A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to vehicular accident reporting requirements
- 2 by increasing the minimum amount of property damage
- 3 necessitating a written report.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 321.266, subsection 2, Code 2009, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 2. The driver of a vehicle involved in an accident resulting
- 4 in injury to or death of any person, or total property damage
- 5 to an apparent extent of one thousand five hundred dollars
- 6 or more shall, within seventy-two hours after the accident,
- 7 forward a written report of the accident to the department.
- 8 However, such report is not required when the accident is
- 9 investigated by a law enforcement agency.
- 10 Sec. 2. Section 321G.10, Code 2009, is amended to read as
- 11 follows:
- 12 321G.10 Accident reports.
- 13 If a snowmobile is involved in an accident resulting in
- 14 injury or death to anyone or property damage amounting to one
- 15 thousand dollars or more, either the operator or someone acting
- 16 for the operator shall immediately notify the county sheriff or
- 17 another law enforcement agency in the state. If the accident
- 18 occurred on public land or ice under the jurisdiction of the
- 19 commission, the operator shall file with the commission a
- 20 report of the accident, within seventy-two hours, containing
- 21 information as the commission may require. All For all other
- 22 accidents shall be reported as required under resulting in
- 23 injury or death or property damage amounting to one thousand
- 24 dollars or more, the operator shall forward a written report
- 25 to the department of transportation within seventy-two hours,
- 26 unless the accident is investigated by a law enforcement agency
- 27 as provided in section 321.266.
- 28 Sec. 3. Section 321I.11, Code 2009, is amended to read as
- 29 follows:
- 30 321I.11 Accident reports.
- 31 If an all-terrain vehicle is involved in an accident
- 32 resulting in injury or death to anyone or property damage
- 33 amounting to one thousand dollars or more, either the operator
- 34 or someone acting for the operator shall immediately notify
- 35 the county sheriff or another law enforcement agency in

- 1 the state. If the accident occurred on public land or ice
- 2 under the jurisdiction of the commission, the operator shall
- 3 file with the commission a report of the accident, within
- 4 seventy-two hours, containing information as the commission
- 5 may require. All For all other accidents shall be reported
- 6 as required resulting in injury or death or property damage
- 7 amounting to one thousand dollars or more, the operator shall
- 8 forward a written report to the department of transportation
- 9 within seventy-two hours, unless the accident is investigated
- 10 by a law enforcement agency as provided in section 321.266.
- 11 EXPLANATION
- 12 Under current law, if a vehicular accident results in
- 13 property damage to an apparent extent of \$1,000 or more, the
- 14 driver of a vehicle involved in the accident is required to
- 15 file a written report of the accident with the department
- 16 of transportation within 72 hours, unless the accident is
- 17 investigated by a law enforcement officer. This bill increases
- 18 the amount of property damage triggering the need for an
- 19 accident report to \$1,500.
- 20 Current requirements for the reporting of snowmobile and
- 21 all-terrain vehicle accidents, which contain a threshold damage
- 22 amount of \$1,000, are not changed under the bill. However, the
- 23 bill contains conforming amendments to Code sections 321G.10
- 24 and 321I.11 in order to preserve the current accident reporting
- 25 requirements of those sections.
