## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act subjecting the sale of appliances or other products
- 2 labeled as energy star certified but meeting outdated
- 3 certification specifications to consumer fraud provisions
- 4 and providing a penalty.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 714.16, subsection 2, Code 2011, is
- 2 amended by adding the following new paragraph:
- 3 NEW PARAGRAPH. o. It is an unlawful practice for
- 4 a person to sell or advertise for sale an appliance or
- 5 product identified or labeled as having achieved energy
- 6 star certification unless the appliance or product meets
- 7 the most recently revised specifications established for
- 8 the designation of such certification. For the purposes of
- 9 this paragraph, "energy star certification" means meeting
- 10 energy efficiency standards and guidelines pursuant to the
- 11 energy star program developed and jointly administered by the
- 12 United States environmental protection agency and the United
- 13 States department of energy. Appliances or products meeting
- 14 previously applicable or outdated certification specifications
- 15 shall have energy star identification or labeling removed prior
- 16 to sale.
- 17 EXPLANATION
- 18 This bill provides that it is an unlawful practice under
- 19 consumer fraud provisions contained in Code section 714.16
- 20 for a person to sell or advertise for sale an appliance or
- 21 product identified or labeled as having achieved energy star
- 22 certification unless the appliance or product meets the most
- 23 recently revised specifications established for the designation
- 24 of such certification. The bill defines "energy star
- 25 certification". The bill provides that appliances or products
- 26 meeting previously applicable or outdated certification
- 27 specifications shall have energy star identification or
- 28 labeling removed prior to sale, as that term is defined in Code
- 29 section 714.16.
- 30 A violation of consumer fraud provisions under Code section
- 31 714.16, subsection 2, is punishable by a civil penalty of up to
- 32 \$40,000 per violation and a civil penalty of up to \$5,000 for
- 33 each day of intentional violation of a temporary restraining
- 34 order, preliminary injunction, or permanent injunction.
