rules to require
- 14 health care providers who request polypharmacy evaluations to
- 15 report aggregated patient information to the department of
- 16 public health to enable the department to assess the costs
- 17 and benefits of polypharmacy evaluations. The bill defines
- 18 "polypharmacy" as the prescribing of multiple medications
- 19 to a patient by a licensed health care provider authorized
- 20 to prescribe medications and the use by the patient of such
- 21 medications.
- The bill appropriates \$100,000 from the general fund of the

23 state to DPH for the three-year pilot program.
