A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to and making appropriations to the department
- of cultural affairs, the department of economic development,
- 3 certain board of regents institutions, the department of
- 4 workforce development, and the public employment relations
- 5 board, and related matters.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1	Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS. There is
2	appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
3	department of cultural affairs for the fiscal year beginning
4	July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, the following amounts,
5	or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
6	designated:
7	1. ADMINISTRATION
8	For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
9	purposes:
10	\$ 212,069
11	The department of cultural affairs shall coordinate
12	activities with the tourism office of the department of
13	economic development to promote attendance at the state
14	historical building and at this state's historic sites.
15	2. COMMUNITY CULTURAL GRANTS
16	For planning and programming for the community cultural
17	grants program established under section 303.3:
18	\$ 273,500
19	3. HISTORICAL DIVISION
20	For the support of the historical division:
21	\$ 3,195,107
22	From the moneys appropriated under this subsection,
23	the department shall use \$45,000 for purposes of planning
24	commemoration activities for the sesquicentennial anniversary
25	of the civil war and Iowa's participation in the civil war.
26	Such activities may include activities in Iowa, activities
27	through partnerships with other states, and activities on a
28	national level.
29	4. HISTORIC SITES
30	For the administration and support of historic sites:

9	Sec. 2. GOALS AND ACCOUNTABILITY - ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.
10	1. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, the goals for
11	the department of economic development shall be to expand and
12	stimulate the state economy, increase the wealth of Iowans, and
13	increase the population of the state.
14	2. To achieve the goals in subsection 1, the department
15	of economic development shall do all of the following for the
16	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010:
17	a. Concentrate its efforts on programs and activities that
18	result in commercially viable products and services.
19	b. Adopt practices and services consistent with free
20	market, private sector philosophies.
21	c. Ensure economic growth and development throughout the
22	state.
23	Sec. 3. DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. There is
24	appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
25	department of economic development for the fiscal year
26	beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, the following
27	amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
28	purposes designated:
29	1. ADMINISTRATION DIVISION
30	a. For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous
31	purposes, and programs; for transfer to the Iowa state
32	commission grant program:
33	\$ 1,976,046
34	b. The department shall work with businesses and
35	communities to continually improve the economic development

1 climate along with the economic well-being and quality of life

- 2 for Iowans. The administration division shall coordinate with
- 3 other state agencies to ensure that all state departments are
- 4 attentive to the needs of an entrepreneurial culture.
- 5 c. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
- 6 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
- 7 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
- 8 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
- 9 close of the succeeding fiscal year.
- 10 2. BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT DIVISION
- 11 a. For business development operations and programs, the
- 12 film office, international trade, export assistance, workforce
- 13 recruitment, and the partner state program; for transfer to the
- 14 strategic investment fund; for transfer to the grow Iowa values
- 15 fund; and for the support of the business development division:
- 16 \$ 5,346,530
- 17 b. The department shall establish a strong and aggressive
- 18 marketing image to showcase Iowa's workforce, existing
- 19 industry, and potential. A priority shall be placed on
- 20 recruiting new businesses, business expansion, and retaining
- 21 existing Iowa businesses. Emphasis shall also be placed on
- 22 entrepreneurial development through helping to secure capital
- 23 for entrepreneurs, and developing networks and a business
- 24 climate conducive to entrepreneurs and small business.
- 25 c. A business creating jobs with economic development
- 26 assistance through moneys appropriated in this subsection shall
- 27 be subject to contract provisions stating that new and retained
- 28 jobs shall be filled by individuals who are citizens of the
- 29 United States who reside within the United States or any person
- 30 authorized to work in the United States pursuant to federal
- 31 law, including legal resident aliens in the United States. Any
- 32 vendor who receives such public moneys shall adhere to such
- 33 contract provisions and provide periodic assurances as the
- 34 state shall require that the jobs are filled solely by citizens
- 35 of the United States who reside within the United States or

1 any person authorized to work in the United States pursuant

- 2 to federal law, including legal resident aliens in the United
- 3 States. A business that receives financial assistance from
- 4 the department from moneys appropriated in this bill shall
- 5 only employ individuals legally authorized to work in this
- 6 state. In addition to all other applicable penalties provided
- 7 by current law, all or a portion of the assistance received
- 8 by a business which is found to knowingly employ individuals
- 9 not legally authorized to work in this state is subject to
- 10 recapture by the department.
- 11 d. From the moneys appropriated in this subsection, the
- 12 department may provide financial assistance in the form of a
- 13 grant to a community economic development entity for conducting
- 14 a local workforce recruitment effort designed to recruit former
- 15 citizens of the state and former students at colleges and
- 16 universities in the state to meet the needs of local employers.
- e. From the moneys appropriated in this subsection, the
- 18 department may provide financial assistance to early-stage
- 19 industry companies being established by women entrepreneurs.
- 20 f. From the moneys appropriated in this subsection, the
- 21 department may provide financial assistance in the form of
- 22 grants, loans, or forgivable loans for advanced research and
- 23 commercialization projects involving value-added agriculture,
- 24 advanced technology, or biotechnology.
- 25 g. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
- 26 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
- 27 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
- 28 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
- 29 close of the succeeding fiscal year.
- 30 3. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DIVISION
- 31 a. For support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,
- 32 community economic development programs, tourism operations,
- 33 community assistance, plans for Iowa green corps and summer
- 34 youth programs, the mainstreet and rural mainstreet programs,
- 35 the school-to-career program, the community development block

1	grant, and housing and shelter-related programs:
2	\$ 5,063,917
3	b. The department shall encourage development of
4	communities and quality of life to foster economic growth. The
5	department shall prepare communities for future growth and
6	development through development, expansion, and modernization
7	of infrastructure.
8	c. The department shall develop public-private partnerships
9	with Iowa businesses in the tourism industry, Iowa tour groups,
10	Iowa tourism organizations, and political subdivisions in this
11	state to assist in the development of advertising efforts.
12	The department shall, to the fullest extent possible, develop
13	cooperative efforts for advertising with contributions from
14	other sources.
15	d. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
16	this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
17	close of the fiscal year shall not revert to any fund but shall
18	remain available for expenditure for the designated purposes
19	during the succeeding fiscal year.
20	4. For allocating moneys for the world food prize and
21	notwithstanding section 15.368, subsection 1:
22	 \$ 750,000
23	5. For use as matching funds for the United States
24	department of housing and urban development's main street
25	challenge grants for historic building preservation:
26	\$ 165,775
27	6. For allocation to the Iowa commission on volunteer
28	service for the Iowa's promise and mentoring partnership
29	program:
30	\$ 112,500
31	Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this
3 2	subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close
33	of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available
34	for expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of
35	the succeeding fiscal year.

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- 1 Sec. 4. INSURANCE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. From the moneys
- 2 collected by the division of insurance in excess of the
- 3 anticipated gross revenues under section 505.7, subsection 3,
- 4 during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, \$100,000 shall
- 5 be transferred to the department of economic development for
- 6 insurance economic development and international insurance
- 7 economic development.
- 8 Sec. 5. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT LOAN FUND. Notwithstanding
- 9 section 15E.120, subsection 5, there is appropriated from the
- 10 Iowa community development loan fund all the moneys available
- 11 during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June
- 12 30, 2011, to the department of economic development for the
- 13 community development program to be used by the department for
- 14 the purposes of the program.
- 15 Sec. 6. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT FUND. There is appropriated
- 16 from the workforce development fund account created in section
- 17 15.342A to the workforce development fund created in section
- 18 15.343 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, and ending
- 19 June 30, 2011, the following amount, for the purposes of the
- 20 workforce development fund:
- 21 \$ 4,000,000
- 22 Sec. 7. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATION. From moneys
- 23 appropriated or transferred to or receipts credited to the
- 24 workforce development fund created in section 15.343, up to
- 25 \$400,000 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, and ending
- 26 June 30, 2011, are appropriated to the department of economic
- 27 development for the administration of workforce development
- 28 activities including salaries, support, maintenance, and
- 29 miscellaneous purposes.
- 30 Sec. 8. JOB TRAINING FUND. Notwithstanding section 15.251,
- 31 all moneys in the job training fund on July 1, 2010, and any
- 32 moneys appropriated or credited to the fund during the fiscal
- 33 year beginning July 1, 2010, shall be transferred to the
- 34 workforce development fund established pursuant to section
- 35 15.343.

- 1 Sec. 9. IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY.
- There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
- 3 to Iowa state university of science and technology for the
- 4 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011,
- 5 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to
- 6 be used for small business development centers, the science
- 7 and technology research park, and the institute for physical
- 8 research and technology:
- 9 \$ 2,475,983
- 10 2. Of the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, Iowa state
- ll university of science and technology shall allocate at least
- 12 \$878,611 for purposes of funding small business development
- 13 centers. Iowa state university of science and technology may
- 14 allocate moneys appropriated in subsection 1 to the various
- 15 small business development centers in any manner necessary to
- 16 achieve the purposes of this subsection.
- 17 3. Iowa state university of science and technology shall do
- 18 all of the following:
- 19 a. Direct expenditures for research toward projects that
- 20 will provide economic stimulus for Iowa.
- 21 b. Provide emphasis to providing services to Iowa-based
- 22 companies.
- 23 4. It is the intent of the general assembly that the
- 24 industrial incentive program focus on Iowa industrial
- 25 sectors and seek contributions and in-kind donations from
- 26 businesses, industrial foundations, and trade associations,
- 27 and that moneys for the institute for physical research and
- 28 technology industrial incentive program shall be allocated
- 29 only for projects which are matched by private sector moneys
- 30 for directed contract research or for nondirected research.
- 31 The match required of small businesses as defined in section
- 32 15.102, subsection 6, for directed contract research or for
- 33 nondirected research shall be \$1 for each \$3 of state funds.
- 34 The match required for other businesses for directed contract
- 35 research or for nondirected research shall be \$1 for each \$1 of

1 state funds. The match required of industrial foundations or

- 2 trade associations shall be \$1 for each \$1 of state funds.
- 3 Iowa state university of science and technology shall
- 4 report annually to the joint appropriations subcommittee on
- 5 economic development and the legislative services agency the
- 6 total amount of private contributions, the proportion of
- 7 contributions from small businesses and other businesses, and
- 8 the proportion for directed contract research and nondirected
- 9 research of benefit to Iowa businesses and industrial sectors.
- 10 5. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
- 11 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
- 12 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
- 13 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
- 14 close of the succeeding fiscal year.
- 15 Sec. 10. UNIVERSITY OF IOWA.
- 16 l. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
- 17 to the state university of Iowa for the fiscal year beginning
- 18 July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, the following amount,
- 19 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the state
- 20 university of Iowa research park and for the advanced drug
- 21 development program at the Oakdale research park, including
- 22 salaries, support, maintenance, equipment, and miscellaneous
- 23 purposes:
- 24 \$ 222,372
- 25 2. The state university of Iowa shall do all of the
- 26 following:
- 27 a. Direct expenditures for research toward projects that
- 28 will provide economic stimulus for Iowa.
- 29 b. Provide emphasis to providing services to Iowa-based
- 30 companies.
- 3. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
- 32 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
- 33 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
- 34 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
- 35 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

- 1 Sec. 11. UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN IOWA.
- There is appropriated from the general fund of the
- 3 state to the university of northern Iowa for the fiscal year
- 4 beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, the following
- 5 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
- 6 metal casting institute, the MyEntreNet internet application,
- 7 and the institute of decision making, including salaries,
- 8 support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:
- 9 \$ 485,674
- 10 2. The university of northern Iowa shall do all of the
- 11 following:
- 12 a. Direct expenditures for research toward projects that
- 13 will provide economic stimulus for Iowa.
- 14 b. Provide emphasis to providing services to Iowa-based
- 15 companies.
- 3. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
- 17 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
- 18 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
- 19 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
- 20 close of the succeeding fiscal year.
- 21 Sec. 12. DEPARTMENT OF WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT. There
- 22 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
- 23 department of workforce development for the fiscal year
- 24 beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, the following
- 25 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes
- 26 designated:
- 27 1. DIVISION OF LABOR SERVICES
- 28 For the division of labor services, including salaries,
- 29 support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:
- 30 \$ 3,495,440
- 31 From the contractor registration fees, the division of labor
- 32 services shall reimburse the department of inspections and
- 33 appeals for all costs associated with hearings under chapter
- 34 91C, relating to contractor registration.
- 35 2. DIVISION OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION

1	For the division of workers' compensation, including
2	salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:
3	\$ 2,595,768
4	The division of workers' compensation shall continue
5	charging a \$65 filing fee for workers' compensation cases.
6	The filing fee shall be paid by the petitioner of a claim.
7	However, the fee can be taxed as a cost and paid by the
8	losing party, except in cases where it would impose an undue
9	hardship or be unjust under the circumstances. The moneys
10	generated by the filing fee allowed under this subsection are
11	appropriated to the department of workforce development to be
12	used for purposes of administering the division of workers'
13	compensation.
14	3. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT OPERATIONS
15	For the operation of field offices, the workforce
16	development board, and new Iowans centers:
17	\$ 11,645,474
18	Of the moneys appropriated in this subsection, the
19	department shall allocate \$11,412,564 for the operation of
20	field offices. The department shall not reduce the number of
21	field offices below the number of field offices being operated
22	as of January 1, 2009.
23	The department of workforce development shall make every
24	effort to maintain new Iowans centers that offer one-stop
25	services to deal with the multiple issues related to
26	immigration and employment. The centers shall be designed to
27	support workers, businesses, and communities with information,
28	referrals, job placement assistance, translation, language
29	training, and resettlement, as well as technical and legal
30	assistance on such issues as forms and documentation. Through
31	the coordination of local, state, and federal service
32	providers, and through the development of partnerships with
33	public, private, and nonprofit entities with established
34	records of international service, these centers shall seek to
35	provide a seamless service delivery system for new Iowans.

1	4. OFFENDER REENTRY PROGRAM
2	For the development and administration of an offender
3	reentry program to provide offenders with employment skills:
4	\$ 322,261
5	The department shall partner with the department of
6	corrections to provide staff within the correctional facilities
7	to improve offenders' abilities to find and retain productive
8	employment.
9	5. PILOT PROJECT
10	For purposes of administration of a security employee pilot
11	<pre>project training program:</pre>

13	6. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
14	this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
15	close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
16	available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
17	close of the succeeding fiscal year.
18	Sec. 13. ACCOUNTABILITY — AUDIT. The auditor of state
19	shall annually conduct an audit of the department of workforce
20	development and shall report the findings of such annual
21	audit, including the accountability of programs of the
22	department, to the chairpersons and ranking members of the
23	joint appropriations subcommittee on economic development. The
24	department shall pay for the costs associated with the audit.
25	Sec. 14. EMPLOYMENT SECURITY CONTINGENCY FUND. There is
26	appropriated from the special employment security contingency
27	fund to the department of workforce development for the fiscal
28	year beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, the
29	following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the
30	purposes designated:
31	For the division of workers' compensation, salaries,
32	support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:
33	\$ 471,000
34	Any remaining additional penalty and interest revenue is
35	appropriated to and may be allocated and used to accomplish the

- 1 mission of the department.
- 2 Sec. 15. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION RESERVE FUND.
- Notwithstanding section 96.9, subsection 8, paragraph "e",
- 4 there is appropriated from interest earned on the unemployment
- 5 compensation reserve fund to the department of workforce
- 6 development for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, and
- 7 ending June 30, 2011, the following amount or so much thereof
- 8 as is necessary, for the purposes designated:
- 9 For the operation of field offices:
- 10 \$ 6,500,000
- 11 Sec. 16. PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS BOARD. There is
- 12 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the public
- 13 employment relations board for the fiscal year beginning July
- 14 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, the following amount, or so
- 15 much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes designated:
- 16 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
- 17 purposes:
- 18 \$ 1,051,903
- 19 Of the moneys appropriated in this section, the board
- 20 shall allocate \$15,000 for maintaining a website that allows
- 21 searchable access to a database of collective bargaining
- 22 information.
- 23 Sec. 17. VALUE-ADDED AGRICULTURE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE. For
- 24 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, the office of renewable
- 25 fuels and coproducts may apply to the department of economic
- 26 development for moneys in the grow Iowa values fund for deposit
- 27 in the renewable fuels and coproducts fund created in section
- 28 159A.7.
- 29 Sec. 18. IOWA FINANCE AUTHORITY AUDIT. The auditor of state
- 30 is requested to review the audit of the Iowa finance authority
- 31 performed by the auditor hired by the authority.
- 32 Sec. 19. APPLICATION FOR DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
- 33 MONEYS. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, any
- 34 entity that was specifically identified in 2001 Iowa Acts,
- 35 chapter 188, to receive funding from the department of economic

- 1 development, excluding any entity identified to receive a
- 2 direct appropriation beginning July 1, 2010, may apply to the
- 3 department for assistance through the appropriate program. The
- 4 department shall provide application criteria necessary to
- 5 implement this section.
- 6 Sec. 20. SHELTER ASSISTANCE FUND. In providing moneys from
- 7 the shelter assistance fund to homeless shelter programs in
- 8 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30,
- 9 2011, the department of economic development shall explore the
- 10 potential of allocating moneys to homeless shelter programs
- ll based in part on their ability to move their clients toward
- 12 self-sufficiency.
- 13 Sec. 21. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION PROGRAM. Notwithstanding
- 14 section 96.9, subsection 4, paragraph "a", moneys credited to
- 15 the state by the secretary of the treasury of the United
- 16 States pursuant to section 903 of the Social Security
- 17 Act are appropriated to the department of workforce
- 18 development and shall be used by the department for the
- 19 administration of the unemployment compensation program only.
- 20 This appropriation shall not apply to any fiscal year
- 21 beginning after December 31, 2009.
- 22 EXPLANATION
- 23 This bill makes appropriations and transfers from the
- 24 general fund of the state and other funds to the department
- 25 of cultural affairs, the department of economic development,
- 26 the university of Iowa, the university of northern Iowa, Iowa
- 27 state university, the department of workforce development, and
- 28 the public employment relations board for the 2010-2011 fiscal
- 29 year.
- 30 The bill provides that the goals for the department of
- 31 economic development shall be to expand and stimulate the
- 32 state economy, increase the wealth of Iowans, and increase the
- 33 population of the state.
- 34 The bill transfers moneys collected by the division of
- 35 insurance in excess of the anticipated gross revenues to the

- 1 department of economic development for purposes of insurance
- 2 economic development and international insurance economic
- 3 development.
- 4 The bill appropriates moneys from the Iowa community
- 5 development loan fund to the department of economic development
- 6 for purposes of the community development program.
- 7 The bill appropriates moneys from the workforce development
- 8 fund account to the workforce development fund.
- 9 The bill provides that moneys appropriated or transferred
- 10 to or receipts credited to the workforce development fund are
- 11 appropriated to the department of economic development for
- 12 administration of workforce development activities.
- 13 The bill provides that all moneys in the job training fund on
- 14 July 1, 2010, and any moneys appropriated or credited to the
- 15 fund during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, shall be
- 16 transferred to the workforce development fund.
- 17 The bill requires the auditor of state to conduct an audit of
- 18 the department of workforce development.
- 19 The bill appropriates moneys from the special employment
- 20 security contingency fund to the department of workforce
- 21 development for the division of workers' compensation.
- The bill appropriates interest earned on the unemployment
- 23 compensation reserve fund to the department of workforce
- 24 development for the operation of field offices.
- 25 The bill allows the office of renewable fuels and coproducts
- 26 to apply to the department of economic development for moneys
- 27 in the grow Iowa values fund for deposit in the renewable fuels
- 28 and coproducts fund.
- 29 The bill requests the auditor of state to review the audit
- 30 of the Iowa finance authority performed by the auditor hired
- 31 by the authority.
- The bill provides that, for the fiscal year beginning July
- 33 1, 2010, any entity that was specifically identified in 2001
- 34 Iowa Acts, chapter 188, to receive funding from the department
- 35 of economic development, excluding any entity identified to

- 1 receive a direct appropriation beginning July 1, 2010, may
- 2 apply to the department for assistance through the appropriate
- 3 program.
- 4 The bill provides that, in providing moneys from the shelter
- 5 assistance fund to homeless shelter programs, the department of
- 6 economic development shall explore the potential of allocating
- 7 moneys to programs based in part on their ability to move their
- 8 clients toward self-sufficiency.
- 9 The bill appropriates moneys from moneys credited to
- 10 the state by the secretary of the treasury of the United
- 11 States pursuant to the Social Security Act to the department
- 12 of workforce development for the administration of the
- 13 unemployment compensation program only.
