.....\$ 12,000,000 **EXPLANATION** 3 GENERAL. This bill relates to agriculture and natural 4 resources by making appropriations for the 2010-2011 fiscal 5 year to support related entities, including the department of 6 agriculture and land stewardship and the department of natural 7 resources. The bill appropriates moneys to the department of 9 agriculture and land stewardship and the department of natural 10 resources. The appropriations are made to support those 11 departments for administration, regulation, and programs. 12 bill requires the departments to submit quarterly reports to 13 the general assembly and department of management regarding the 14 expenditure of appropriated moneys. The bill also provides 15 moneys to support specific programs or projects administered by 16 those departments. The bill appropriates moneys from a number 17 of sources, including the general fund of the state, the state 18 fish and game protection fund, and the groundwater protection The bill is organized into divisions. 20 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP. 21 department of agriculture and land stewardship, moneys are 22 appropriated in order to support its divisions. 23 The bill appropriates moneys from the general fund to 24 support designated programs, including horse and dog racing, 25 and motor fuel inspection. 26 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES. For the department of 27 natural resources, moneys are appropriated from the general 28 fund in order to support its divisions. 29 The bill makes appropriations from other funds. The bill 30 appropriates moneys to the department of natural resources from 31 the state fish and game protection fund to support programs 32 related to fish and wildlife. The bill appropriates moneys 33 from the groundwater protection fund to support groundwater 34 quality. The bill appropriates moneys from the snowmobile fund 35 to the department for snowmobile programs.

- 1 The bill includes miscellaneous provisions. An
- 2 appropriation is made from the unassigned revenue fund
- 3 administered by the Iowa comprehensive underground storage
- 4 tank fund board to the department of natural resources for
- 5 administration and expenses of the underground storage tank
- 6 section.
- 7 The bill provides that the department of natural
- 8 resources may use additional funds for staffing to reduce the
- 9 department's floodplain permit backlog and implementing the
- 10 federal maximum daily load program.
- 11 ENVIRONMENT FIRST FUND GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS. The
- 12 bill appropriates funding from the environment first fund to
- 13 the department of agriculture and land stewardship and the
- 14 department of natural resources to support a number of programs
- 15 and projects. The bill appropriates moneys for state park
- 16 maintenance and operations, including moneys allocated to the
- 17 Honey creek premier destination park authority to support
- 18 its bonding program. Nonreversion clauses authorize the
- 19 appropriations made in this division to be carried forward into
- 20 the succeeding fiscal year and allows the appropriation for
- 21 permanent soil and water conservation practices to be available
- 22 through fiscal year 2013-2014.
- 23 ENVIRONMENT FIRST FUND RESOURCE ENHANCEMENT AND
- 24 PROTECTION. The bill appropriates moneys from the environment
- 25 first fund to the resources enhancement and protection fund
- 26 in lieu of the \$20 million appropriated by statute from the
- 27 general fund of the state.
