A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to local emergency management by modifying 2 provisions of the statewide mutual aid compact and by making 3 changes to certain funding provisions.

1 24 this agreement, the term "participating governments" means
1 25 <u>emergency management commissions</u>, counties, cities, townships, 1 26 and other political subdivisions of the state which have <u>not</u>,
1 27 through ordinance or resolution of the governing body, acted
1 28 to adopt withdraw from this compact. The inclusion of
  29 emergency management commissions in the term "participating 30 governments" shall not convey taxing authority or other legal
1 31 authority to emergency management commissions that is not 1 32 otherwise granted in this chapter.

         Sec. 7. Section 445.5, subsection 1, paragraph e, Code
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2 15 2009, is amended to read as follows: The complete name of all taxing authorities receiving a e. 2 17 tax distribution, the amount of the distribution, and the 2 18 percentage distribution for each named authority, listed from 2 19 the highest to the lowest distribution percentage. The taxing 20 authority, amount of distribution, and percentage of distribution for a levy approved pursuant to section 29C.17, subsection 2, shall also be included.

EXPLANATION

2 24 This bill relates to local emergency management by making 2 25 changes to the statewide mutual aid compact and emergency 2 26 management commissions.

The bill includes emergency management commissions as 28 participating governments that are part of the statewide 2 29 mutual aid compact. However, such inclusion does not convey 2 30 taxing authority or other legal authority not otherwise 31 granted to emergency management commissions.
32 The bill defines the term "authorized representative of a

33 participating government which is the entity that may request 34 assistance under the compact.

Currently, the compact is an "opt=in" compact where a participating government passes an ordinance or resolution 2 adopting the compact. The bill changes the compact to an 3 "opt=out" compact where the compact automatically applies to 4 all emergency management commissions, counties, cities, and 5 other political subdivisions in the state and a participating 6 government may opt=out of participation through the adoption 7 of an ordinance or resolution.

The bill requires the county emergency management agency's 9 approved budget to be funded by one or a combination of 10 certain funding options. The bill amends one of the options 11 relating to a countywide special property tax levy. The bil The bill 12 provides that the emergency management commission shall submit 3 13 the levy amount to the county board of supervisors for 3 14 approval. The bill provides that a property tax levy for 3 15 emergency management must be itemized on the property tax 3 16 statement.

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
