A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act increasing the number of members serving on the
- 2 utilities board within the utilities division of the
- 3 department of commerce and changing the membership from an
- 4 appointed to an elected board.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 39.21, Code 2011, is amended by adding
- 2 the following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 5. Members of the utilities board within
- 4 the utilities division of the department of commerce as
- 5 provided in section 474.1.
- 6 Sec. 2. Section 474.1, subsections 1 and 2, Code 2011,
- 7 are amended by striking the subsections and inserting in lieu
- 8 thereof the following:
- 9 1. a. A utilities division is created within the department
- 10 of commerce. The policymaking body for the division is the
- ll utilities board which is created within the division.
- 12 b. The board is composed of five members, one to be elected
- 13 by the registered voters of each congressional district and one
- 14 to be elected from the state at large. Board members shall
- 15 be elected on a nonpartisan basis at the general election
- 16 for staggered four-year terms commencing on the first day
- 17 of January that is not a Sunday or holiday following their
- 18 election. Any eligible elector is entitled to membership on
- 19 the board, and, except for the member elected at large, no more
- 20 than one member shall at any one time be a resident of any
- 21 one congressional district. A vacancy shall be filled by the
- 22 chairperson of the board for the unexpired balance of the term
- 23 until the next succeeding general election.
- 24 c. At each general election a successor shall be chosen
- 25 for each commissioner whose term will expire in the succeeding
- 26 January. Nomination of candidates shall be made by petition
- 27 in accordance with chapter 45, except that each candidate's
- 28 nominating petition shall be signed by at least three hundred
- 29 eligible electors residing in the congressional district or,
- 30 for an at-large candidate, by seventy-five eligible electors
- 31 residing in each congressional district in the state. The
- 32 petition form shall be furnished by the county commissioner
- 33 of elections. Every candidate shall file with the nomination
- 34 papers an affidavit stating the candidate's name, the
- 35 candidate's residence, that the person is a candidate and

- 1 is eligible for board membership, and that if elected the
- 2 candidate will qualify for the office. The affidavit shall
- 3 also state that the candidate is aware that the candidate
- 4 is disqualified from holding office if the candidate has
- 5 been convicted of a felony or other infamous crime and the
- 6 candidate's rights have not been restored by the governor or by
- 7 the president of the United States.
- 8 d. The signed petitions shall be filed with the county
- 9 commissioner of elections not later than 5 p.m. on the
- 10 sixty-ninth day before the general election. The votes for
- 11 board membership shall be canvassed in the same manner as the
- 12 votes for state officers, and the returns shall be certified to
- 13 the state commissioner of elections. A plurality is sufficient
- 14 to elect members, and a primary election for the office shall
- 15 not be held.
- 16 e. As used in this subsection, "congressional district"
- 17 means those districts established following the 2010 federal
- 18 decennial census.
- 19 2. The utilities board shall organize by appointing an
- 20 executive secretary, who shall take the same oath as the
- 21 members. The board shall set the salary of the executive
- 22 secretary within the limits of the pay plan for exempt
- 23 positions provided for in section 8A.413, subsection 3, unless
- 24 otherwise provided by the general assembly. The board may
- 25 employ additional personnel as it finds necessary. Board
- 26 members shall elect a member to serve as the chairperson of
- 27 the board. The chairperson shall be the administrator of the
- 28 utilities division. A member shall serve as chairperson for a
- 29 two-year term.
- 30 Sec. 3. TRANSITION PROVISIONS. Membership terms of
- 31 utilities board members serving on the board on the effective
- 32 date of this Act and otherwise expiring prior to the general
- 33 election to be conducted in 2012 shall be extended until the
- 34 first day of January that is not a Sunday or holiday following
- 35 the election. Membership terms of utilities board members

- 1 appointed to the board after the effective date of this Act
- 2 shall expire in 2013 on the first day of January that is not a
- 3 Sunday or holiday.
- 4 EXPLANATION
- 5 This bill changes the composition of the utilities board
- 6 within the utilities division of the department of commerce
- 7 from the current membership of three appointed members to a
- 8 membership of five elected members.
- 9 The bill provides that four members shall be elected by the
- 10 registered voters of each congressional district, as those
- 11 districts were established following the 2010 federal census,
- 12 and one member shall be elected from the state at large. The
- 13 members are elected on a nonpartisan basis for staggered
- 14 four-year terms. The election shall be held biennially at the
- 15 same time as the general election, and any eligible elector is
- 16 entitled to membership on the board.
- 17 The bill specifies nomination of candidates for the board
- 18 shall be made by petition pursuant to Code chapter 45, with
- 19 the exception that each candidate's nominating petition shall
- 20 be signed by at least 300 eligible electors residing in the
- 21 district or, if an at-large candidate, by 75 eligible electors
- 22 residing in each congressional district in the state. The
- 23 bill states that the votes for board membership shall be
- 24 canvassed in the same manner as the votes for state officers,
- 25 that returns shall be certified to the state commissioner of
- 26 elections, that a plurality is sufficient to elect members, and
- 27 that a primary election for the office shall not be held.
- 28 The bill provides that a chairperson of the board shall be
- 29 elected from among the board membership for a two-year term.
- 30 Currently, a chairperson is appointed by the governor.
- 31 The bill provides transition provisions for the general
- 32 election in 2012. The terms of utilities board members
- 33 serving on the board on the bill's effective date and otherwise
- 34 expiring prior to the general election in 2012 shall be
- 35 extended until the first day of January that is not a Sunday or

- 1 holiday following the election. The terms of members appointed
- 2 after the effective date shall expire in 2013 on the first day
- 3 of January that is not a Sunday or a holiday.
