## House Concurrent Resolution 13 - Introduced

## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 13 BY COMMITTEE ON COMMERCE (SUCCESSOR TO HCR 9)

- 1 A Concurrent Resolution urging the United States
- 2 Congress to modernize the Toxic Substances Control
- 3 Act of 1976.
- 4 WHEREAS, consumers in the United States deserve to
- 5 have confidence that the products they buy, when used
- 6 for their intended purposes, are safe; and
- 7 WHEREAS, a federal chemical management program
- 8 should place protecting the public health, including
- 9 children's health, as its highest priority and should
- 10 include strict government oversight; and
- 11 WHEREAS, a federal chemical management program
- 12 should preserve the role of the United States as
- 13 the world's leading innovator and employer in the
- 14 manufacture, processing, distribution, and use of
- 15 chemicals; and
- 16 WHEREAS, the current federal chemical management
- 17 law, the Toxic Substances Control Act of 1976 (TSCA) is
- 18 now nearly 35 years old; and
- 19 WHEREAS, since the enactment of the federal law,
- 20 our ability to understand the impact chemicals have
- 21 on the human body and the environment has advanced
- 22 significantly; and
- 23 WHEREAS, those advancements in science and
- 24 technology need to be integrated into the federal
- 25 chemical management program; and
- 26 WHEREAS, momentum for modernization of the federal
- 27 chemical regulatory system is growing in the Congress

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- 1 of the United States; and
- 2 WHEREAS, a robust federal chemical management system
- 3 will obviate the need for state government to adopt
- 4 different, and at times conflicting, state regulatory
- 5 programs that have the potential for negative impacts
- 6 on the national economy; NOW THEREFORE,
- 7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES,
- 8 THE SENATE CONCURRING, That the Iowa General Assembly
- 9 encourages the 112th Congress of the United States to
- 10 enact federal legislation to modernize the TSCA to
- 11 strengthen chemical management policy; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the policy reforms
- 13 should ensure that chemicals are safe for their
- 14 intended use; and
- 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the policy reforms
- 16 should require the United States Environmental
- 17 Protection Agency (EPA) to systematically prioritize
- 18 chemicals for the purpose of assessing their safe
- 19 use; and
- 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the policy reforms
- 21 should require the EPA to act expeditiously and
- 22 efficiently in assessing the safe use of chemicals; and
- 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the policy reforms
- 24 should require companies that manufacture, import,
- 25 process, distribute, or use chemicals to provide
- 26 the EPA with the relevant information to the
- 27 extent necessary for the EPA to make safe use
- 28 determinations; and
- 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the policy reforms
- 30 should assure that the potential risks to children from

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- 1 exposures to chemicals are considered in the assessment
- 2 of safe use; and
- 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the policy reforms
- 4 should empower the EPA to impose a range of risk
- 5 management controls to ensure that chemicals are safe
- 6 for their intended use; and
- 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the policy reforms
- 8 should encourage companies and the EPA to work together
- 9 to enhance public access to chemical health and safety
- 10 information; and
- 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the policy reforms
- 12 should require that the EPA rely on scientifically
- 13 valid data and information, regardless of its source,
- 14 including data and information reflecting modern
- 15 advances in science and technology; and
- 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the policy reforms
- 17 should enable the EPA to have the staff, resources,
- 18 and regulatory tools it needs to ensure the safety of
- 19 chemicals; and
- 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the policy reforms
- 21 should ensure that the TSCA remains a vehicle to
- 22 promote and encourage technological innovation and the
- 23 maintenance of a globally competitive industry in the
- 24 United States; and
- 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Chief Clerk of the
- 26 House and the Secretary of the Senate shall forward
- 27 copies of this resolution to all members of Iowa's
- 28 Congressional delegation.
