## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to early school start date provisions and
2 including effective and applicability dates.
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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Section 1. Section 257.17, Code 2011, is amended to read as follows:
257.17 Aid reduction for early school starts.

State aid payments made pursuant to section 257.16 for a fiscal year shall be reduced by one one-hundred-eightieth for each day of that fiscal year for which the school district begins school before the earliest starting date specified in section 279.10, subsection 1 . However, this section does not apply to a school district that has received approval from the director of the department of education under section 279.10, subsection $4^{4}$ for a pilot program for an innovative school year in accordance with section 279.10 , subsection 3 , or to commence classes for regularly established elementary and secondary schools in advance of the starting date egtablished in due to an emergency in accordance with section 279.10 , subsection $\ddagger \underline{4}$.

Sec. 2. Section 279.10, subsections 1,2 , and 4, Code 2011, are amended to read as follows:
l. The school year shall begin on the first day of July and each regularly established elementary and secondary school shall begin no sooner than a day during the calendar week in which the firgt day of september falls the fourth Monday in August but no later than the first Monday in DecemberHowever, if the firgt day of September falls on a Sunday, school may begin on a day during the calendax week which immediately precedes the firgt day of September unless the school district has received approval from the department of education for a pilot program for an innovative school year in accordance with subsection 3 or for an early start date due to an emergency in accordance with subsection 4. School shall continue for at least one hundred eighty days, except as provided in subsection 3 , and may be maintained during the entire calendar year. However, if the board of directors of a district extends the school calendar because inclement weather caused the district to temporarily close school during the regular school calendar, the district may excuse a graduating

senior who has met district or school requirements for graduation from attendance during the extended school calendar. A school corporation may begin employment of personnel for in-service training and development purposes before the date to begin elementary and secondary school. The earliest starting date specified in this subsection shall not apply to a school district which maintains a year around three semester school year.
4. The director of the department of education may grant a request made by a board of directors of a school district stating its desixe that an emergency exists which requires the school district to commence classes for regularly established elementary and secondary schools prior to the earliest starting date specified in subsection 1. A The request shall be based upon the determination set forth the reasons that a starting date on or aftex prior to the earliest starting date specified in subsection 1 wold have a gignificant negative educational impact is necessary and shall describe any actions the school district intends to take to ensure that student achievement is not adversely affected.

Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect July l, 2012.
Sec. 4. APPLICABILITY. This Act is applicable for school years beginning on or after July $1,2012$.

## EXPLANATION

This bill changes the earliest school start date to the fourth Monday in August and modifies the authority of the department of education to grant a request made by a board of directors of a school district to commence classes prior to the earliest starting date allowed, which currently is no sooner than a day during the calendar week in which the first day of September falls or, if the first day of September falls on a Sunday, a day during the prior week. The bill exempts from

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1 the earliest starting date requirement school districts that 2 maintain a year around three semester school year.
3 The bill provides that the department may grant a request 4 made by a school board stating that an emergency exists which 5 requires the school district to commence classes for regularly 6 established elementary and secondary schools prior to the 7 fourth Monday in August. The request must set forth the 8 reasons the early start date is necessary and must describe 9 actions the school district intends to take to ensure that 10 student achievement is not adversely affected.
11 The bill makes conforming changes to modify a provision
12 that provides for a reduction in school foundation aid when
13 school districts implement early school starts. The bill also
14 includes a technical correction.
15 The bill takes effect July l, 2012, for school years 16 beginning on or after July $1,2012$.
