27 Current law provides that a person who is convicted of or 1 28 who receives a deferred judgment for an offense classified as 1 29 a felony shall submit a DNA sample for DNA profiling. The bill may include a state mandate as defined in Code section 25B.3. The bill makes inapplicable Code section 30

1 32 25B.2, subsection 3, which would relieve a political 1 33 subdivision from complying with a state mandate if funding for 1 34 the cost of the state mandate is not provided or specified.
1 35 Therefore, political subdivisions are required to comply with

1 any state mandate included in the bill.
