## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act providing for a worker shortage loan forgiveness
- 2 program.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **261.115 Worker shortage loan**
- 2 forgiveness program.
- 3 1. A worker shortage loan forgiveness program is
- 4 established to be administered by the commission. An
- 5 individual is eligible for the program if the individual
- 6 graduated from a school district or accredited nonpublic school
- 7 in this state on or after January 1, 2010, is a resident of
- 8 the state, and successfully completed a vocational-technical
- 9 or career option program or graduated with an associate degree
- 10 from a community college established pursuant to chapter 260C
- 11 or graduated with a baccalaureate degree or postbaccalaureate
- 12 degree from an institution of higher education governed by
- 13 the state board of regents or from an accredited private
- 14 institution, and the individual meets either of the following
- 15 conditions:
- 16 a. Is employed and residing in this state and has been
- 17 employed and residing in this state for not less than two
- 18 consecutive years within three years of successfully completing
- 19 a vocational-technical or career option program or achieving an
- 20 associate degree from a community college.
- 21 b. Is employed and residing in this state and has been
- 22 employed and residing in this state for not less than four
- 23 consecutive years within five years of graduating with a
- 24 baccalaureate degree or postbaccalaureate degree from an
- 25 institution of higher education governed by the state board of
- 26 regents or from an accredited private institution.
- 27 2. Each applicant for loan forgiveness shall, in accordance
- 28 with the rules of the commission, do the following:
- 29 a. Complete and file an application for worker shortage
- 30 loan forgiveness. The individual shall be responsible for
- 31 the prompt submission of any information required by the
- 32 commission.
- 33 b. File a new application and submit information as
- 34 required by the commission annually on the basis of which the
- 35 applicant's eligibility for the renewed loan forgiveness will

1 be evaluated and determined.

- 2 c. Complete and return on a form approved by the commission
- 3 an affidavit of eligibility verifying that the applicant met
- 4 the requirements of subsection 1.
- 5 3. The annual amount of worker shortage loan forgiveness
- 6 shall not exceed the following:
- 7 a. For an individual who meets the conditions of
- 8 subsection 1, paragraph "a", the combined resident tuition
- 9 rate established for the two years following the individual's
- 10 successful program completion or graduation from the community
- 11 college, or one hundred percent of the individual's total
- 12 federally quaranteed Stafford loan amount under the federal
- 13 family education loan program or the federal direct loan
- 14 program and any private student loan issued by a lender
- 15 that meets standards prescribed by the commission including
- 16 principal and interest, whichever amount is less.
- 17 b. For an individual who meets the conditions of
- 18 subsection 1, paragraph "b", the combined resident tuition
- 19 rate established for institutions of higher learning governed
- 20 by the state board of regents for the four years following
- 21 the individual's graduation from the regents university or
- 22 accredited private institution, or one hundred percent of the
- 23 individual's total federally guaranteed Stafford loan amount
- 24 under the federal family education loan program or the federal
- 25 direct loan program and any private student loan issued by
- 26 a lender that meets standards prescribed by the commission
- 27 including principal and interest, whichever amount is less.
- 28 4. The commission shall submit in a report to the general
- 29 assembly by January 1, annually, the number of individuals
- 30 who received loan forgiveness pursuant to this section, the
- 31 postsecondary institutions from which the individuals graduated
- 32 or successfully completed a vocational-technical or career
- 33 options program, where in the state program participants are
- 34 employed, program participants' employment classifications
- 35 or types of employment, the amount paid to each program

- 1 participant, and other information identified by the commission
- 2 as indicators of outcomes from the program.
- 3 5. The commission shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A
- 4 to administer this section.
- 5 EXPLANATION
- 6 This bill creates a worker shortage loan forgiveness program
- 7 to be administered by the college student aid commission. The
- 8 program is open to individuals who graduated from an Iowa
- 9 high school in 2010 or later, are employed and reside in the
- 10 state, and successfully completed a vocational-technical or
- 11 career option program or received a degree from an accredited
- 12 postsecondary institution in the state.
- 13 The individual must also have been employed and resided
- 14 in this state for a period of two consecutive years within
- 15 three years of successfully completing a vocational-technical
- 16 or career option program or achieving an associate degree
- 17 from a community college, or must have been employed and
- 18 resided in this state for a period of four consecutive years
- 19 within five years of graduating with a baccalaureate degree
- 20 or postbaccalaureate degree from a regents university or
- 21 accredited private institution.
- 22 In the case of an individual who attended a community
- 23 college, the total amount of worker shortage loan forgiveness
- 24 shall not exceed the combined resident tuition rate established
- 25 for the two years following the individual's successful program
- 26 completion or graduation from the community college, or 100
- 27 percent of the individual's total federal loan program and
- 28 private student loan amount including principal and interest,
- 29 whichever amount is less.
- 30 In the case of an individual who attended a regents
- 31 university or accredited private institution, the annual
- 32 amount of worker shortage loan forgiveness shall not exceed
- 33 the combined resident tuition rate established for regents
- 34 universities for the four years following the individual's
- 35 graduation, or 100 percent of the individual's total federal

- 1 loan program and private student loan amount including
- 2 principal and interest, whichever amount is less. The
- 3 individual is eligible for the loan forgiveness program for not
- 4 more than four consecutive years.
- 5 The bill requires the commission to submit a report to the
- 6 general assembly by January 1, annually, with information
- 7 identified as indicators of outcomes from the program.
