Except during the times specified in section 321.384, subsection 1, a person operating a motor vehicle on a highway shall not use the uppermost distribution of light, or composite beam specified in section 321.409, subsection 1, an auxiliary lamp, spot lamp, or any other lamp on the front of the vehicle other than a lamp projecting the lowermost distribution of light, or composite beam, specified in section 321.409, subsection 2, or a directional signal device specified in section 321.317. 2. A person convicted of a violation of this section is guilty of a simple misdemeanor punishable as a scheduled violation under section 805.8A, subsection 3, paragraph "d". 5. Sec. 2. Section 805.8A, subsection 3, paragraph d, Code 2009, is amended to read as follows: d. For violations of sections 321.383, 321.384, 321.385, 321.398, 321.402, 321.403, 321.404, 321.409, 321.415, 321.416, 321.419, 321.420, 321.421, 321.423, and 321.433, the scheduled fine is twenty dollars. EXPLANATION This bill limits the use of certain front=mounted lights on motor vehicles to those times of day when the use of head lamps is required. Currently, a driver must use head lamps during the period from sunset to sunrise and at other times during the period from sunset to sunrise and at other times during the period from sunset to sunrise and at other times under fair weather conditions. 2. This bill, the use of high-beam headlamps, auxiliary lamps, spot lamps, or any lamp of greater intensity than the vehicle's low-beam headlamps is prohibited from sunrise to sunset under fair weather conditions. A violation is a simple misdemeanor punishable by a scheduled fine of \$20. This is the same penalty that LBB 1470SS 83
