A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act establishing an Iowa communications network advisory
- 2 committee.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. IOWA COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK ADVISORY
- 2 COMMITTEE.
- An Iowa communications network advisory committee is
- 4 established to study and make recommendations to the governor
- 5 and the general assembly regarding the current and future
- 6 operation of the Iowa communications network. Aspects of the
- 7 study shall include the following:
- 8 a. Current usage level and capacity of the network.
- 9 b. Current and anticipated future operating and maintenance 10 expenses.
- 11 c. Options for expanding network access to public and
- 12 private users.
- d. Options for forming public and private partnerships with
- 14 regard to ownership and operation of the network.
- 15 e. Leasing arrangements.
- 16 f. Current and anticipated future network revenue.
- 17 g. Current status of the network from a technological
- 18 standpoint and future plans and modifications to the network in
- 19 response to anticipated technological advancements.
- 20 2. a. The committee shall be comprised of the following
- 21 voting members who shall be appointed by the governor:
- 22 (1) One member representing the Iowa state association of
- 23 counties.
- 24 (2) One member representing the Iowa league of cities.
- 25 (3) One member representing the department of
- 26 administrative services.
- 27 (4) One member representing the office of the attorney
- 28 general.
- 29 (5) One member representing the Iowa association of school
- 30 boards.
- 31 (6) One member representing the for-profit
- 32 telecommunications industry.
- 33 (7) One member representing a municipal utility providing
- 34 telecommunications services.
- 35 (8) One member representing the cable television industry.

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- 1 (9) Three members representing the general public.
- 2 b. The committee shall be comprised of the following
- 3 nonvoting, ex officio members:
- 4 (1) One representative to be appointed by the speaker of the
- 5 house of representatives, one representative to be appointed
- 6 by the minority leader of the house of representatives, one
- 7 senator to be appointed by the president of the senate after
- 8 consultation with the majority leader of the senate, and one
- 9 senator to be appointed by the minority leader of the senate.
- 10 (2) One member representing the governor's office,
- 11 appointed by the governor.
- 12 3. a. Sections 69.16 and 69.16A shall apply to the public
- 13 members of the board.
- b. Public members may be eligible to receive compensation
- 15 as provided in section 7E.6. Members shall be reimbursed for
- 16 actual and necessary expenses incurred in performance of the
- 17 members' duties.
- 18 c. The committee shall elect a chair and a vice chair from
- 19 among the voting members of the board, by majority vote. A
- 20 majority of the members of the board shall constitute a quorum.
- 21 d. Staffing assistance shall be provided by the Iowa
- 22 telecommunications and technology commission.
- 23 4. The committee shall submit a report summarizing the
- 24 results of the study and making recommendations to the governor
- 25 and the general assembly by December 31, 2010.
- 26 EXPLANATION
- 27 This bill establishes an Iowa communications network
- 28 advisory committee to study and make recommendations to the
- 29 governor and the general assembly regarding the current and
- 30 future operation of the network.
- 31 The bill states that aspects of the study shall include
- 32 examining the current usage level and capacity of the
- 33 network, current and anticipated future operating and
- 34 maintenance expenses, options for expanding the network to
- 35 public and private users and for forming public and private

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- 1 partnerships regarding network ownership and operation, leasing
- 2 arrangements, current and anticipated future revenue, and
- 3 technology considerations.
- 4 The bill provides for eleven voting members and five
- 5 nonvoting members. The voting members and one nonvoting member
- 6 representing the governor's office shall be appointed by the
- 7 governor. The four nonvoting legislative members shall be
- 8 appointed by their respective legislative leadership.
- 9 The bill directs the committee to submit a report
- 10 summarizing the results of the study and making recommendations
- 11 to the governor and the general assembly by December 31, 2010.
