2 22 Sec. 2. Section 708.3A, subsection 5, Code 2009, is 2 23 amended by adding the following new paragraph:

NEW PARAGRAPH. f. "Transit employee" means a person who is employed by a firm, corporation, company, or municipality and who operates a bus, trolley car, or other vehicle 2 27 primarily upon the streets and highways over well-defined 28 routes for the transportation of passengers. EXPLANATION

This bill enhances the criminal penalty for an assault on a 2 31 transit employee.

The bill amends Code section 708.3A by adding a "transit 33 employee" to the list of occupations covered under Code 34 section 708.3A. The bill effectively increases the penalty 35 for most assaults knowingly committed against a transit employee.

Under the bill, if a person assaults a transit employee 3 with the intent to inflict serious injury or displays a 4 dangerous weapon in connection with the assault, the person 5 commits a class "D" felony. If a person assaults a transit 6 employee and causes bodily injury or mental illness, the 7 person commits an aggravated misdemeanor. If the person 8 commits a simple assault on a transit employee, the person 9 commits a serious misdemeanor.

3 10 The bill defines a transit employee as a person who is 3 11 employed by a firm, corporation, company, or municipality and 3 12 who operates a bus, trolley car, or other vehicle primarily 3 13 upon the streets and highways over well=defined routes for the 14 transportation of passengers.
