## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the manufacture and sale of micro-distilled
- 2 spirits and establishing a related permit fee.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

## S.F. 2339

- 1 Section 1. Section 123.32, subsection 1, Code Supplement 2 2009, is amended to read as follows:
- Filing of application. An application for a class "A",
- 4 class "B", class "C", or class "E" liquor control license, for
- 5 a class "A" micro-distilled spirits permit, for a retail beer
- 6 permit as provided in sections 123.128 and 123.129, or for a
- 7 class "B", class "B" native, or class "C" native retail wine
- 8 permit as provided in section 123.178, 123.178A, or 123.178B,
- 9 accompanied by the necessary fee and bond, if required, shall
- 10 be filed with the appropriate city council if the premises for
- 11 which the license or permit is sought are located within the
- 12 corporate limits of a city, or with the board of supervisors
- 13 if the premises for which the license or permit is sought are
- 14 located outside the corporate limits of a city. An application
- 15 for a class "D" liquor control license and for a class "A"
- 16 beer or class "A" wine permit, accompanied by the necessary
- 17 fee and bond, if required, shall be filed with the division,
- 18 which shall proceed in the same manner as in the case of an
- 19 application approved by local authorities.
- 20 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **123.43A Micro-distilled spirits** 21 permit.
- 22 l. For the purposes of this section, unless the context
- 23 other requires:
- 24 a. "Micro-distillery" means a business with an operational
- 25 still which, combining all production facilities of the
- 26 business, produces and manufactures less than fifty thousand
- 27 proof gallons of distilled spirits on an annual basis.
- 28 b. "Micro-distilled spirits" means distilled spirits
- 29 fermented, distilled, or, for a period of two years, barrel
- 30 matured on the licensed premises of the micro-distillery when
- 31 fermented, distilled, or matured. "Micro-distilled spirits"
- 32 also includes blended or mixed spirits comprised solely of
- 33 spirits fermented, distilled, or, for a period of two years,
- 34 barrel matured at a micro-distillery.
- 35 2. Subject to rules of the division, a micro-distillery

- 1 holding a class "A" micro-distilled spirits permit pursuant
- 2 to this section may sell or offer for sale micro-distilled
- 3 spirits. As provided in this section, sales may be made at
- 4 retail for off-premises consumption when sold on the premises
- 5 of the micro-distillery that manufactures micro-distilled
- 6 spirits. All sales shall be made through the state's wholesale
- 7 distribution system.
- A micro-distillery shall not sell more than one and
- 9 one-half liters per person per day, of micro-distilled spirits
- 10 on the premises of the micro-distillery. In addition, a
- 11 micro-distillery shall not directly ship micro-distilled
- 12 spirits for sale at retail. The micro-distillery shall
- 13 maintain records of individual purchases of micro-distilled
- 14 spirits at the micro-distillery for three years.
- 15 4. A micro-distillery shall not sell micro-distilled
- 16 spirits other than as permitted in this chapter and shall not
- 17 allow micro-distilled spirits sold to be consumed upon the
- 18 premises of the micro-distillery. However, as a part of a
- 19 micro-distillery tour, micro-distilled spirits of no more than
- 20 two ounces per person per day may be sampled on the premises
- 21 where fermented, distilled, or matured, when no charge is made
- 22 for the sampling.
- 23 5. A class "A" micro-distilled spirits permit for a
- 24 micro-distillery shall be issued and renewed annually upon
- 25 payment of a fee of five hundred dollars.
- 26 6. The sale of micro-distilled spirits to the division for
- 27 wholesale disposition and sale by the division shall be subject
- 28 to the requirements of this chapter regarding such disposition
- 29 and sale.
- 30 7. The division shall issue no more than three permits under
- 31 this section to a person. In addition, a micro-distillery
- 32 issued a permit under this section shall file with the
- 33 division all documents filed by the micro-distillery with the
- 34 alcohol and tobacco tax and trade bureau of the United States
- 35 department of the treasury, including all production, storage,

1 and processing reports.

- 8. Micro-distilled spirits purchased at a micro-distillery
- 3 shall not be consumed within three hundred feet of a
- 4 micro-distillery nor on any property owned, operated, or
- 5 controlled by a micro-distillery.
- 6 EXPLANATION
- 7 This bill relates to the manufacture and sale of
- 8 micro-distilled spirits by a micro-distillery, and provides for
- 9 the obtaining of a class "A" micro-distilled spirits permit.
- 10 The bill defines a micro-distillery as a distillery that
- 11 manufactures less than 50,000 proof gallons of micro-distilled
- 12 spirits annually. Micro-distilled spirits are defined as
- 13 distilled spirits fermented, distilled, or, for a period of two
- 14 years, barrel matured at the micro-distillery.
- The bill provides that a micro-distillery may sell
- 16 or offer for sale micro-distilled spirits which may be
- 17 sold for off-premises consumption through sales on the
- 18 micro-distillery's premises. The bill provides that all sales
- 19 be made through the state's wholesale distribution system.
- 20 The bill provides that a micro-distillery shall not sell
- 21 more than 1.5 liters per person per day and shall maintain
- 22 records of sales to individuals for three years. The bill
- 23 provides that a micro-distillery shall not directly ship
- 24 micro-distilled spirits for sale at retail. The bill does
- 25 not allow micro-distilled spirits sold to be consumed within
- 26 300 feet of the micro-distillery but does allow, as part of a
- 27 tour, no more than 2 ounces of micro-distilled spirits to be
- 28 sampled on the premises where made, when no charge is made for
- 29 the sampling.
- 30 The bill provides for a new permit applicable to
- 31 micro-distilled spirits, requiring a fee of \$500 for initial
- 32 issuance and annual renewal. The bill limits the number
- 33 of permits issued to a person to three and requires a
- 34 micro-distillery issued a permit to file with the alcoholic
- 35 beverages division documents the micro-distillery files with
