A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the operation of all-terrain vehicles
- 2 and minitrucks on highways, providing for registration
- 3 of certain all-terrain vehicles and minitrucks by the
- 4 department of transportation, providing fees, and making
- 5 penalties applicable.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 321.1, subsections 4 and 32, Code
- 2 Supplement 2011, are amended to read as follows:
- 3 4. "All-terrain vehicle" means a motor vehicle designed
- 4 to travel on three or more wheels and designed primarily for
- 5 off-road recreational use. "All-terrain vehicle" includes
- 6 off-road utility vehicles as defined in section 3211.1, but
- 7 does not include farm tractors or equipment, construction
- 8 equipment, forestry vehicles, or lawn and grounds maintenance
- 9 vehicles.
- 10 32. "Implement of husbandry" means a vehicle or special
- 11 mobile equipment manufactured, designed, or reconstructed
- 12 for agricultural purposes and, except for incidental uses,
- 13 exclusively used in the conduct of agricultural operations.
- 14 "Implements of husbandry" includes all-terrain vehicles operated
- 15 in compliance with section 321.234A, subsection 1, paragraph
- 16 "a", but not registered for operation upon a highway pursuant
- 17 to section 321.118; fence-line feeders,; and vehicles used
- 18 exclusively for the application of organic or inorganic plant
- 19 food materials, organic agricultural limestone, or agricultural
- 20 chemicals. To be considered an implement of husbandry, a
- 21 self-propelled implement of husbandry must be operated at
- 22 speeds of thirty-five miles per hour or less.
- 23 a. "Reconstructed", as used in this subsection, means
- 24 materially altered from the original construction by the
- 25 removal, addition, or substitution of essential parts, new or
- 26 used.
- 27 b. A vehicle covered under this subsection, if it otherwise
- 28 qualifies, may be operated as special mobile equipment
- 29 and under such circumstances this subsection shall not be
- 30 applicable to such vehicle, and such vehicle shall not be
- 31 required to comply with sections 321.384 through 321.423, when
- 32 such vehicle is moved during daylight hours; however, the
- 33 provisions of section 321.383 shall remain applicable to such
- 34 vehicle.
- 35 Sec. 2. Section 321.1, Code Supplement 2011, is amended by

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- 1 adding the following new subsections:
- 2 NEW SUBSECTION. 39. "Minitruck" means a motorized
- 3 four-wheeled vehicle that is propelled by an internal
- 4 combustion engine with a piston displacement capacity of one
- 5 thousand five hundred sixty cubic centimeters or less or an
- 6 electric motor with a rated power no greater than a ninety-two
- 7 volt system or a five hundred fifty ampere system; has a total
- 8 dry weight of not less than nine hundred and not more than
- 9 three thousand two hundred pounds; contains an enclosed cabin
- 10 and a seat for the vehicle operator; commonly resembles a
- 11 pickup truck or van, including a cargo area or bed located at
- 12 the rear of the vehicle; and was not originally manufactured
- 13 to meet federal motor vehicle safety standards required of
- 14 motor vehicles in 49 C.F.R. § 571.101 571.404, and successor
- 15 requirements.
- 16 NEW SUBSECTION. 47A. "Off-road utility vehicle" means as
- 17 defined in section 321I.1, subsection 16, paragraph "a".
- 18 Sec. 3. Section 321.20, subsection 1, paragraph e, Code
- 19 2011, is amended to read as follows:
- 20 e. The amount of the fee for new registration to be paid
- 21 under section 321.105A, the amount of tax to be paid under
- 22 section 423.26, subsection 1, or the amount of tax to be paid
- 23 under section 423.26A, or the amount of sales tax paid under
- 24 section 423.2.
- 25 Sec. 4. Section 321.105A, subsection 2, paragraph c,
- 26 Code Supplement 2011, is amended by adding the following new
- 27 subparagraph:
- 28 NEW SUBPARAGRAPH. (31) All-terrain vehicles and
- 29 minitrucks, if the owner has paid the sales tax required under
- 30 section 423.2 at the time the vehicle was purchased.
- 31 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. 321.118 All-terrain vehicle and
- 32 minitruck fees.
- 33 1. The following vehicles may be titled and registered for
- 34 operation on noninterstate highways for an annual fee of forty
- 35 dollars:

- 1 a. An all-terrain vehicle equipped with headlights,
- 2 taillights, turn signals, and a rearview mirror.
- 3 b. A minitruck equipped with headlights, taillights, turn
- 4 signals, a rearview mirror, safety belts, and windshield
- 5 wipers.
- 6 2. For purposes of this section, "all-terrain vehicle"
- 7 means an all-terrain vehicle with four or more wheels and a
- 8 combustion engine having a piston or rotor displacement of two
- 9 hundred centimeters or more.
- 10 Sec. 6. Section 321.166, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code
- 11 2011, is amended to read as follows:
- 12 a. Registration plates shall be of metal and of a size not
- 13 to exceed six inches by twelve inches, except that the size
- 14 of plates issued for use on all-terrain vehicles, minitrucks,
- 15 motorized bicycles, motorcycles, motorcycle trailers, and
- 16 trailers with an empty weight of two thousand pounds or less
- 17 shall be established by the department.
- 18 Sec. 7. Section 321.166, subsection 4, Code 2011, is amended
- 19 to read as follows:
- 20 4. The registration plate number, except on all-terrain
- 21 vehicles, minitrucks, motorized bicycles, motorcycles,
- 22 motorcycle trailers, and trailers with an empty weight of two
- 23 thousand pounds or less, shall be of sufficient size to be
- 24 readable from a distance of one hundred feet during daylight.
- Sec. 8. Section 321.234A, Code 2011, is amended to read as
- 26 follows:
- 27 321.234A All-terrain vehicles and minitrucks highway use.
- 28 1. All-terrain vehicles and minitrucks shall not be
- 29 operated on a highway unless one or more of the following
- 30 conditions apply:
- 31 a. The operation is between sunrise and sunset and is
- 32 incidental to the vehicle's use for agricultural purposes. For
- 33 purposes of this paragraph, "incidental to the vehicle's use
- 34 for agricultural purposes" includes stopping in the course of
- 35 agricultural use to obtain fuel for the all-terrain vehicle or

- 1 minitruck or to obtain food or a nonalcoholic beverage for the
 2 operator.
- 3 b. The operation is incidental to the vehicle's use for the 4 purpose of surveying by a licensed engineer or land surveyor.
- c. The all-terrain vehicle is operated by an employee or
- 6 agent of a political subdivision or public utility for the
- $\ensuremath{\mathsf{7}}$ purpose of construction or maintenance on or adjacent to the
- 8 highway.
- 9 d. The all-terrain vehicle is operated by an employee or
- 10 agent of a public agency as defined in section 34.1 for the
- 11 purpose of providing emergency services or rescue.
- 12 e. The all-terrain vehicle is operated for the purpose
- 13 of mowing, installing approved trail signs, or providing
- 14 maintenance on a snowmobile or all-terrain vehicle trail
- 15 designated by the department of natural resources.
- 16 f. The all-terrain vehicle is operated on a county roadway
- 17 in accordance with section 3211.10, subsection 2, or a city
- 18 street in accordance with section 3211.10, subsection 3.
- 19 g. The vehicle is registered in accordance with section
- 20 321.118.
- 2. A person operating an all-terrain vehicle or minitruck on
- 22 a highway shall have a valid driver's license and the vehicle
- 23 shall be operated at speeds of thirty-five miles per hour or
- 24 less.
- 25 3. An all-terrain vehicle that is owned by the owner of
- 26 land adjacent to a highway, other than an interstate road, may
- 27 be operated by the owner of the all-terrain vehicle, or by a
- 28 member of the owner's family, on the portion of the highway
- 29 right-of-way that is between the shoulder of the roadway, or at
- 30 least five feet from the edge of the roadway, and the owner's
- 31 property line. A person operating an all-terrain vehicle
- 32 within the highway right-of-way under this subsection shall
- 33 comply with the registration, safety, and age requirements
- 34 under chapter 321I.
- 35 4. A person convicted of a violation of this section is

- 1 guilty of a simple misdemeanor punishable as a scheduled
- 2 violation under section 805.8A, subsection 3.
- 3 Sec. 9. Section 321.445, subsection 1, Code 2011, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 l. Except for motorcycles, or motorized bicycles, and
- 6 all-terrain vehicles, 1966 model year or newer motor vehicles
- 7 subject to registration in Iowa shall be equipped with safety
- 8 belts and safety harnesses which conform with federal motor
- 9 vehicle safety standard numbers 209 and 210 as published in
- 10 49 C.F.R. § 571.209 571.210 and with prior federal motor
- 11 vehicle safety standards for seat belt assemblies and seat belt
- 12 assembly anchorages applicable for the motor vehicle's model
- 13 year.
- 14 Sec. 10. Section 321.445, subsection 2, paragraph a, Code
- 15 2011, is amended to read as follows:
- 16 a. The driver and front seat occupants of a type of motor
- 17 vehicle that is subject to registration in Iowa, except a
- 18 motorcycle, or a motorized bicycle, or all-terrain vehicle,
- 19 shall each wear a properly adjusted and fastened safety belt
- 20 or safety harness any time the vehicle is in forward motion on
- 21 a street or highway in this state except that a child under
- 22 eighteen years of age shall be secured as required under
- 23 section 321.446.
- 24 Sec. 11. Section 321.446, subsections 1 and 2, Code 2011,
- 25 are amended to read as follows:
- 26 l. a. A child under one year of age and weighing less
- 27 than twenty pounds who is being transported in a motor vehicle
- 28 subject to registration, except a school bus, or motorcycle,
- 29 or all-terrain vehicle, shall be secured during transit in a
- 30 rear-facing child restraint system that is used in accordance
- 31 with the manufacturer's instructions.
- 32 b. A child under six years of age who does not meet the
- 33 description in paragraph "a" and who is being transported in
- 34 a motor vehicle subject to registration, except a school bus,
- 35 or motorcycle, or all-terrain vehicle, shall be secured during

- 1 transit by a child restraint system that is used in accordance 2 with the manufacturer's instructions.
- A child at least six years of age but under eighteen
- 4 years of age who is being transported in a motor vehicle
- 5 subject to registration, except a school bus, or motorcycle,
- 6 or all-terrain vehicle, shall be secured during transit by a
- 7 child restraint system that is used in accordance with the
- 8 manufacturer's instructions or by a safety belt or safety
- 9 harness of a type approved under section 321.445.
- 10 Sec. 12. Section 321I.1, subsection 16, paragraph b, Code
- 11 2011, is amended to read as follows:
- 12 b. An owner of an off-road utility vehicle may register
- 13 or title an off-road utility vehicle in order to legally
- 14 operate the off-road vehicle on public ice, a designated
- 15 riding area, or a designated riding trail. The operator of an
- 16 off-road utility vehicle is subject to provisions governing
- 17 the operation of all-terrain vehicles in section 321.234A and
- 18 this chapter, but is exempt from the safety instruction and
- 19 certification program requirements of sections 321I.25 and
- 20 3211.26. An operator of an off-road utility vehicle shall not
- 21 operate the vehicle on a designated riding area or designated
- 22 riding trail unless the department has posted signage
- 23 indicating the riding area or trail is open to the operation
- 24 of off-road utility vehicles. Off-road utility vehicles are
- 25 exempt from the dealer registration and titling requirements
- 26 of this chapter. A motorized vehicle that was previously
- 27 titled or is currently titled under chapter 321, except section
- 28 321.118, shall not be registered or operated as an off-road
- 29 utility vehicle under this chapter.
- 30 Sec. 13. Section 321I.9, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2011,
- 31 is amended to read as follows:
- 32 Registration under this chapter shall not be required for
- 33 the following described all-terrain vehicles:
- 34 Sec. 14. Section 321I.31, subsection 1, Code 2011, is
- 35 amended to read as follows:

- 1 1. The owner of an all-terrain vehicle acquired on or 2 after January 1, 2000, other than an all-terrain vehicle used 3 exclusively as a farm implement, or a motorcycle previously 4 issued a title pursuant to chapter 321, or an all-terrain 5 vehicle titled and registered in accordance with section 6 321.118, shall apply to the county recorder of the county in 7 which the owner resides for a certificate of title for the 8 all-terrain vehicle. The owner of an all-terrain vehicle 9 used exclusively as a farm implement may obtain a certificate 10 of title. A person who owns an all-terrain vehicle that is 11 not required to have a certificate of title may apply for and 12 receive a certificate of title for the all-terrain vehicle 13 and, subsequently, the all-terrain vehicle shall be subject to 14 the requirements of this chapter as if the all-terrain vehicle 15 were required to be titled. All all-terrain vehicles that 16 are titled under this chapter shall be registered under this 17 chapter.
- 18 **EXPLANATION**

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- This bill provides for the registration and operation of 19 20 certain all-terrain vehicles and minitrucks on noninterstate 21 highways.
- The bill provides a definition of "minitruck" and allows 23 unregistered minitrucks to be operated on a highway by a 24 licensed driver, without registration, for the same purposes as 25 all-terrain vehicles: agricultural purposes; land surveying; 26 construction or maintenance by a political subdivision or a 27 public utility; emergency services or rescue performed by 28 a public agency; or mowing, installing signs, or providing
- 29 maintenance on a snowmobile or all-terrain vehicle trail
- 30 designated by the department of natural resources. A person
- 31 who operates a minitruck in violation of these restrictions
- 32 is subject to the current penalty applicable to all-terrain
- 33 vehicle operation. A violation is a simple misdemeanor,
- 34 punishable by a scheduled fine of \$50.
- The bill provides that all-terrain vehicles with four 35

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1 or more wheels and a combustion engine having a piston or
 2 rotor displacement of 200 centimeters or more and minitrucks
 3 may be registered with the department of transportation for
 4 operation on noninterstate highways. The provision includes
 5 off-road utility vehicles, which for purposes of motor vehicle
 6 regulation, are included in the definition of "all-terrain
 7 vehicle". To qualify for registration, the vehicle must
 8 be equipped with headlights, taillights, turn signals, and
 9 a rearview mirror. A minitruck must also be equipped with
10 windshield wipers and safety belts. The annual registration
11 fee for an all-terrain vehicle or minitruck is $40.
12 all-terrain vehicles and minitrucks are currently subject to
13 sales tax, the bill provides that the vehicles are exempt
14 from the fee for new registration imposed on vehicles subject
15 to registration, so long as the owner has paid the sales
16 tax at the time of purchase. The current 35 mile per hour
17 speed restriction for all-terrain vehicles is eliminated for
18 all-terrain vehicles other than implements of husbandry.
19 person who operates on a highway a vehicle which is required
20 to be registered but is not registered commits a simple
21 misdemeanor, punishable by a scheduled fine of $50.
22
      Under current law, all-terrain vehicles operated on public
23 land or ice or on designated riding areas or designated riding
24 trails are required to be registered with the department
25 of natural resources. All-terrain vehicles acquired after
26 January 1, 2000, other than those used exclusively as farm
27 implements, must also be titled by the department.
28 provides an exception to that titling requirement for an
29 all-terrain vehicle titled and registered with the department
30 of transportation. However, under the bill, an all-terrain
31 vehicle which is titled and registered for highway operation
32 must still be registered separately with the department of
33 natural resources for operation on public lands or ice or on
34 designated riding areas and designated riding trails.
      The bill provides an exemption from seat belt and child
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- 1 safety seat requirements for drivers of and passengers on
- 2 all-terrain vehicles registered for operation on a highway.
- 3 Pursuant to current law relating to proof of financial
- 4 responsibility, a person operating an all-terrain vehicle or
- 5 minitruck on a highway would be required to maintain proof of
- 6 financial liability coverage in the vehicle.
